Dedication of the Lateran Basilica in Rome – 2025

The first reading is from the Book of the Prophet Ezekiel. He was with the first group of Jews that were exiled from Jerusalem to Babylon around the year 597BC. His role was to prepare those living in exile for the destruction of Jerusalem and the temple, which happened in the year 587BC. The temple in Jerusalem was where God dwelt among the people, and where the Jews could encounter God in a special way.

God chose to enter into a covenant relationship with the Israelites. They were the chosen people from whom the Messiah would come. God's intention was that they would be a holy nation who would attract pagans to the faith of the Israelites so that all the nations could worship the one true God. However, what happened was that many of the Israelites fell into the temptation of worshipping pagan gods rather than the one true God. They left the true God for false gods. Unfortunately, that still happens. Many people have given up their belief in God for the convenience of living the way they want to live, which is a life of sinful pleasure, rather than strive to live a life of holiness. Many Israelites no longer went to the temple to worship and encounter the one true God. As a result, God permitted the temple to be destroyed and the people to be exiled far away from Jerusalem to demonstrate that, spiritually, they were far from God. God wanted to be close to them, but they had chosen not to be close to God.

After the destruction of the temple, Ezekiel's message changed. He prophesied that in the future God Himself would shepherd the people (Ezk 34:11-31), and because they had broken the covenant and worshipped pagan gods, God desired the purification of the people and the land (Ezk 36:16-32). With the famous dry bones prophecy (Ezk 37:1-14), he told the people that the nation would rise again from the dead, and thus, God would bring them back from spiritual death, and arrange for their return to Jerusalem.

The climax of all this is in chapters 40 through 43 where Ezekiel is shown a vision of the new temple, and the blessings that God wanted to impart on the people when they return to Jerusalem and rebuild the temple (This vision took place in April 573BC, see Ezk 40:1). Our first reading is from this section. The water flowing from the temple brings life wherever it goes, symbolizing that God brings life and healing to all who worship Him alone.

Faithfulness to God required the Jews to rebuild the temple, and worship there. That obedience to God, that faithfulness to God, will impact how they live, and help them to reestablish a covenant relationship with God. A covenant creates a family relationship. God wants the people close to Him, now, and for all eternity. The ultimate blessing and final healing that we encounter in eternal life is the result of that covenant relationship with God. The eternal pains of hell, which is eternal exile from God, is the result of rejecting that covenant relationship with God up until the time of our death.

In 537BC, Cyrus the Persian conquered Babylon, and the following year he allowed the Jews to return home to Jerusalem. They began rebuilding the temple, and it was consecrated in 516BC. About 500 years later, around the year 19BC, work began to renovate it and expand it. Knowing how important reestablishing the temple was to God, we can see why Jesus was upset that the temple, a house of prayer, and where God dwelt among the people, had been turned into a marketplace. Instead of encountering God, the people were encountering overpriced animals for sacrifices, and dishonest exchange rates for their money. The temple was supposed to be first and foremost where the people encountered God.

Noticed that Jesus called His body a temple. Those who encounter Him, encounter God. For He is Emmanuel, God with us. As a famous verse earlier in the Gospel of John states (John 1:14), "And the Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us." Remember, in chapter six of the Gospel of John is the famous Bread of Life Discourse where Jesus taught for the first time about His real presence in the Most Holy Eucharist (John 6:51): "I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world." At the Last Supper, Jesus instituted the Sacrament of the Most Holy Eucharist. Thus, He showed us that we would consume His body in the form of unleavened bread.

God permitted the newly renovated and expanded temple to be destroyed by the Romans in 70AD. There was no longer a need for animal sacrifice at the temple in Jerusalem because the death of Jesus on the cross for our sins was the final sacrifice. That sacrifice of the cross is re-presented to us at every Catholic Mass. We are not re-sacrificing Jesus. That is not what we are doing. During the prayers of consecration, the Body of Christ, sacrificed for us on the altar of the cross, is sacramentally re-presented to us on our altar in the form of bread and wine. Jesus is really and truly dwelling with us in the form of the consecrated bread and wine.

After Holy Communion in every Catholic Church, the remaining consecrated hosts are placed in the tabernacle, so we can truly say that God is dwelling in our church. That is why we are respectful and reverent in every Catholic Church. That is why this building is not for socializing and talking, but praying to God, worshipping Him, and celebrating Mass. Genuflecting toward the tabernacle, and dipping our hand into holy water to make the sign of the cross every time we enter or leave a Catholic church, reminds us that God dwells here. Jesus did not like the lack of reverence in the temple, where God dwelt, so we need to make sure that we are always reverent in Catholic Churches because God is truly dwelling in all of them.

We can be tempted to stay home and not attend Mass because that is easier and more convenient. When we do that, we are exiling ourselves from God. Jesus told us to take up our crosses and follow Him. If we frequently choose what is easy and convenient, we can be certain that we are giving in to the temptation of the Evil One who wants to separate us from God. Blessings flow from encountering God in His house, especially when we encounter Jesus Christ truly present in the Holy Eucharist and in every tabernacle. The most important blessing of putting God first in our life, is eternal life in heaven.

When God is first in our life, and we follow His teachings and the teachings of His holy Catholic Church, then we are honoring both God, and our body. In our second reading today, St. Paul reminded us that our bodies are temples of God, and that they are holy (1Cor 3:16-17). In fact, Jesus said that sin defiles us (Mark 7:20-23). Sin defiles us because we were created for communion with God; for being in a covenant relationship with Him. Sin breaks that covenant relationship. As I preached last weekend, we need to be holy and pure in order to enter heaven, which is why most of us will spend time in purgatory after we die.

When we attend Mass on the weekend with many of our fellow parishioners, we are keeping two of the Ten Commandments: We are truly encountering God in our church, and we are practicing for heaven. In heaven, we will be giving praise and worship to God with the billions of people who are there.

After all that, it is finally time to speak about the Lateran Basilica, which is the cathedral church of the Archdiocese of Rome. Today is the anniversary of the dedication of the original church built on that site. It was first dedicated on November 9, 324. The cathedral is the parish church for the bishop. The cathedral for the Diocese of Phoenix is Sts. Simon and Jude Cathedral in Phoenix, so that is the parish church for our bishop, Bishop John Dolan. Who is the Bishop of Rome? Pope Leo. Thus, the Lateran Basilica is the parish church for our pope. Thus, in a special way, it is also the parish church for all Catholics. Because of that, on November 9th of each year, the Catholic Church celebrates the Feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica since in a special way it is our cathedral too.

The Lateran Basilica has quite a history. The land the church is built on was donated by the wealthy Lateran family to the Emperor Constantine, who in turn donated it so that a church could be built. That is the same Constantine who legalized Christianity throughout the entire Roman Empire in 313AD. As I mentioned earlier, the first church on that site was dedicated on November 9, 324. In 410 it was ransacked by the barbarian tribe known as the Visigoths. Thirty-five years later, in 455, it was ransacked by the barbarian tribe known as the Vandals. Because of their reputation, the English word "vandal" means someone who destroys or damages property. True to their name, the Vandals destroyed the recently rebuilt walls that were destroyed by the Visigoths. In 896, an earthquake caused the roof to collapse. In 1308, a fire destroyed the church, and 59 years later, in 1367 another fire destroyed the church yet again. Fortunately, that was the last time the church was destroyed. Each time the church was destroyed, or heavily damaged, it was rebuilt.

Why did the people keep rebuilding that Basilica? Because God dwelt there. It was their spiritual home where they gathered together as a community. Over the centuries, the people of Rome faithfully rebuilt the Lateran Basilica each time it was destroyed. That is a testament to the faith and determination of the people over those many centuries. They were not going to allow anything to permanently prevent them from celebrating Mass in their cathedral church. As many times as it was destroyed, it was rebuilt. That church was a symbol of the faith of the Christians in Rome. After hearing today's readings, we can understand the importance of churches to God, and after hearing the history of the Lateran Basilica, we should be impressed with the determination and the faith of the people in Rome during those turbulent years. May we have the same faith and determination to maintain our church as a place to encounter God.

Let's conclude with a prayer. Heavenly Father, help us to build our lives on the foundation of Jesus Christ and His teachings so that our bodies may truly be a temple of God, and a dwelling place of the Holy Spirit. May our church truly be a house of prayer where we encounter God and give Him praise, worship, and glory in anticipation of doing the same in heaven. Through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.




