13th Sunday in Ordinary Time – YRA 2026

Once again, we will begin with our second reading. Paul is addressing those who would argue that because repenting of our sin results in receiving an abundance of grace from God, we can continue to sin in order to unleash more of God's grace in the world. That is faulty logic, and it sounds like something the Evil One would suggest. More sin in the world is a horrible idea because it wreaks havoc in our world, causes so many problems in families, and breaks our covenant relationship with God. God's grace is meant to rid the world of sin, not encourage it.

In this passage, Paul is telling us that we cannot live in sin anymore because we have died to sin. In Baptism, we share Jesus' death and resurrection. Going down into the baptismal water is like being buried with Jesus, and coming up out of the water is like being raised from the dead with him. United to Jesus in His death, our sins are put to death, and united to His rising, our souls are filled with life. Thus, in dying, Jesus conquered the power of sin; in rising from the dead, He conquered the power of death; and as a result of our Baptism, we are now dead to sin and living for God.

In our first reading, we encounter the prophet, Elisha. God had directed the great prophet, Elijah, to anoint Elisha to be his successor (1Kings 19:16). In this passage, we learn that Elisha is receiving food and shelter from a wealthy woman who has no son, and has a husband who is getting old. In that culture, widow women depended on their oldest son to help them. She is promised a son by Elisha, and within a year she gives birth to a baby boy.

The first reading is connected to the second half of our gospel passage. Jesus said that those who assist the apostles, prophets, and righteous men will be rewarded by God. Anyone who helps those who are doing the work of Jesus, and gives assistance because of that work, "will surely not lose their reward." Last week, I spoke a little bit about hell and judgement. Today, we heard Jesus tell us that the people of this world will be judged and rewarded, in part, based on how they reacted to and treated those who came to them preaching and teaching the Good News of our Lord Jesus Christ.

The teaching of Jesus in the first part of our gospel passage is completely logical from a Christian perspective. He told us we are supposed to love Him more than we love our father and mother. Indirectly, He is telling us that He is God because the only thing that should come before family is God. Since Jesus is God Incarnate, the Second Person of the Holy Trinity, we are supposed to love Him more than father, mother, son, or daughter. That should make sense. Our family cannot save us from our sins and raise us from the dead, but Jesus can.

As Christians, we love our parents, but we are supposed to love Jesus more. In fact, when God is the center and focus of our life, we do a better job of loving mother and father, spouse, children, and all our neighbors. Jesus increases our capacity to love, to forgive, to be patient, kind, and merciful. Thus, our ability and our capacity to love increases when He is first in our life.

Many people do not understand that. Frequently, I hear from Catholics who tell me that their spouse, who is not a practicing Christian, is making it difficult for them to practice their faith. It is logical that you would encourage your spouse to do those things that will help them to become more loving, patient, and kind. Thus, it does not make sense to discourage your spouse from putting Jesus first in their lives when the result is that they will have an increased capacity for love and mercy, which makes them a better person, which in turn makes for a better marriage.

Jesus never promised us that our life would be easier when He is the center and focus of our life. He told us in our gospel passage today that there would be crosses (Matt 10:38-39), and because it is a teaching that needs to be repeated, we encounter Him saying it again six chapters later (Matt 16:24-25). The topic of suffering must have come up with the early Christians, because St. Peter addressed that topic in his first letter (1Peter 4:12-13). All of us encounter suffering. Most of us know that in our head, but there is still that frustration of wondering why bad things happen to good people.

Sometimes when bad things happen to Christians, they become angry at God for a long time, and begin to put other things in their life before God. When they do that, their capacity to love, forgive, to be patient, kind, and merciful, begins to decrease. That is exactly what the Evil One wants because less God, love, and mercy in our life means more division and frustration in our life. The Evil One enjoys seeing us put ourselves through that little bit of hell. Ultimately, the Evil One wants to divide us from God for all eternity.

When bad things happen to us, our first reaction should be to go to God in prayer, and to ask Him for help, even if we are mad at Him. When something horrible has happened to us, we should sit down, gaze at a crucifix, and say a prayer like this, "Lord, I do not know why this is happening to me, but I know that you know what it is like when bad things happen to good people. Please, help me to get through this. Amen." Perhaps do that here in our church while gazing at the crucifix above our altar, or at home while holding a crucifix in your hands. It is hard to remain angry at God about the difficulties in our life when we are gazing at a crucifix. God knows what it is like to suffer innocently. In addition, be sure to ask family and friends for help. The difficulties of life should draw us closer to God, family, and friends.

God does not expect us to carry our crosses alone. Remember, Jesus had the help of Simon of Cyrene to carry His cross up the hill to Calvary. He needed help because He was in a physically weakened state from the horrible scourging which caused Him to lose a lot of blood. Can you imagine trying to carry that cross when your back has been horribly scourged? The pain must have been horrible, and then that horrible pain was only going to get worse when He was crucified.

When bad things happen in our life, our first reaction should be to go to Jesus. He knows what it is like when horrible things happen to good people. He is always a great companion in good times and in bad times. When Jesus truly comes before mother and father, then we will find ourselves turning to Him all the time to thank Him for the blessings of the day, and to ask Him for help with our crosses.

One way to prayerfully practice doing this is the Daily Examen. Before going to bed, we reflect upon our day, and call to mind our sins, failures, and stupidities, and then we say an Act of Contrition. Along with that Act of Contrition, we should also invite our Lord to help us carry whatever burdens and crosses we may have at that time. After that, we reflect upon the blessings of the day, and then we say a prayer of thanksgiving to God for those blessings.

By doing that every night, we are ending each day with God at the center and focus of our life. In addition, we are also reminding ourselves of both the bad things and the blessings that we encounter each day. We tend to focus on the bad things or the negative things in life. By reminding ourselves nightly of the good things that happened during the day, we will be in a better state of mind when we go to bed, and we will be reminding ourselves daily that good things happen to us each day.

The more God is in our life, the more we lose our life. In the context of this passage, to lose our life means that we surrender our will for God's will. We surrender our kingdom for God's kingdom.

Think for a moment about the state of our world. God is allowing us to use our freewill in sinful and selfish ways so that we can clearly see what happens to our life, and to our world, when He is not first in our life. He is permitting this worldwide social experiment. Do you think we have enough data to come to a scientific conclusion about what happens when God and His teachings are ignored, and He is no longer first in the lives of many people in our world? Absolutely.

The percentage of people who are depressed and unhappy continues to increase as the number of people who do not believe in God continues to increase. There is a correlation. With God in our life, we know that we are loved by Him, we can see His love all around us in the beauty of His creation, and we believe that death is the doorway to eternal life in heaven with God. That leads to hope and happiness. Without God in our life, we see this whole universe as an accident, including our own life. That leads to a culture that is not based on love, but on self-centeredness and immoral pleasure, and the result is lots of unhappiness, depression, and despair.

Here's the thing though. We cannot personally stop this worldwide social experiment of living without God. However, we can show others an alternative way to live by putting God first in our life. In Him, we will find an increased capacity and ability to love, and that is exactly what we should want, and what God wants for us. With an increased capacity and ability to love, that should allow us to bring more of God's love into the world, and that is exactly what our world needs.

Church Air Conditioning Good News, Bad News, and Good News

Thank you to those who made generous donations to pay for the new compressor for our huge commercial AC unit on the south side of our church. The cost of the compressor has been covered!! That's the good news. The bad news is that last weekend during the 7pm Saturday Mass, the commercial air conditioning unit for the sanctuary (the raised platform area of our church where the altar is located) began to blow warm air. This past Tuesday we learned that the compressor and a few other things went bad. The cost of that repair is \$2880. If you can help with that, we will greatly appreciate it. The next good news is that the sanctuary AC unit was repaired the next day, Wednesday, and is now blowing cold air again.

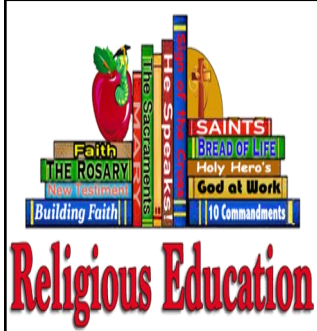

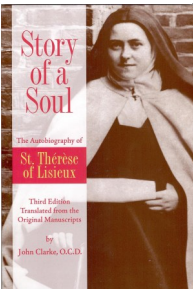
Thank You for a Great Book Club Journey
