24th Sunday in Ordinary Time – YRA 2026

We just heard an amazing statement about God's capacity to forgive. The Gospel of Matthew was written in Greek. In the English translation, the passage tells us that the first servant owed "a huge amount." However, in the Greek the amount is 10,000 talents. A talent was equivalent to about 6,000 denarii, and a denarius is equal to one day's wage for a common laborer. So, one talent is about 20 years of wages for a laborer, which means this servant owes 200,000 years of wages.

Let's put that in today's dollars. Let's say a laborer earns \$16.50 an hour, so in a 40-hour week that is \$660. There are 52 weeks in a year, so in one year that is \$34,320. Multiply that by 20 years, and the result is \$686,400. Thus, in today's dollars, one talent is \$686,400, and this servant owed 10,000 talents, which is equivalent to \$6,864,000,000.

How is someone earning \$16.50 an hour going to pay a debt of over almost seven billion dollars? He can't. It's impossible, and that is Jesus' point in the parable. Jesus is telling us that if we could pack 200,000 years of sins into one lifetime, and then sincerely repent and ask God to forgive us, He will. God's mercy far exceeds our capacity to sin because His mercy is infinite.

The servant who was forgiven that astronomical debt encountered a servant who owed him a much smaller amount. In the Greek, the amount is 100 denarii. That is the equivalent of 100 days of wages. In current dollars for a common laborer earning \$16.50 an hour, or \$132 a day, 100 days of wages is \$13,200. The first servant was forgiven a debt of almost seven billion dollars, and then he refuses to forgive a \$13,200 debt. Of course, his master is outraged.

The message communicated in this parable is that God's mercy is infinite, and He is willing to forgive all of our sins when we sincerely repent. Add up all the sins we have committed in our lifetime, and will commit in the future, and that is a huge amount. God is willing to forgive it all. Now, God is willing to forgive all of those sins, so do we see the injustice when we do not forgive that one really big sin someone committed against us? We are refusing to allow the mercy we have received from God to flow through us to others. We are hoarding God's gift of mercy for ourselves, and the result is less mercy in the world. We expect God to forgive everything we have done in our lifetime. However, God expects us to forgive everybody who has sinned against us. When we refuse to forgive someone for the one thing they did to us, we are that unforgiving servant in that parable. Ouch!

In fact, in the Our Father we pray that God "forgives us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us." We are praying that God will forgive us exactly like we forgive others. And then following the Our Father in the Gospel of Matthew is this statement from Jesus: "If you forgive others their transgressions, your heavenly Father will forgive you. But if you do not forgive others, neither will your Father forgive your transgressions" (Matt 6:14-15).

Jesus is clear, refusing to forgive will keep us out of heaven. That is different from having difficulty forgiving someone. We turn to God for help in that case. If we die still trying to forgive someone, and we have been constantly praying to God for help to do that, then God will allow us to finish the forgiveness process in Purgatory. However, if someone stubbornly refuses to forgive someone up until the time of their death, they have chosen to be separated from God for all eternity. They were like the unforgiving servant in today's parable.

Let me share two images about forgiveness that I hope are helpful. The first comes from the comic strip *Rose is Rose* that I saw some years ago. In the first panel, Rose is sitting in a dungeon with a ball and chain attached to her ankle. She is angry, and there is a dark cloud over her head. In the second panel, the dark cloud has been replaced with the word "Sigh." In the third panel, the dark dungeon has been replaced by a happy place with a rainbow, birds and butterflies. Her ball and chain are gone and she is dancing with a big smile on her face. In the fourth panel Rose is standing in front of her husband who is reading the newspaper, and she is telling him, "Well, it wasn't easy, but I have decided to forgive you." Who really benefitted from the forgiveness? Rose or her husband? It was Rose who had herself in a prison of unforgiveness. A prison of her own making. That's what unforgiveness does. It puts us in a prison of our own making. Forgiveness sets us free.

The second is a true story about an event that a priest witnessed some years ago. He was scuba diving in the Bahamas. When he arrived at the dock there was a large yacht tied to the pier. The yacht tried to pull away from the dock, but someone had neglected to untie one of the lines on the back of the yacht. Rather than checking to see why the yacht was not moving, the captain revved the engines and in doing so, pulled free of the dock, but left a portion of the back of the yacht still attached to the line firmly secured to the dock.

The yacht was large and powerful, but something was holding it back, something was causing it to destroy itself. That's what hatred and unforgiveness does. It destroys us. By holding on to the anger and the unforgiveness, we are allowing the person who hurt us, to keep on hurting us. That does not make any sense. Forgiveness is a gift we give ourselves. Hanging on to unforgiveness does not harm the person who hurt us, it harms ourselves and makes us angry, bitter, and miserable. Who wants us in a prison of anger, bitterness, and misery? The evil one. Who wants to set us free? Jesus. Thus, forgiveness does not change our past, but it does change our future.

Remember, forgiveness does not mean that you have to become friends with the person, and that you have to be okay with what happened. That is not forgiveness. What happened probably was not okay. Forgiveness means we will give all judgment to God, and we move on with our life. That's freedom. Let God take care of the judgement, and we move on with our life.

Let me remind you of a few things I said last week. The possibility remains that the person who sinned against us did it on purpose, and has no intention of apologizing or changing their behavior. If their behavior continues to be harmful and hurtful, you might need to keep your distance. In addition, you must pray for that person. Yes, Jesus is clear that we pray for those who persecute us. That is logical. We want them to stop doing things on purpose that hurt other people. We want them to be converted.

Our world has a severe lack of mercy, love, patience, and gentleness, especially on social media. It is the duty of all the Christians on social media to be a good example for others to follow. If Christians are not modeling for others how to forgive, then who will? Do not add to the ugliness and the meanness in our world. That puts us on the same team as the evil one. Christians offer love, forgiveness and mercy where there is division and anger. Christians offer others an experience of God's love and mercy.

Jesus revealed to us the infinite love and mercy of God, and at the same time clearly taught that our life is to be guided and molded by love and mercy. Remember, we are created in the image and likeness of God, so we are supposed to image the love and mercy of God. Our world is broken and wounded. We all can see that clearly. The world needs Christ. However, God arranged things such that we are supposed to be instruments of the love and mercy of God to the world. Well, are we?

Also remember that God is Holy. We are called to image that too. All of our Lord's teachings have the goal of making us more like heavenly creatures than earthly creatures because our ultimate destination is heaven. Jesus wants us to begin living now like a heavenly creature. It is easier for Jesus to work through us when we strive for holiness of life because it is less likely that our sin will get in the way.

In speaking with St. Faustina, Jesus told her (*Diary of St. Faustina*, 723), "The greater the sinner, the greater the right he has to my mercy." Why do the worst sinners have the greatest right to God's mercy? Because they need it the most. Are we willing to be vessels of that mercy? In our first reading, we heard a beautiful exhortation to do that. Let me share with you two others, both from the New Testament.

"Do not conform yourself to this age but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that you may discern what is the will of God, what is good and pleasing and perfect...Let love be sincere, hate what is evil, hold on to what is good, love one another with mutual affection; anticipate one another in showing honor...Rejoice in hope, endure in affliction, persevere in prayer...Bless those who persecute you, bless and do not curse them...Do not repay anyone evil for evil; be concerned for what is noble in the sight of all. If possible, on your part, live at peace with all...If your enemy is hungry, feed him; if he is thirsty, give him something to drink...Do not be conquered by evil, but conquer evil with good" Romans (12:2,9-10,12,14,17-18,20a,21).

"But to you who hear I say, love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who mistreat you...Do to others as you would have them do to you. For if you love those who love you, what credit is that to you? Even sinners love those who love them. And if you do good to those who love you, what credit is that to you? Even sinners do the same...But rather, love your enemies and do good to them, and lend expecting nothing back; then your reward will be great and you will be children of the Most High for He himself is kind to the ungrateful and the wicked. Be merciful, just as your Father is merciful" Luke (6:27-28,31-33,35-36).

May God grant us an abundance of love and mercy, even toward those that have sinned against us, so that we might be people of forgiveness and reconciliation. People who are merciful like our Father in heaven is merciful.
