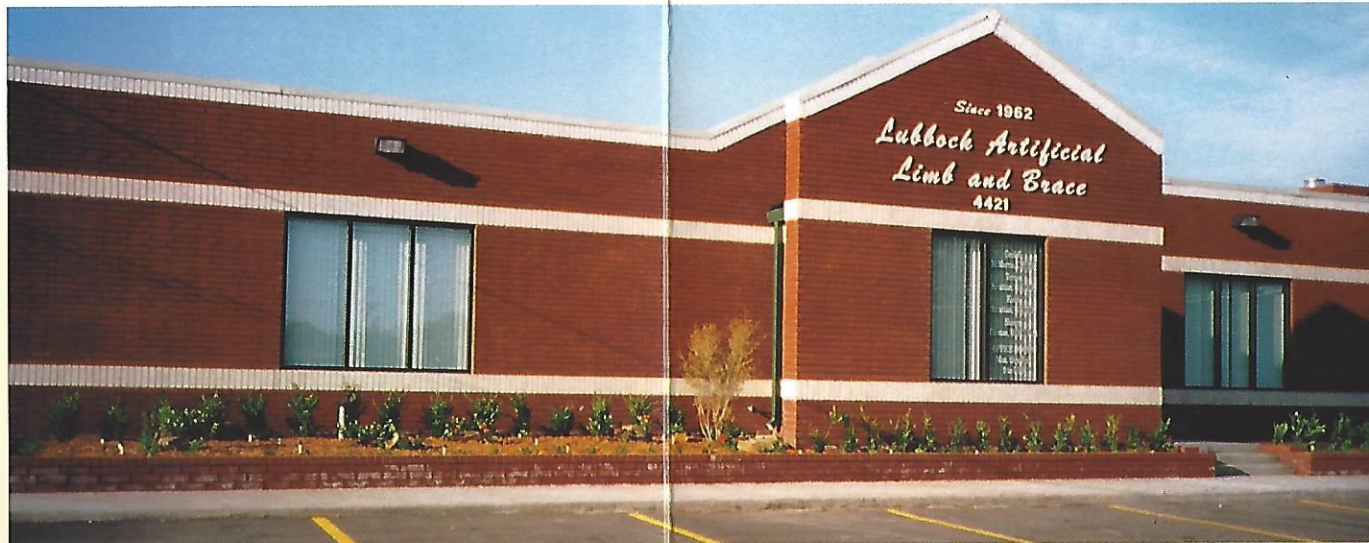


HISTORY
