All Souls Day - 2025

When I was ordained a priest 23 years ago, most of the funerals were with a body in a casket. However, because of the high cost of burials, many people are now choosing to be cremated. Yes, Catholics are allowed to be cremated, but the cremains must be treated like a body in a casket. The whole body is in the casket, and is buried in a cemetery. Similarly, all the cremains must be in one urn, and that one urn must be placed in a cemetery. We do not scatter the cremains or divide them up among family members. That is the teaching of the Catholic Church. If your loved one requested to have their cremains scattered, you will actually honor them by interring all their cremains in one urn in a cemetery. Most Catholic parishes will not participate in funeral services when cremains are scattered or divided.

I like talking about heaven. If we are doing our best to live the Christian life, meaning we are doing our best to love God and neighbor and we desire that God's kingdom come and His will be done in our life, and we want to do His will all the time nonstop for all eternity in heaven, and even though we struggle to do that, and always humbly repent when we sin, then we are on the narrow path to heaven, and the day we die will be the best day of our life.

We are healed of everything when we die. All the chronic aches and pains, and any psychological wounds that we have die when our body dies. Any disease like heart disease, kidney disease, etc. dies when our body dies. Even cancer dies when our body dies. That means cancer never has the last word. God does. In the end, everyone beats cancer. It may appear that cancer wins sometimes, but it doesn't. The cancer dies when our body dies, but our soul is eternal. Even old age dies when our body dies. In addition, there is no PTSD nor mental illness in heaven. The perfect healing of body, mind, and spirit that we long for is coming, and it happens when we die.

Our pain and suffering in this life are a share in the pain and suffering of our Lord Jesus Christ. As He offered up His pain and suffering to save us from our sins, we are asked to also offer our pain and suffering for others. The road to heaven is not easy. However, the total time that we will experience pain and suffering on this planet will be short compared to an eternity in heaven. A life of 80 years on this planet in miniscule when compared to an eternity in heaven.

Let me try to put that in perspective. The distance from our parish to my brother's house in Flagstaff is about 190 miles, so we will use that for our timeline. There are 5,280 feet in a mile, and 12 inches in a foot, so there are more than 12 million inches (12,030,400 to be exact) in 190 miles. Let's place one billion years on that timeline of 190 miles, and keep in mind, one billion years is far short of an eternity. On that 190-mile timeline of one billion years, 80 years is almost exactly one inch (0.96 to be exact). Thus, the total amount of our life that we can experience pain and suffering is miniscule when we look at our life as continuing into an eternity in heaven when we die

That is why we Christians live with hope. Hope, as defined in the glossary of the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* is, "The theological virtue by which we desire and expect from God both eternal life and the grace we need to attain it." God's grace is the help that He gives us along the way to eternal life. God is helping us to get there. God wants us with Him in heaven. That is why Jesus came to show us the way to heaven. He is the way, the truth, and the life (John 14:6). Thus, if we are cooperating with God's grace as we strive to live the Good News of our Lord Jesus Christ all the time, even in the midst of pain and suffering, and we constantly repent of our sin, then we are striving along that narrow path to the narrow gate to heaven. That is why we Christians live with hope. God offers us eternal life in heaven on the other side of death.

But what about those habitual sins that we confess every time we go to Confession? Will those keep us from going to heaven? If we are humbly repenting of all our sin, and entrusting ourselves to God's mercy, we are going to be okay. One of the prayers from Mass (Collect of 26th Sunday in Ordinary Time), makes this bold proclamation: "O God, who manifest your almighty power above all by pardoning and showing mercy." God wants to use His almighty power to pardon us when we ask for His mercy. His love takes the form of mercy when it encounters our misery.

So, God wants to forgive us, and we humbly ask God to forgive all our sins. However, most of us are going to die without having been perfected in this life. We will not have yet become the holy child of God that we are created to be. That means most of us are going to need some final purification in purgatory. On All Souls Day we pray for those who are in Purgatory. So, let's talk a little bit about purgatory.

When we die, we will be judged immediately by Christ (Heb 9:27). In Catholic Tradition this is called the particular judgment (*Catechism of Catholic Church*, #1021-1022). It is the moment when God will decide where we will spend our eternity, either in heaven or in hell. Yet, in order to enter heaven, and be in the presence of God, we must be perfect, pure and holy. Here are three scripture verses that mention that. "Strive...for the holiness without which no one will see the Lord" (Heb 12:14). Referring to heaven, St. John writes, "Nothing unclean shall enter it" (Rev 21:27). "Blessed are the pure of heart for they shall see God" (Matt 5:8). If anyone of us were to die at this moment, how many of us could say that we are completely pure? Scripture tells us we cannot be in heaven unless we are perfect.

Now, there is a very big difference between a gold--plated coin, and a coin which is pure gold. God is not going to simply cover our fallen nature with holiness. He is going to make us pure throughout. We should not despair by thinking that the perfection needed for heaven is impossible. We are told nothing is impossible with God (Luke 1:37). Sacred Scripture is clear; God desires all men to be saved (1Timothy 2:4). We can be confident God has a means to make us perfect.

For those of us who die in a state of grace, but not yet made perfect, God, because of His merciful love, has given us the great gift of purgatory. It is in purgatory where we can be made holy, and enabled to enter heaven to be in the presence of God. On All Souls Day we pray for those souls who are in purgatory. As the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* (#1030) states, "All who die in God's grace and friendship, but still imperfectly purified, are indeed assured of their eternal salvation; but after death they undergo purification, so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven."

Now, impurities of our soul are not limited to sin. We can also form worldly attachments that lead us away from God, and we can have sinful inclinations contrary to love of God. Keep in mind, with God's grace we have opportunities in this life to purify ourselves through various forms of penance, prayer, works of charity, and with redemptive suffering. However, if we are not yet perfect after this life, we are purified in the next through purgatory (*Catechism of the Catholic Church*, #1459--1460, 1472--1473).

Let me illustrate this with two images. Imagine a wooden board, painted completely white and perfectly smooth with no damage or defects. This is like a pure soul without sin. Now, imagine nails have been hammered into this board representing the sins we have committed. We remove each of the nails as we repent but the result is that the nail holes remain. Over time the board also sustains scratches and stains which correspond to our worldly attachments and sinful inclinations. In order for the board to be restored to perfection, all of these defects must be repaired. We must be purified of all those defects in this life or in the next to become perfectly pure.

Here's another image. Throughout Scripture, God reveals how He is a refiner and purifier of silver and gold (Wisdom 3:5-6; 1 Peter 1:6-7). This idea of refining and purifying is the process where God makes us holy. Once again, this process begins in our earthly lives, but, if a person dies in a state of grace but not yet perfect, it continues in purgatory.

When working to purify a piece of silver, a silversmith will apply very intense heat to the metal causing impurities to rise to the surface. He will remove the impurities as they rise to the surface, and will continue reapplying the intense heat until he finally sees the metal is pure. How does the silversmith know when the silver is pure? When he can see his own reflection in it. Similarly, penance, prayer and sacrifices in this life, and our time in purgatory after death are like this fire and heat (1 Corinthians 3:15). These experiences refine us to remove imperfections. When God can see His own reflection in us, we are free to enter heaven.

We cannot enter God's presence in heaven unless we are perfect. Our God is a merciful God, and, because of this, He has given us the great gift of purgatory. God makes us perfect, and enables us to enter heaven and eternal communion with Him where we are filled with everlasting peace, joy and happiness. May our deceased family members and friends in purgatory be soon granted entrance into heaven.




