27th Sunday in Ordinary Time - YRC 2025

A construction crew doing excavation work at a Carthusian monastery unearthed an unmarked grave of a monk, damaging the casket. Looking inside, they were amazed to see that the monk was incorrupt. He looked just like he did on the day he died. The crew quickly found the abbot of the monastery to let him know what they had discovered. The abbot told them to bury him again. "But he's incorrupt!" they said. "He must be holy." The abbot responded, "All Carthusians are supposed to be holy. This is not exceptional. Bury him again."

Today's gospel passage is telling us that living according to the teachings of Jesus should be normal. A virtuous and holy life should be normal. Sin and evil are not supposed to be normal. However, because of our fallen human nature and our increasingly immoral culture, holiness is hard work.

The Ten Commandments are the minimum requirements for being in a covenant relationship with God, which means, they are the minimum requirements for entering heaven. Living according to the Ten Commandments is what we are supposed to be doing. It is how God expects us to live, so no one ever becomes a recognized saint by living according to the minimum standards that God has set for us.

Going to Mass every weekend is the minimum standard for Mass attendance because we are commanded to both keep God first in our life and to keep holy the sabbath. Not using the Lord's name in vain is also one of the minimum standards, so we should not expect special recognition for keeping God's name holy. Being faithful to your spouse for your entire marriage should not merit a certificate from the Catholic Church. That's the normal expected behavior of all spouses according to the Ten Commandments (Thou shall not commit adultery).

When we look at our immoral culture, we notice a number of things that seem to warrant special recognition even though it is supposed to be normal behavior. Refraining from sex until you are married is supposed to be normal because according to Christian morals engaging in sex before marriage is the sin of fornication. It has always been a mortal sin. Giving birth to your child after becoming unexpectedly pregnant also used to be normal. Now there is a very strong temptation to abort the child. Showing up for work on time, working hard, being polite, and not viewing pornography, to name just a few, are supposed to be normal. However, as our culture becomes less Christian, we keep discovering a new moral bottom, so what used to be normal behavior now seems to warrant special recognition.

It is very discouraging as we continue to watch our culture slip deeper and deeper into immoral behavior, and call it normal and acceptable. The first part of the gospel passage about faith the size of a mustard seed offers us some encouragement. Jesus is telling us that God can accomplish a lot with us when we offer Him the little bit of faith that we have. God can do a lot with a little bit. He demonstrated that by transforming uneducated fishermen into Apostles, and feeding 5000 people with five loaves of bread and two fish. God can do a lot with the little bit that we have. Do we trust that?

Jesus is trying to encourage us. We don't need a huge amount of faith to begin serving the Lord. He will take what we offer Him, do great things with it, and give us the grace we need along the difficult road to holiness. Yes, it is a hard road, so if you have complained to God about how hard it is, you are not the first person to do that, and you will not be the last person to do that. Which brings us to our first reading.

The Book of Habakkuk consists of only three chapters. The first two chapters contains two complaints to God from the prophet Habakkuk, and then God's response. The third chapter is a beautiful prayer of faith and confidence in God. His first complaint is about the evils that existed in Jerusalem and the region where it is located. The second complaint is about the misery brought by the invasion of the Babylonian army, which was seen as God's judgment on the evil taking place in Jerusalem.

Habakkuk's complaint to God, "how long?", is a question that has been repeated in every generation, and some people are still waiting for a final answer. However, we Christians have received a final answer. Jesus Christ has conquered on the cross! The victory has been won, and the doors to heaven have been flung opened.

Our Lord's victory on the cross did not eliminate sin in the world, nor remove our freewill. It is a misuse of our freewill that causes most of the pain and suffering in the world. So, when looking at our life in the context of eternal life in heaven, where there is no pain nor suffering, the amount of time that we will live with human caused injustice, pain and suffering, is actually quite short when compared to an eternity in heaven.

The person who judges only in light of the immediate present sees no justice in the world, and may be tempted to conclude that God does not exist, or if He does, He does not care. A faithful Christian, in contrast, trusts that justice will prevail, if not in this life, then God will take care of it on the day of judgement. Do we trust that God's justice will prevail in the end? Habakkuk seemed uncertain.

So, was God offended by Habakkuk's complaints? No. God is not offended when we honestly share our feelings with Him. In fact, He wants to be invited into our lives so that He can help us get through our difficulties. Chapter 11 of the Gospel of Matthew records Jesus saying: "Come to me, all you who labor and are burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am meek and humble of heart; and you will find rest for yourselves. For my yoke is easy, and my burden light."

Thus, it is okay to pray like this: "How long O Lord will bad things happen? When will you do something about it?" It is okay to pray to God like that. Remember, from the cross Jesus quoted the first verse of Psalm 22: "My God, my God why have you abandoned me?" The first three-quarters of that psalm are full of anguish, but the last quarter is full of hope. Jesus was full of anguish and pain on the cross, but He knew that resurrection was going to follow, so by quoting that psalm He was telling us that He was suffering, but He also knew what was going to happen when He died.

We have all been through difficulties in our lives. For most of us, difficulties come and go. Thus, we know that they will end. That does not make the difficulties go away, but it gives us hope when life gets hard. So, in the midst of difficulties, it is okay to pray like this: "God, I don't understand why this is happening. Why is this happening to me? I don't like this. This is not pleasant. Why do you allow this? Please help me."

That last phrase is important, "Please help me." That is an invitation for God to enter our life. That's what God wants. He wants an invitation. He honors our freewill, so He will not enter our life if we do not invite Him in with our prayers.

Once again, when you are mad at God, you are not the first person, and you will not be the last person who is mad at Him. The key is to not stay mad at Him. Invite Him into the difficulties that you are encountering. Sometimes people might pray like this: "Lord, I do not know why this is happening to me. I'm not happy with you, but you are the only one who can help me, so please help me get through this." Or here's another way to pray while looking at a crucifix: "Lord, my life is a mess right now, and I don't know why this is happening to me. However, I know you know what it is like to suffer innocently. Please walk with me through this." It is difficult to stay mad at God when we gaze upon a crucifix knowing that Jesus, God Incarnate, suffered innocently such a horrible death to save us from our sins. I also recommend praying the 23^{rd} Psalm, especially this verse: "Even though I walk through the valley of death, I fear no evil; for thou art with me; thy rod and thy staff, they comfort me."

The prophet Habakkuk complained that God was taking too long to deal with the injustice in Jerusalem. If we do an honest examination of our own life, I can imagine God could ask us how long we are going to take to remove sin from our lives. We complain that God is not doing enough in the world. However, how hard are we working on becoming a saint? How much longer are we going to gossip, judge, curse, view pornography, be self-centered, etc.?

Now, look up here at the crucifix above the altar. God has died for us. He knows that it can be difficult for us to rid ourselves of habitual sins, but He still wants us to keep trying to be the child of God He created us to be. If we do not accomplish that in this life, and we remain faithful to Him to the end, He will give us the opportunity to finish our purification and sanctification in purgatory.

In the midst of life's difficulties and struggles, may we always remain faithful and confident in God's love, mercy, and justice. Let me close with another helpful prayer in the midst of trials and tribulations. It is the closing prayer for the Divine Mercy Chaplet.

Eternal God, in whom mercy is endless and the treasury of compassion inexhaustible, look kindly upon us and increase Your mercy in us, that in difficult moments we might not despair nor become despondent, but with great confidence submit ourselves to Your holy will which is Love and Mercy itself. Amen. Jesus, I trust in you.


