Most of this homily will be about helping those in need. However, there are two other important teachings contained in the parable of Lazarus and the rich man. First, God judges us upon our death, so there are consequences for how we choose to live. We do not automatically go to heaven. The call to repentance that is part of the proclamation of the Gospel and the Kingdom of God brings with it severe judgement for those who hear it and reject it.

Second, miracles do not convert every heart. Some people remain skeptical and indifferent about God after witnessing something that defies human reason, including someone rising from the dead. Jesus cured hundreds, if not thousands of people, yet many people chose not to believe. Listen to this from the Gospel of Matthew (11:20-22): "Then [Jesus] began to upbraid the cities where most of his mighty works were done, because they did not repent. 'Woe to you Chorazin! Woe to you Bethsaida! For if the mighty works done in you had been done in Tyre and Sidon, they would have repented long ago in sackcloth and ashes. But I tell you, it will be more tolerable on the day of judgement for Tyre and Sidon than for you."

Jesus raised his friend Lazarus from the dead, yet there were people who responded to that miracle by wanting to kill Lazarus (John 12:9-11): "When the great crowd of Jews learned that [Jesus was in Bethany], they came not only on account of Jesus but also to see Lazarus, whom he had raised from the dead. So, the chief priests planned to put Lazarus to death, because on account of him many of the Jews were going away and believing in Jesus."

Miracles gather crowds, but they seldom lead to the conversion of heart that Jesus seeks. Many people try to explain away the miracle of the dancing of the sun at Fatima on October 13, 1917, but they can't explain away the sudden drying of everything that had been soaked by the rain that morning. Large crowds gathered in Cario, Egypt when the Blessed Virgin Mary appeared there in 1968, but that did not result in large conversions to Christianity.

Those whose hearts are hardened by greed, lust, or other sins can always find a way to explain a miracle away. That happened at the time of Jesus, and it happens today. Acts of kindness, love, and mercy have converted more hearts than miracles. That means we need to be actively looking for opportunities to bring the love and mercy of God to the world, especially the poor.

A few thoughts about helping the poor in our area. It can be difficult to know what to do to help the poor, so here are a few suggestions. Bring nonperishable food items with you to church on a regular basis, and place the food in the donation bin in our narthex, or bring it to our office. In addition, donate all your used household items to the St. Vincent de Paul store. The money their store makes goes to financial support for the poor. Give some thought and prayer to volunteer at the St. Vincent de Paul store, or in the kitchen at the homeless shelter down the street. The money placed in the poor box next to the front doors is used to help the poor in our area.

In our first reading, speaking through the prophet Amos, God is rebuking the royal family and the wealthy in Jerusalem. They were living in comfort and leisure while their fellow Israelites to their north were losing a battle against the Assyrian army who would eventually take them to exile in Assyria, never to return. Like the rich man in our gospel passage, the wealthy in Jerusalem had no concern for those in need. Thus, Amos said that they will share the same fate as their northern cousins. And so, it happened. About 125 years later, the Babylonians invaded Judea and exiled the people, beginning with the wealthy.

In our second reading, St. Paul is exhorting Timothy, a young bishop in Ephesus (in present day Turkey), to "Compete well for the faith." Living our faith is hard work at times, and since we do not automatically go to heaven when we die, we need to live the faith, not just agree with it. Specifically, St. Paul exhorts Timothy to "...pursue righteousness, devotion, faith, love, patience, and gentleness." It appears that the rich man in our gospel passage was not practicing those virtues. Living them should lead us to be mindful of those in need.

For the people of the first century, the parable of the rich man and Lazarus was good news for the poor and bad news for the rich. In the thinking of the people of the first century, the rich man should have been with father Abraham, and Lazarus should have been in the netherworld. The rich were believed to be rich because they were blessed by God, and those who were destitute, blind, lame, etc. were thought to be that way because they were being punished by God for their sins.

The parable is also a warning about the sins of omission. What sins did the rich man commit that caused him to be sent to the netherworld when he died: murder, stealing, adultery, coveting his neighbor's possessions? The parable does not mention that he was a terrible sinner. So why is he in the netherworld? For not being a man of love, patience, and gentleness with the poor. For doing nothing. For not seeing with eyes of mercy.

Jesus said the same thing in the parable of the separation of the sheep from the goats (Mt 25:31-46): "Amen, I say to you, what you did not do for one of these least ones, you did not do for me. And these will go off to eternal punishment, but the righteous to eternal life." Jesus is clear, there are ultimately two options when we die, eternal punishment or eternal reward. We do not automatically go to heaven. Doing nothing to help those in need, when we are able, demonstrates a lack of love for neighbor, and Jesus clearly teaches that being so greedy and self-centered that we do nothing for those in need will put us on that path to eternal punishment

In the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus said (Mt 7:12): "Do to others whatever you would have them do to you." That was different than another rule the people of the first century had been taught (Tobit 4:15; Sirach 31:15), "Whatever you dislike, do not do to others." The first rule tells us to do good things. The second rule tells us to avoid bad things. We need to live by both rules. We need to avoid evil, and to do good. Avoiding evil and sin is not enough. We must also do good things for our neighbor. To love neighbor includes both doing good things for our neighbor, and refraining from doing bad things to them.

We should strive to see with eyes of mercy. When we do that, we are less likely to judge those who need help. Some people get into financial difficulties because of huge medical expenses, or their salary is not keeping up with inflation or the gas prices, or they have had an extended period of unemployment or underemployment.

It is true that sometimes those who need financial help have made some bad choices that got them into financial difficulties. God does not shield us from the consequences of our actions so that the negative consequences become an incentive to avoid whatever got us into trouble in the first place. So, yes, it becomes frustrating when some people make the same mistakes over and over again, and as a result, are constantly asking for help. In those cases, be careful that you aren't constantly "bailing them out." When we do that, we can actually prevent them from learning from their mistakes. Give them what they need, not what they want. This can be a difficult thing to do when the person who needs help is a member of our family. There is a difference between enabling and helping.

To see with eyes of mercy, is to help someone, but not enable them to continue to make the same bad choices over and over again. To see with eyes of mercy is to avoid judging those who need financial help because we don't know their entire story. To see with the eyes of mercy is to try to be more aware of those around us who may need our help. It is hard to see with eyes of mercy when we get so caught up in the problems of the world, and the difficulties, and the busyness of our

own lives that we do not see those around us who could use our help.

Our world, country, city, neighborhoods, families, and our lives can certainly use a lot more righteousness, devotion, faith, love, patience, and gentleness. That is clear to all of us. Instead of focusing on what is wrong with the world, we need to do an examination of our lives to see where we are lacking in righteousness, devotion, faith, love, patience, and gentleness. The more those things are in our life, then the more those things are in our world, country, city, neighborhoods, and families. The evil one does not want us to work on becoming a better person, he wants us focused on what's wrong with the world, because if we are focused on what is wrong with the world, we won't do the necessary examination of our lives so that we can work on becoming the child of God that God wants us to be. The child of God that God wants us to be includes being loving, patient, and gentle towards the poor and those who are in need.

If you cannot financially help someone in need, pray for them. Our prayers make a difference, so please pray for those who are affected by natural disasters, those who live paycheck to paycheck, those who are living in war zones, and those who have fled war and our now living in refugee camps. When we pray for those who suffer like that, then we are

seeing with eyes of mercy.

We are not saved by our good deeds. Jesus' death on the cross did that for us. However, our prayers and our good deeds for those who are in need are proof of our conversion, love, mercy, and proof that we want to live the Christian life. We truly live the Christian life when we bring the love and mercy of God to those who most desperately need it. May we not be blind to those who truly need to encounter the love and mercy of God working through us, and may our Lord Jesus Christ help us to see like He does, for He sees with eyes of mercy.
