Christ the King – YRC 2025

"If you are the King of the Jews, save yourself." That temptation for Jesus to save himself and end the excruciating pain was very strong. What kind of Savior would He be if He saved Himself rather than us? Likewise, the temptation from the devil for Jesus to use His divine power to turn stones into bread when He had completed 40 days of fasting in the desert (Luke 4:1-13), was a very powerful temptation. What kind of king would Jesus be if He used His power for only His benefit?

The way Jesus responded to both of those temptations revealed not only the heart of God to us, but also that Jesus came to save us, not Himself. He came to serve us, not Himself. As Jesus said (Matt 20:28), "The Son of Man came not to be served, but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many." Our king wants us, His subjects, to imitate His example. How do we do that?

Near the end of the battle of Helm's Deep in the movie *The Two Towers*, Eomer, the captain of the Riders of Rohan (a huge calvary), yells out, "To the king!" For Christians, that is a great rallying cry. We need to be constantly going to our king, our Lord Jesus Christ, so that we are always close to Him.

However, the disconcerting part about our king, is that we see Him enthroned on the cross. To be close to our king is to follow Him by offering up all the suffering that we encounter in our life, but perhaps more importantly, the cross demonstrated clearly to us that the road to freedom is found through obedience to the Father.

Listen to this from the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* (#908), which includes a wonderful quote from St. Ambrose: "By his obedience unto death, Christ communicated to his disciples the gift of royal freedom, so that they might...overcome the reign of sin in themselves: 'That man is rightly called a king who makes his own body an obedient subject and, by governing himself with suitable rigor, refuse to let his passions breed rebellion in his soul, for he exercises a kind of royal power over himself.'"

We know from personal experience that it is sometimes very easy to give in to the temptation to sin. At times, we seem to be powerless against that temptation. At those moments, we experience what it is like to be a slave to sin. We yearn for the kind of freedom that has the ability to cooperate with God's grace to say "No" to temptation. Which reminds me of another battle cry: "Freedom!" from the movie *Braveheart*.

When our Lord said He came to set prisoners free, He was not necessarily speaking about those in jail, but us sinners who seem powerless against temptation. Our king is fighting for our freedom from the tyranny of temptation, sin, and Satan. In fact, our Lord's death on the cross is His victory over sin and Satan. Jesus Christ, our king, rules from heaven, but His return to heaven was through the cross.

We need the practice of ruling over our bodies. Too often we allow the demands of our body to rule us. A Sprite commercial from years past proclaimed that we need to "Obey your thirst." I hated that commercial. Our body is not supposed to be the boss of us. However, if we are not practicing discipline, our body will rule us. We need to rule our bodies by determining how we are going to take care of it. If we are not practicing saying "No" to our bodies, then falling into sin becomes easier and easier, and the result is less and less freedom to say "No" to sin and temptation.

Knowing that we need to practice saying "No" to temptation, we should begin to see the wisdom of doing a little penance every Friday. Every Friday can be a mini-Lent so that we can practice saying "No" to the demands our body makes on us. If you spend too much time on YouTube, then give it up every Friday. Give something up something you enjoy every Friday so that you can practice saying "No." and it does not have to be the same thing every Friday.

It is one thing to practice saying "No," to the demands of our body, it is another to practice saying "Yes" to virtue. Perhaps, one day a week, be intentional about living one or more of the seven capital virtues: humility, generosity, chastity, meekness (gentleness of spirit), temperance (moderation of desire for pleasure), brotherly love (desire for the true good of our neighbor), diligence (consistency in doing what is right). Do we feel we are free to be virtuous, or do we find ourselves struggling to do that? Is virtue easy for us? If not, what are we doing about that? Our lack of virtue causes problems for those who are in the closest relationships with us because the virtues are the skills and the abilities we need to be in good, healthy relationships.

It is disastrous when local and national leaders lack virtue. We see a good case study for that in the Old Testament. Moses led the Israelites out of Egypt, but he died before they entered the Promised Land. Joshua took the place of Moses as their leader, but when he died, there wasn't a leader appointed to replace him. The Israelites entered a period that is called the time of the Judges.

Historically, the Book of Judges covers the time period from after the death of Joshua around 1250BC to about 1050BC. Some of the Judges were judges in the modern sense of the word, but most of them were more along the lines of a military leader, or a hero (Samson). Since there was no king, the twelve tribes formed a sort of loose confederation.

In chapter 9 of the Book of Judges (9:8-15), we find a negative attitude toward kings. God is supposed to be their king. However, near the end of the Book of Judges we find four times the statement (Judges 17:6; 18:1; 19:1; 21:25): "In those days there was no king in Israel; everyone did what he thought best." In fact, the very last verse in the Book of Judges repeats that verse for the final time. So, the longer the tribes go without a single strong ruler, the more they desire one because near the end of the Book of Judges things are getting chaotic and atrocities are being committed by the Israelites.

However, in the next book of the Bible, The First Book of Samuel, there are two strong judges. The first is Eli, and the second is Samuel. Both seem to be able to keep order, but they are not kings. In fact, a curious thing is noted about both of them. Both of them have sons who are immoral.

We read this in the First Book of Samuel (2:12-13a): "Now the sons of Eli were wicked; they had respect neither for the Lord nor for the priests' duties toward the people." And then six chapters later we find this (1Samuel 8:1-5): "In his old age Samuel appointed his sons judges over Israel. His first born was named Joel, his second son, Abijah; they judged at Beer-sheba. His sons did not follow his example but sought illicit gain and accepted bribes, perverting justice. Therefore, all the elders of Israel came in a body to Samuel at Ramah and said to him, 'Now that you are old, and your sons do not follow your example, appoint a king over us, as other nations have, to judge us.""

Eli was virtuous and a strong leader, but his sons were wicked. Samuel was virtuous and a strong leader, but his sons didn't follow his example. The people wanted Samuel to anoint someone to be king because they didn't want Samuel's sons to mess things up. However, who rules after a king dies? One of his sons. What was their experience with the sons of Eli and Samuel? Not good.

The people seem to be caught between a rock and a hard place. Things got chaotic without a strong ruler. However, it is clear that you can't count on the sons of a strong ruler to be able to follow in his dad's footsteps in both virtue and

leadership skills.

So, Samuel anointed Saul as the first king of Israel. He was a good military leader, but he had mood swings and was jealous of David. When Saul died in a battle, David became the king over the tribe of Judah, but the other tribes follow Saul's son Ishbaal, who ruled for two years, and then was murdered. Today's first reading follows immediately after the burial of Saul's son Ishbaal.

All the tribes were united under the kingship of David. His son Solomon ruled when he died, and Solomon's son Rehoboam, ruled when Solomon died. The kingdom split into a north and south not long after Rehoboam became king, and was never united again. Most of the kings in both the north and the south were poor leaders and not virtuous. In fact, when a king is introduced in either the First or Second Book of Kings, the statement, "He did evil in the Lord's sight..." appears after the name of most of the kings. It is obvious, the people need a king who is a good leader and virtuous. Where were they going to find such a king?

We see our Jewish brothers and sisters struggling throughout the Old Testament because they rarely had good, virtuous, moral leaders. Unfortunately, not much has changed. We too struggle when there is a lack of good, virtuous, and moral leaders. Jesus came down from heaven to teach us and to show us the way, and the saints have demonstrated for us that it is possible to live that way. Jesus Christ, the Second Person of the Holy Trinity, is our King. We celebrate that today. May Jesus Christ truly be our king so that we may more and more become what we desire in our leaders: a person who is courageous, and loves what is good, virtuous, and moral. To the King!!!
