In the parable that we just heard in the gospel, the Pharisee who spoke of himself as being better than the rest of humanity was telling the truth, from his perspective. He was not greedy, dishonest, or adulterous; he fasted twice a week and paid tithes on his whole income. He was, from all external appearances, a much better man than the tax collector, who belonged to a group deserving of the bad name attached to them. They were seen as traitors because they were collecting taxes from their own people in the name of the pagan Romans.

In addition, the people who heard this parable would have feelings of revulsion even by the mention of a tax collector. Their presumption while hearing the parable would be that the Pharisee would be praised, and the tax

collector condemned.

However, that is not what happened. Because sincerity of heart and humility is what God wants from us when we pray, the tax collector is praised. Yes, he had faults, but he knew he had them, so he asked for mercy and forgiveness. The Pharisee was so busy talking about himself and his good deeds, and comparing himself favorably with other less worthy, that his prayer was little more than self-congratulation.

The tax collector, was clearly concerned with his unworthiness in the sight of God, but he had the courage to beg for forgiveness anyway. Thus, he is the one who is praised in the parable. Unfortunately for the Pharisee, his

arrogance will leave him outside of the Kingdom of God.

Thus, we need to refrain from the mistake that the Pharisee made. We can fall into the trap of congratulating ourselves when we appear to be better than other people. However, the only person we are supposed to compare ourselves to is Jesus Christ, and we all fall very short in that comparison.

Our gospel passage today is about prayer, but it also makes a commentary on judging others. Let me share with you a true story that I heard several years ago. A woman walked into her church to go to Confession and was happy to see that there was no line. She went into the confessional, and began to confess her sins. However, after a little while she stopped because she could not hear the priest. Then she realized there wasn't a priest in the confessional, and that she had her days mixed up. As she was exiting the confessional she was laughing at herself for making a silly mistake.

Let me interrupt the story for a moment. Imagine you were a member of that parish, and you happened to be in the church praying when you witnessed a woman going into the confessional on a day when you knew there were no Confessions, and then watched her come out a little while later. What might you think about that woman? You might think that she is quite the "bubble brain." You might begin to do more than that. You might begin to judge her.

Back to the true story. Not long after that she went back to the church on the correct day for Confession. After her Confession, she went to a pew to do her penance. A few moments later a woman sat down next to her and said, "I want to thank you. The last time you were here I saw you come out of the confessional with such a joyful expression on your face that I decided I needed to go back to Confession after having stayed away from it for a very long time."

God used that silly mistake that she made, and her ability to laugh at herself to bring someone back to the Sacrament of Confession. Had we been the person judging her as "clueless," we would have had no idea that God was using that exact moment to bring someone back to Confession. It demonstrates how bad we can be at judging others, and it demonstrates the good God can bring about when we try our very best to live our faith, but at times we do not seem to be doing it very well. There is not much God can do when we are not trying to live our faith. However, if we try our best to live our faith, God has something to work with to help us, and to help others draw closer to Him.

We are amateurs when it comes to judging because we lack all the information. Only God has all the information, so only He is qualified to judge. What we see is only part of the information. We do not know what's in their heart, or what they are thinking. We don't know their history, or how past events in their life have affected their behavior.

We can fall into the trap of judging when we spend too much time thinking about what we saw someone do, or what we heard them say. When we see something or hear something that we think is inappropriate, we can either dwell on it or we can let it go. When we continue to dwell on it, and think about it, that mental process will lead us to begin to judge that person. When we don't dwell on it, when we let it go, there is a good chance we are not going to judge that person.

In a world full of imperfect human beings, we are going to hear and see a lot of things that are inappropriate. We can judge the people who say or do those inappropriate things, or we can let it go. It is almost impossible to love someone when we are judging them. A quick prayer we can say when we see or hear something inappropriate is: "Lord, may that person become the child of God you know they can be, and may I become the child of God you know I can be." In that prayer we humbly pray for that person, and for ourselves because we know that we are both sinners in need of a Savior.

I think sometimes people who get involved in a church ministry become disillusioned because they expect the parish, the ministry, or the organization, to be a small bit of heaven, or utopia. They have romantic notions of how things should be in a church ministry. They have forgotten that every single person at the parish, and every single person in parish organizations and prayers groups is a sinner in need of a Savior. That is why they are there. That means we are surrounded by sinners when we come to church and join church organizations and prayer groups. That means that things will get messy at times. You can count on it.

When parish life gets messy, and when our prayer groups and parish organizations gets messy, God still makes good things come out of it. We give God our time and talent, and God makes good things happen even when we make a mess of things.

In the Liturgy of the Hours, there is a midday prayer that I like because it speaks to the messiness of our life and our work: "God of mercy, this midday moment of rest is your welcome gift. Bless the work we have begun, make good its defects, and let us finish it in a way that pleases you."

In last week's gospel, we heard Jesus tell a parable of the necessity to be persistent with our prayer. Knowing how messy life is, and how those around us are impacted by our pride, ego, bad choices, and our sin, it is important to be persistent with our prayer. A few months ago, I preached several times that living our faith takes effort. I quoted a passage from St. Paul which we heard today in our second reading: "I have competed well; I have finished the race; I have kept the faith." Living our faith well and keeping our faith in the midst of our world requires persistent prayer.

I think sometimes we neglect to pray because we feel like we are not getting anything out of our prayer; we don't have good feelings when we pray. Praying is not about receiving good feelings, but about spending time with God. God is present even when we don't feel good. Many saints spoke about not having good feelings when they prayed. Did they stop praying?

No. They kept praying because they knew God loved them even though they felt nothing when they prayed.

It is important to be faithful and committed to our prayer life no matter how we feel. Couples who have been married a long time will tell you that there were plenty of times when they did not have romantic feelings of love toward their spouse. However, they remained committed to the marriage because they promised to be true to their spouse in good times and in bad, in sickness and in health. Likewise, how many times have you gone to work even though you didn't feel like going? The bills need to be paid, so people go to work even when they don't feel like it. We need to have that same kind of dedication and persistence with our prayer.

In the parable in today's gospel, Jesus reminds us that our prayer needs to come from our humility. As Catholics we are blessed with lots of prayers and devotions. I encourage you to pray them, and to use them. However, it is important to speak to God in the words that He has asked us to pray. The "Our Father" was taught to us by Jesus, so we should be praying it daily. Similarly, in today's gospel Jesus taught us a very simple and humble prayer: "O God, be merciful to me a sinner." It is a prayer of a humble person who knows that they need God. We need God because our sin makes things more difficult for those around us. Our sins add to the messiness and difficulties in our life, in our parish, in our parish organizations, and in our prayer groups.

Life at home, at work, at school, and at church is messy and difficult. That means that we need to pray daily. Jesus clearly tells us that we must be persistent with our prayers, and our prayers need to include a humble statement of our

sinfulness and a need for God's mercy.

Let me conclude with a brief and humble prayer on behalf of all of us. "In the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. O God, be merciful to us sinners. Bless the work we have begun, make good its defects, and let us finish it in a way that pleases you. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen."


