22nd Sunday in Ordinary Time – YRA 2026

Jesus insists that all His disciples must take up their cross and follow Him. Jesus demands a commitment of faith that is ready to embrace the will of God wherever it leads, even unto death, which is exactly what He did. However, Jesus then promises that all who lose their life by doing the will of God find it. Losing our life means living according to God's will rather than our will, and in doing so, we are on the difficult road to eternal life. In God's way of thinking, saving our life means living it according to our will, or as Frank Sinatra sang, "I did it my way." Living that way, has disastrous implications for our eternal salvation.

Taking up our crosses should bring out the best in us. We are asked to love those we would rather not love; forgive those we would rather not forgive; to be patient when we would rather say or do something unkind; to be generous when we would rather focus on ourself; to do what is right even though it would be very difficult. Taking up those kinds of crosses transforms us into the child of God that we are intended to be, which is exactly why Jesus insists that we take up our crosses.

Jesus understands doing that is difficult, but it is the way to eternal life. Earlier in the Gospel of Matthew, He said, "Enter through the narrow gate; for the gate is wide and the road broad that leads to destruction, and those who enter through it are many. How narrow the gate and constricted the road that leads to life. And those who find it are few." Let me remind you that seven weeks ago we heard Jesus tell us (Matt 11:28), "Come to me, all you who labor and are burdened, and I will give you rest." That means that God is expecting us to ask Him for help with our crosses along the difficult path to heaven. Thus, when life is hard, we should pray this simple prayer: "Lord, help me." In addition, we should also be asking others for help. God does not expect us to go through difficulties alone.

Back to Peter. He rebuked Jesus because the whole idea of Jesus suffering and dying seems utterly unthinkable. Jesus is supposed to conquer the Romans and reign as the new king of Israel. He is not supposed to suffer and die. In return, Peter receives a severe rebuke from Jesus because he is thinking as human beings do rather than as God does. Peter's rebuke of Jesus was not the result of a spiritual insight from God, but the human aversion to suffering. Last weekend, we heard Peter say that Jesus was the "Messiah, the Son of the living God." He received that revelation from God the Father. Because Peter spoke that way, Jesus proclaimed him to be the foundation stone on which the Church would be built. However, when Peter speaks from the result of mere human thinking rather than from God's way of thinking, he is a stone that causes others to stumble.

Peter was not the first, nor the last person to struggle to understand the mind of God. We all tend to view things in human terms. When God asked Jeremiah to warn the Israelites about the coming disaster of the destruction of Jerusalem and the temple, the religious leaders had him arrested and punished. In the midst of his suffering for prophesying what God told him to say, Jeremiah expressed his frustration to God in the words that we heard in our first reading. No, God did not lie to him or mislead him. Jeremiah was using poetic words to describe how he thought his passion and zeal for God would lead to only positive experiences. He did not realize that doing the will of God could bring suffering into your life. As we all know from personal experience, striving to always live according to the will of God is not easy.

Most people have difficulty understanding the mind of God because they have not studied the Gospels. We encounter the mind of God in the teachings of Jesus Christ, and in the teachings of the Church that he founded on the Apostle Peter, the Catholic Church. One of the objectives Jesus had during His three years of public ministry was to reveal the mind of God to us.

Bishop Robert Barron wrote that, "To think in a human manner is to follow an instinct toward self-protection [which leads to selfishness]. To think in the divine manner is to follow an instinct toward self-donation [to give, to love]. The old mind flees from the cross [self-protection], but the new mind seeks it out [self-donation]. Do we want to save our lives, or do we want to give them away? Everything we say and do will be conditioned ultimately by the way in which we answer that fundamental question."

Here are four things that Jesus taught that were different from what the people had believed was true. The people thought the rich were blessed by God, and were living in His friendship. However, Jesus said that it was easier for the camel to pass through an eye of a needle than for the rich to enter the kingdom of heaven (Matt 19:23-25). The people thought the lepers, the lame, the blind, etc. were that way because God was punishing them for their sin. Jesus refuted that (John 9:1-3). By curing the sick, Jesus was clearly demonstrating that God was not angry with them. Jesus' teaching on marriage and divorce, which is exactly what the Catholic Church teaches, was much stricter than what Moses permitted (Matt 19:3-12). The people were expecting the Messiah to be a great military leader who would lead the people to fight against the Romans, and then reestablish the reign of King David. Jesus did not come to establish an earthly kingdom, but a heavenly one. He is fighting against Satan and sin, not the Romans. Human beings cannot prevent us from entering eternal life, but sin and Satan can.

It is very easy for us to slip into human ways of thinking when we are trying to solve some of the major problems in our world and in our country because we are looking for a political solution for those problems when there isn't one. Our world and our country are going in the wrong direction not mainly for the lack of good political leadership, but for a rejection of God's leadership and direction.

Politics is a secular way of governing society. Thus, there is no way politics can return this nation to be under the guidance of God. Therefore, stop looking for a savior for this country to come from a political party. Politicians will always leave us frustrated. Voting is an important part of being a citizen of this nation. However, for a Catholic Christian, that is not enough because the solution to our nation's problems is more spiritual than political because the problem is more spiritual than political. When God is rejected, then our world becomes less heavenly, and more hellish. We are in a spiritual battle more so than a political battle.

Our Savior has already come, and His name is Jesus Christ. If you are concerned about the direction this country is going, and you have been trying to change the direction of this country by only using our democratic system of government, then you are thinking more like an atheist than a Catholic. A politician cannot save us, only God can. The answer to many of the problems of our country will be found in the teachings of Jesus Christ and the Holy Catholic Church. If you want our nation to be one nation under God, then we all must resolve to live according to the teachings of Jesus Christ and the Holy Catholic Church. The Catholic Church always wants us to pursue the truth, and the truth will always lead us to God (Jesus is the way, the truth and the life, John 14:6).

We cannot change our country by rejecting the moral teachings of the Catholic Church. It is not logical to be frustrated by the increased sin and disorder in our country, and at the same time reject the moral teachings of the Catholic Church. Logically, the response to all the sin and disorder in our country, should be an increased focus on love, mercy, and virtue.

We need to do something, and that something is holiness of life. Our weapon is our deeply held Catholic faith. It's time to begin living like a saint. It's time to seriously look at what immoral and sinful things we have allowed into our lives: pornography, foul language, fornication, lust, overeating, drunkenness, laziness, envy, jealousy, gossip, judgementalism, unforgiveness, deep seated anger, disrespectful behavior, etc.

If we are honest, we will admit that we have been one of the reasons why our country is going in the wrong direction because our own lives have not given witness to the fact that we are Christians. Too many Christians have bought into the lies of our culture, and think the Catholic Church is too old fashioned. Virtue and morality are as old as God Himself. Being old fashioned in that sense is the narrow and difficult road to heaven.

Our nation needs Catholics whose lives witness to the dignity of every human person, whose love bridges division, whose courage resists hatred, and whose faith insists that despair does not have the final word. The saints and countless others throughout time responded to God's call amid turmoil, uncertainty, and division. They remind us that hope is not optimism; it is fidelity. Hope is the quiet conviction that God is at work even when we cannot see the path ahead (this paragraph is from *In Charity & Truth: Toward a Renewed Political Culture*, a pastoral letter from Archbishop William E. Lori).

Forty years ago, Poland saved their country from the tyranny of communism by being more Catholic, not less Catholic. If there is no moral foundation of society, then we are building our society on the sand of the latest trends and fashions. Instead, we need to build our nation on the solid ground of the teachings of our Lord Jesus Christ (Matt 7:24-27), and the Church He founded, the Holy Catholic Church, which, with the help of God, is supposed to be a beacon of truth, faith, love, mercy, and virtue for all the world to see.

Too often we are thinking as human beings do rather than as God does. If we want the world to change, we need to resolve to do a much better job living our Catholic Christian faith. It will not be easy. It will be very hard. However, it is worth it. Let me close with the wise words we heard from St. Paul in our second reading (Rom 12:2): "Do not conform yourselves to this age but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that you may discern what is the will of God, what is good and pleasing and perfect." And then may God grant us the grace and the courage to live that way.

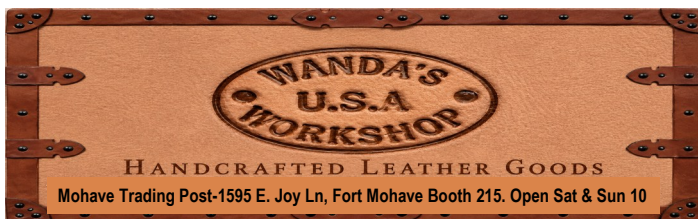
