18th Sunday in Ordinary Time – YRA 2026

In our Gospel today, the words that Jesus used after receiving the five loaves and two fish are very similar to the words that He used at the Last Supper: In today's Gospel, Jesus (Mt 14:19), "said the blessing, broke the loaves, and gave them to the disciples." At the Last Supper, Jesus (Mt 26:26), "said the blessing, broke it, and giving it to his disciples said..." Thus, the multiplication of the fish and loaves is a foreshadowing of the institution of the Holy Eucharist at the Last Supper. In addition, since God created the universe out of nothing, meaning He gave everything its original nature, then changing the nature of the bread and wine into the nature of God (that is what the prayer of consecration does during Mass), is easy for Him, and so is feeding over 5000 people with only five loaves and two fish.

There's a lot more I can say about that, but today I want to focus on the second reading. As you know, St. Paul was actively persecuting Christians when Jesus appeared to him on the road to Damascus (Acts 9:1-30). In time, he became a great missionary. However, in his travels and experiences as a missionary he frequently encountered great difficulties. He describes some of them in his Second Letter to the Corinthians (2Cor 11:24-28). Let me read that to you.

God created our world such that bad things can happen, and He completely and fully entered into it. St. Paul understands that, and so that is why he can write that anguish, distress, persecution, famine, nakedness, peril, or the sword cannot separate us from the love of Christ (Rom 8:35). No matter the difficulty or hardship, nothing, except death, was going to stop St. Paul from telling people about the love of God he experienced from Jesus. In fact, he was convinced to the core of his being that (Rom 8:38-39), "neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor present things, nor future things, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor any other creature will be able to separate us from the love of God in Jesus Christ our Lord."

Thus, our suffering does not separate us from God, but it unites us with Him. Jesus, who is God Incarnate, the Second Person of the Most Holy Trinity, suffered. We suffer. Thus, we are in this together. God came down from heaven and encountered all of life's difficulties and tragedies. He knows what it is like to be tempted, to be hungry and thirsty, to be completely exhausted, to have a death in the family, to be falsely accused and betrayed, to be mocked, and to be abandoned. He knows what it is like to be tortured, so He knows what it is like to be in tremendous pain. He knows what it is like to die.

We need to be able to speak to people about this who are going through great difficulties. Jesus suffered innocently; St. Paul and all the Apostles endured great difficulties. When we read the lives of the saints, we discover that practically all of them endured great difficulties. Difficulties and tragedies are something everyone encounters including Jesus, the Apostles, the saints, our family members, friends, coworkers, and our neighbors. Thus, we can truthfully say that difficulties and tragedies are something we all have in common. That means difficulties and tragedies are a fact of life on this planet.

From his personal experience, St. Paul was convinced that suffering does not separate us from Jesus, but unites us with Him. Are you convinced of that? If you are not, you will find it difficult to share the Good News to someone who is going through great difficulties. Last week I mentioned that sometimes the most loving thing we can do is to tell someone about Jesus. There comes a time when we need to share the Good News with others.

As Christians, our second reading from chapter eight of St. Paul's Letter to the Romans is a key passage. We do not need to have it memorized, but we need to be able to paraphrase it. It is one of the most powerful passages in the New Testament, and it is very helpful when speaking with people who feel like God is punishing them, or has abandoned them. What gives that passage extra meaning is that we know from chapter eleven of St. Paul's Second Letter to the Corinthians that St. Paul also suffered greatly, so he has personal experience with encountering the love of God during tremendous hardship.

In addition, we need to be able to remind others that Jesus, even though He had never sinned, suffered and died for us. God created our world such that bad things can happen to good people, and He completely entered into our world to pay the price for creating such a world, and He paid the price for our sins. That means God knows what it is like to suffer innocently.

It is clear that God loves us. That is the conclusion we should come to when we gaze and meditate upon a crucifix. "For God so loved the world that he gave his only begotten Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life" John 3:16.

In addition, it should be obvious that God came to die for sinners. Paul describes this clearly (Rom 5:8) when he wrote, "But God shows his love for us in that while we were yet sinners Christ died for us." We know from reading the Gospels that Jesus ate with sinners (Matt 9:11; Mark 2:16; Luke 5:30). While dying on the cross He forgave the good thief (Luke 23:39-43), and He asked the Father to forgive those who were putting Him to death because they didn't know what they were doing (Luke 23:34). He forgave the Apostles for abandoning Him (John 20:19-21), and He forgave Peter for denying three times that he knew Him (John 21:15-19).

God wants us to know that He desires to forgive us when we sin. Why does God want to send that message to us loud and clear? Because even though difficulties and tragedies cannot separate us from God, sin and our refusal to accept God's love and mercy can separate us from Him. One of the most frequent things I hear people say after they confess a grave sin is that they do not know how God can forgive them for what they have done.

Let me tell you how. His love and mercy are infinite. God revealed His infinite love for us by dying for our sins, and He manifests His almighty power, above all, by forgiving us when we repent of our sin (Collect, 26th Sunday in Ordinary Time). Jesus told us about God's love and mercy in the wonderful parable of the Prodigal Son (Luke 15:11-32). In that parable Jesus tells us that if we abandon God with our actions, God does not abandon us. God waits for us to return. In the Parable of the Unforgiving Servant (Mt 18:23-35), we learn that God can forgive an astronomical amount of sins when we repent of them. Can we accept the fact that God loves us, He always has, He always will, and there is nothing we can do to change that fact? If we can accept that, we can share the Good News with others.

You might be asking yourself, "How can I, who know so little, share the Good News of our Lord Jesus Christ with others." First, share what you believe, and what you know. You know that everyone goes through difficulties, and so did Jesus, so our difficulties and tragedies unite us to God rather than separate us from Him. You know that. Share that bit of information.

In addition, you also know that Jesus came to save us from our sins. You believe He died on the cross for us. Thus, you believe that God loves us, and wants to forgive all our sins, not matter how bad they are, as long as we are sorry for our sins, and ask for His forgiveness.

Yes, you can do that. The little bit you know, can accomplish a lot when you do it with God. How do I know that? From today's Gospel. We heard Jesus tell the Apostles, "...give them some food yourselves." They responded, "Five loaves and two fish are all we have here." However, when they gave the food to Jesus, He made it work.

The point is, the little bit we have to give is enough when we place it in the hands of Jesus. With Jesus we can do a lot more than we can imagine. Wonderful things beyond our imagination can be accomplished when we offer God to the little bit we have in order to build His kingdom. There are a lot of people who have an emptiness in them that can only be filled by God. With the help of God, the faith we have, and the scripture we know, we can feed a lot of empty souls.

If your knowledge of scripture is lacking, today is a good day to begin reading the Gospels, and marking up your bible with all your favorite passages. When you find passages that inspire you, highlight them, and/or put a bookmark or post-it on that page. In addition, you need to put a post-it on the pages of your bible where you find today's second reading (Romans 8:35,37-39), and the passage from the Second Letter of St. Paul to the Corinthians (11:24-28) that I read at the beginning of my homily.

God has worked wonders with those who offered what little they had to Him in order to build up the kingdom of heaven. May you step out in courage and faith to share the Good News when the opportunity presents itself. For if you do that, you have united yourself with God in the mission of saving souls.

Religious Education for Children and Adults

Registration for Religious Education will take place after all the Masses on Sunday, August 2 and Sunday, August 9 in the parish hall. These classes are for children (7- 17 years old) who need Baptism, First Confession, First Holy Communion, or Confirmation, or for adults who need any of these Sacraments already listed. For those who cannot register on Sunday, Deacon John will also be available in Rm 102 on Wednesday, August 5 and 12. All registration will take place only on these dates, and then will be closed for this year. A \$5 fee will be charged for each person registered to cover the cost of supplies. In order to register, you will need to be a registered parishioner at St. Margaret Mary and provide the following documentation:

For children (7 years old and up) and adults who need Baptism-

Birth Certificate,

Proof of sponsor's good standing

For children (7 years old and up) and adults who need 1st Confession-

Birth Certificate and Baptism Certificate

For children (8 years old and up) and adults who need 1st Communion/Confirmation-

Baptism Certificate.

Proof of sponsor's good standing

In the past, we have had considerable difficulty getting all the documents in a timely manner. In order to avoid this, it is recommended that parents should pick up a registration packet either in the Parish Office, the Ghipht Shop, or from Rm 102 prior to the dates for registration to help them secure the necessary documents in time. Registration cannot be completed without all documents and no child will attend classes without being registered.
