2nd Sunday of Advent – YRA 2025

Let's begin with the first reading. Jesse was the father of King David, and the descendents of a family are often referred to as a family tree, so the stump of Jesse is an image for the family lineage of King David that had been brought to an end. King David was promised a kingdom that would last forever (2Sam 7:16), so the shoot sprouting from the stump of Jesse is an image of hope that a king from the line of David will return one day.

Historically, the reign of Davidic kings came to an end in 586BC. A once flourishing family tree of a line of kings was reduced to a mere stump, and after almost 600 years, it may have seemed impossible that the stump of Jesse could bring forth another king to rule the people.

We know that Jesus is the shoot that came from the stump of Jesse. After 600 years without a Davidic King, it would have been easy to fall into the despair that there would never be another Davidic King. However, God specializes in waiting until all seems lost before acting so that it is clear that He is the one that is bringing something wonderful out of a hopeless situation.

A few brief examples from the New Testament. When the Wedding at Cana had no wine, the Blessed Virgin Mary knew who to ask to rectify that hopeless situation. Jesus turned about 120 gallons of water into very good wine (John 2:1-11). On two occasions Jesus had a very large crowd (5,000 the first time (Matt 14:13-21) and 4,000 the second time (Matt 15:32-38)) gathered around Him, but there was no food to feed them. They both seemed like hopeless situations. However, from a few loaves and a few fish Jesus fed thousands of people, not once, but twice. When Jesus died on the cross, there was a lot of despair and hopelessness. Death is probably the most hopeless of all situations. However, as you know, He did not stay dead.

The lesson for us is that Jesus has changed our entire outlook on life because the most hopeless situation, death, now is the doorway to eternal life in heaven. With Jesus, the difficulties, trials, pain, suffering, and disappointments of this life will eventually give way to eternal life in heaven where there is no death, mourning, pain, suffering, nor disappointments.

God brings life from death, so reestablishing the kingdom of David after 600 years was going to be easy for God, and as we know, the reign of Christ the King is eternal. His kingdom is not of this earth, but a heavenly kingdom (John 18:33-38).

Let's continue walking through the first reading. It says that the spirit of the LORD will rest upon the one who sprouts from the stump of Jesse. As we know, Jesus is God incarnate, so He will do everything with the divine wisdom, knowledge, love, and mercy of God. In fact, what we heard were the gifts of the Holy Spirit which we all received in the Sacrament of Confirmation. God wants all His children to receive the Gifts of the Holy Spirit.

Then we heard that, "Not by appearance shall he judge, nor by hearsay shall he decide." Too often we formulate our opinion of someone before we even get to know them, or we formulate our opinion without ever having met the person because we believe the gossip of others. We are far more complicated than any gossip spoken about us. Each of us has been impacted and affected by hundreds of events in our lives from triumph to tragedy, and everything in between. All those events, from triumph to tragedy, have molded us and shaped us into the person we are. What may be strange behavior to us may be normal in that person's family of origin. They may not know any better. What may be strange behavior to us could be someone's coping mechanism to deal with a trauma in their life. Let's face it, we make judgments about people while we know so little about them.

In order to be a good judge of someone, we must know that person completely. We must know everything about them. That is an impossibility for us, but not for God. Only He has enough information to judge us. That's why the verse, "Not by appearance shall he judge, nor by hearsay shall he decide," has to be some of the best news of all time. God does not listen to the gossip and the hearsay spoken about us because He already knows the truth.

The last section of the first reading is one of the most beautiful and hopeful passages in the bible. Natural enemies becoming friends in the animal world symbolizes the kind of friendships among human beings that God always intended for us, like the tranquility in the Garden of Eden before the original sin. We know in the depth of our being that God always intended us to live in peace and tranquility with everyone. That will only happen when every person lives according to God's teaching all the time. That seems to be an impossibility for us human beings, but not for God.

Human beings have not been able to establish a peaceful and tranquil existence on this planet, so it may seem like we are in a hopeless situation. However, the more we say "no" to temptation, and the more we say "yes" to God, the more we establish, with the help of God, His kingdom. In addition, we live with the hope that the peaceful and tranquil existence that was beautifully presented in the first reading is waiting for us in heaven where God's will is lived perfectly. I can't wait to experience it, so that is the hope I live with that gets me through all the trials and difficulties of life. Because of Jesus, I live with that hope.

The gospels do not tell us how long John the Baptist was preaching and baptizing before he baptized Jesus. Six months to a year seems plausible. His ministry was to prepare the people to encounter our Lord Jesus Christ. The people were expecting a prophet like Elijah to prepare the way for the Messiah (Malachi 3:23). The last prophet died around the year 450BC, so when John the Baptist began his ministry, the people were very excited because he appeared to be fulfilling the role of the one who would prepare for the Messiah. In fact, the clothing he wore matched the description of the prophet Elijah in the Second Book of Kings (2Kings 1:7-8). This was not just a big deal, this was huge. The long-awaited Messiah was on his way.

For the people of that time, that meant a military leader who was also from the line of King David. They were expecting that the Kingdom of David would be reestablished. However, God did not want to reestablish the political kingdom of David, which would have eventually degenerated into family infighting and dysfunction like the previous Kingdom of David. In fact, that is what happens to almost all royal dynasties. Think about the current royal family in England, and read the First and Second Books of Kings to see how dysfunctional royal families become as a result of sin.

God has a better kingdom in mind for us. An eternal kingdom with a perfect king who will suffer and die to save us from our sins. Thus, the message of John the Baptist for preparing for the Messiah was not to encourage them to train for battle, but to (Matt 3:2): "Repent for the kingdom of heaven is at hand." The Romans were not their worst enemy. Our worst enemy is sin and Satan. That means we need to change our lives so that we live according to God's ways, rather than the world's ways. In other words, live a life that has God at the center of it. That's what we should be doing all of the time: living with God at the center of our life. However, at times we are distracted by money and immoral pleasure. Those things cannot save our souls, and cannot raise us from the dead after we die.

In fact, John the Baptist's warning to the Pharisees and Sadducees (the religious leaders of that time) to, "Produce good fruit as evidence of your repentance" is also a warning for all of us. Hearing the teachings of our Lord Jesus Christ is supposed to result in a change in our heart. To be in the Kingdom of God requires a change in how we live. We call that repentance or conversion. If we believe that Jesus is the Messiah, but we live according to the standards of our fallen world, then we have not repented. We are not in the Kingdom of God. We are not living with Jesus at the center of our life. We are not producing good fruits of repentance. We are living in our kingdom rather than God's Kingdom.

Everyone loves to celebrate Christmas. However, the child (Jesus) who was born in Bethlehem, who suffered and died for us, will also judge us when we die. Only He is qualified to do that. Jesus is most merciful. He forgives us every time we repent of our sin. However, He also knows if we have not truly produced good fruit as evidence of our repentance.

At the time of Jesus, to separate the harvested wheat from the chaff, they were tossed in the air. The chaff is easily blown away by the wind, while the kernels of wheat fall to the ground. Just as that process easily separates the chaff from the wheat, so it is easy for God to determine which lives produced only chaff, and which lives bore fruits of repentance. Those lives that bore fruits of repentance were striving (with the grace and help of God) to imitate Jesus in His love and in His obedience to the Father.

Both Advent and Lent remind us to be more intentional about including God in all that we do. As we prepare to celebrate the birth of Jesus Christ on Christmas Day, let's use this season of Advent to recommit ourselves to putting Jesus at the center of our life for He is the reason for the season. He is our Savior. He is the way, the truth and the life (John 14:6).
