

Exaltation of the Cross – 2025

It was another tough week with both the assassination of Charlie Kirk in Utah and a school shooting in Colorado on Wednesday, and Thursday was the 24th anniversary of the 9/11 attacks on this country. There is a temptation to give up, and say "I'm done with this world," and fall into despair and hopelessness. That is the exact response that the evil one wants. He wants us to self-medicate with alcohol, drugs, pornography, gambling, binge shopping, binge eating, etc. By doing that we are not bringing the love and mercy of God into the world, and that means God has even less of a presence in our world at the exact time that we need more of it.

A few weeks ago in our gospel passage, we heard Jesus tell us that we need to strive along the narrow path to the kingdom of God. It is work to love our enemies. It is work to resist the temptation to give up on the world. It is the work we each need to do. This hard work is part of the spiritual warfare we are in against the forces of evil and darkness.

A week ago, I watched on YouTube the video "Bishop Barron Presents Arthur Brooks: Love Your Enemy."

About 20 years ago, Arthur Brooks wrote a book that became popular. However, he received a lengthy email from someone who criticized it. When he began reading the email his stomach was in knots, but then he realized that the person read his entire book. He replied to the email by writing that the book was two years of hard work, and he thanked the person for reading every word of it. About 15 minutes later, the person who wrote the lengthy critical email replied, "If you are ever in Dallas, TX, look me up and let's have dinner." Arthur Brooks' kind email changed an adversarial communication into a polite and kind conversation. Patience and kindness really do bring healing.

Last Sunday two new saints were canonized, Pier Giorgio Frassati and Carlo Acutis. Pier was 24 years old when he died in 1925, and Carlo was 15 years old when in died in 2006. While they were alive, no one knew them outside of their family, parish, and town. They lived the Catholic faith and impacted many people. They didn't change the world, only their small part of it. That is what we Christians are called to do. The Christians here in Bullhead City are supposed to bring God's love and mercy to this town, the Christians in Laughlin will do that in their town, the Christians in Needles will do that in theirs, as will the Christians in Kingman, and the Christians in Lake Havasu City, and so on and so on. That is how the world will change. Each Christian living according to the teachings of Jesus Christ every day. God wants our hearts converted so that we can bring His love and mercy into the world. By coming to Mass every weekend, going to Confession frequently, having a strong and deep prayer life, living our faith everywhere we go, we can make a difference here in Bullhead City. When we do not live our faith, we are standing on the sidelines instead of engaging in this battle against the powers of evil and darkness.

Jesus entered into this fallen world to fight against those powers of evil and darkness. His victory over those powers was accomplished on the cross. Jesus, the light of the world, shines in the darkness. The crucifix reminds us of that, and also reminds us that (John 3:16), "God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who

believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life."

The Romans used crucifixion to punish, humiliate, and to instill fear. The threat of crucifixion was enough to keep most people from rebelling against the authority of the Romans. It was a horrible way to die. Death by crucifixion was not swift. It was agonizingly and torturously slow. You had nails or spikes driven through both hands and both feet to attach you to the cross. As excruciatingly painful as that was, it was not enough to immediately kill you. You eventually died by being too weak to breathe. When you are crucified, you can't take a deep breath because of the way you are crucified on the cross. In order to take a deep breath, you have to push up with your feet, and that was very painful. All you can do is breathe very shallow breaths, so eventually you suffocate on the cross. Yes, the threat of crucifixion kept most people from rebelling against the authority of the Romans.

As I mentioned a few weeks ago, one of the most common topics in the Gospels is judgment. God cannot make us follow Him. However, God wants us in heaven with Him. In the crucifixion, God is begging us and pleading with us. He died for us to get our attention to show us that He isn't trying to make life miserable for us, but trying to get us to use our freewill to choose Him over the other possibility. The other possibility is to reject God, and to be eternally separated from Him. How terrible must eternal separation be if God is willing to be crucified to show His love for us? How terrible must sin be if God must die on the cross? How great must God's love for us be if He is willing to die an

excruciating, torturous death on the cross for our sins?

We exalt the cross because God demonstrates that He loves us with a love that is beyond anything we can imagine. God is not trying to enslave us with His commands and teachings. He is trying to set us free from our slavery to our self-centered and pleasure-centered tendencies. Those tendencies lead us to misery. Love exists and thrives when we think about others rather than ourselves. Love exists and thrives when we are willing to sacrifice everything for someone else. There is no greater love than to give your life for another (John 15:13), and God proved His love for us by dying on the cross. We exalt the cross because we clearly see God's love for us.

Every time we sin, we are rebelling against the commands and teachings of God, and His love. Our rebellion is not logical. He is trying to set us free, and we delve deeper and deeper into sinful activities that further enslave us. We misuse the freewill that God has given us because we are seduced by the pleasure of sinful activity. We fall into that ancient trap of thinking that life is better if we sometimes ignore how God has taught us to live.

The biggest rebel against God's authority is Satan, and he hates the crucifix. The crucifix is always part of an exorcism because the devil hates to look upon it. Jesus humbly submitted to crucifixion and the plan for the salvation of sinful humanity, but Satan refused to submit to God's plan and was driven out of heaven. By displaying several

crucifixes in our homes, we Catholics make our homes very uncomfortable for anything that is evil.

We exalt the cross because God was willing to endure tremendous pain for us. Would you die for a drug addict, a thief, a murderer, a married person who cheats on their spouse, a man addicted to pornography, a bigot, etc.? Would you die for someone you find morally offensive? Would you die for the person who has greatly sinned against you? God would, and in fact, He did.

The crucifixion wasn't something that caught Jesus by surprise. He was born, so that He would die for us. Dying for us sinners was what God had in mind. It was all part of God's plan. We see that plan from His birth.

One of the gifts of the magi was myrrh. Myrrh was used to cover up the stench of death. In fact, in the Gospel of John (19:39-40), we read that Nicodemus brought a mixture of myrrh and aloes to the burial of Jesus. Imagine giving a mother of a newborn a gift card to a mortuary. That is how startling the gift of myrrh is. This isn't a normal baby. That baby born in Bethlehem had a mission: to conquer death and defeat sin, and the only way to do that was to die.

So, this was all part of God's plan. God has been thinking about us and planning for our salvation for a very long time. Have you ever thought of that? God is thinking about us! God knows us. How well does God know us? This statement of Jesus is recorded in Matthew 10:29-31: "Are not two sparrows sold for a penny? And not one of them will fall to the ground without your Father's will. But even the hairs of your head are numbered. Fear not, therefore; you are of more value than many sparrows." In other words, each of us is precious in the eyes of God. Each of us is worth dying for. No one is ever forgotten by God.

That is one of the components of the Good News. Each person is loved by God, and no one is forgotten. How do I know that? Once again, we go to the bible. Listen to this from the Gospel of John (5:25): "Truly, truly, I say to you, the hour is coming, and now is, when the dead will hear the voice of the Son of God, and those who hear will live."

What happened to all the human beings who lived and died on this planet before Jesus walked on it? They were all in the place of the dead. Remember what we say in the Apostles Creed? After Jesus died, He descended to the dead. God had not forgotten about them. They needed to have the Good News preached to them too. The only way to get there was to die. The only way to rescue them was to undergo the same death they did. That was all part of God's plan. God never forgot about those who had died, and never had the chance to hear the Good News preached to them. So, what was Jesus doing between the time of his death, and his resurrection, He was preaching the Good News to the dead!

No one is ever forgotten by God. No one is ever forsaken by God. That is Good News! That, my brothers and sisters, is one more reason why we celebrate the Exaltation of the Cross! That is why the cross has been transformed from a symbol of Roman brutality into a symbol of God's love for us. And that is why we Catholics will never get rid of our crucifixes.

Oatman Driveways Construction Alert

The permits from the town have been approved, and the contractor is ready to begin working on the driveways to our parking lot from Oatman Road. They will work on one driveway at a time, and the driveway they work on each week will not be open for the weekend in order to allow the concrete to cure as much as possible before a lot traffic drives on it. So, for the next two weekends only one of the two driveways will be open on Oatman Road. The driveway to Booster will remain open. We are sorry for the inconvenience. The money for this project is coming from the estate of a deceased parishioner that was generously given to our parish last year, and the proceeds of the Fiesta Dinner on Saturday September 27th at 6pm.


