23rd Sunday in Ordinary Time – YRA 2026

Let me repeat what we heard a little while ago in today's second reading (Romans 13:10), "Love does no evil to the neighbor; hence, love is the fulfillment of the law." And in last Sunday's second reading we heard St. Paul tell us (Romans 12:1-2), "...offer your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God, your spiritual worship. Do not conform yourselves to this age but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that you may discern what is the will of God, what is good and pleasing and perfect."

To pursue what is good and pleasing and perfect is to truly live the commandment to love our neighbor. Our good behavior, our virtue, benefits those who come in contact with us. Hence, it is obvious that to love our neighbor means we want to be a virtuous person. A basic definition of love is that love desires the good of the other. Let's go through a couple of examples of what love is, and what it isn't.

Looking at the cross, we see clearly that love sometimes means sacrifice. At times, love requires us to do something that is difficult, but will benefit and help other people. For example, using some of our income to help a family member pay a medical bill, or moving an elderly parent into your home to take care of them, or giving up a day of fun at the river in order to sit with a neighbor in the emergency room.

The virtue of chastity is an act of love because it desires the good of purity. Hence, to tell someone "If you love me, you will have sex with me," is to tell someone a lie. The person who says that is not saying a loving thing, but a self-centered, selfish, and lustful thing. It is sin to ask someone to prove their love for you, by manipulating them to do something you want. Single women, if you say "no" to sex, and the guy breaks up with you, then you found out sooner rather than later that he had no interest in you. He only wanted to use you for sex.

Pornography teaches people to lust rather than love. It trains people to see a human being not as a child of God, but as an object for self-pleasure. Lust is not love. We should love people and use things, not love things and use people. Pornography is addictive, teaches us to use people, and normalizes the sin of lust, so stay away from it. If you are married, pornography is a form of adultery.

Love also compels us to avoid telling others when we see or hear someone doing something unkind. Imagine telling a group of friends about the unkind thing you saw or heard. However, unknown to us, that person who said or did that unkind thing regretted doing it. It could be later that day, or a few days, a week, or a month later. The person says to God, "I'm not sure what came over me. I'm not sure what I was thinking. I'm sorry for doing that. Please forgive me Lord." If that person is Catholic, they also confess that sin.

Thus, when we see someone at their worst, we demonstrate our love for them by praying for them, by not gossiping about them, judging them, or writing about them on social media. We do not want people talking about our worst moments, so we should not talk about theirs. That's the Golden Rule (Matt 7:12). Jesus said, "Do unto others as you would have them do unto you." It is one of the basic premises of Christian morality. We treat other people the way we want them to treat us. We do not want others to gossip about us when they see us at our worst, so neither should we.

If we are chatting with a group of people and realize that the conversation has turned into gossip, then quietly pray to the Holy Spirit for a good idea to change the topic of the conversation. If a good idea does not come, we politely excuse ourselves from the conversation and walk away. Workplaces can be filled with gossip. Avoid getting caught up in it. Change the conversation or walk away. If something is happening that is negatively affecting the workplace, speak with the supervisor. That is more difficult than gossiping, but it is the right thing to do.

Let me summarize a few things from the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* (#2477-2478). We are guilty of the sin of rash judgement when we assume as true, without sufficient reason, the moral fault of someone. We are guilty of the sin of detraction (which we often call gossip) when we reveal another person's faults to a third person without a valid reason. It becomes a mortal sin when we do grave harm to someone's reputation. We are guilty of the sin of calumny when we purposely say something that we know is untrue about someone. It is a mortal sin. We should be careful to interpret insofar as possible our neighbor's thoughts, words, and deeds in a favorable way. If we cannot find a favorable way of judging what happened, then that is when we need to have a private conversation with them as our Lord described in today's gospel passage.

In my opinion, today's Gospel passage is one of the most ignored passages in the Bible. When someone does something to hurt us, do we post a very detailed message on social media about how mean and inconsiderate that person is, and tell everyone we know what happened? That is not what Jesus instructed us to do. He said (Matt 18:15), "If your brother sins against you, go and tell him his fault between you and him alone." How many times have we done that? If we believe that Jesus is God, then we will do our best to follow all His teachings, including this one. When someone sins against us, we have to avoid the temptation of telling everyone we know what happened.

Gossip is how the evil one infiltrates church ministries to ruin them. Gossip never solves any problems, so why do we do it? It feels good. It is a dark joy, but the evil one is present in those situations and is enjoying himself immensely. If there is a problem in a parish ministry that is not resolved by speaking privately with the person, then bring someone along who knows the situation the second time you speak with the person, and if that does not work, then speak with me. That is the biblical approach.

Sometimes people do not know that what they did hurt us. About 15 years ago, I was standing outside greeting people after daily Mass. One individual walked past without saying anything to me. I thought nothing of it. I assumed that person was in a hurry. The same thing happened the next day, and when it happened again the day after that I said to the person, "Is something wrong?" The person said to me, "You should know." Well, I had no idea what it was that I was supposed to know, so I motioned for the person to come back, and I asked what I had done. I was told that I used a tone of voice that offended that person. I had no idea. I had not intentionally used a tone of voice to offend that person. Had that person said something to me as Jesus describes in today's Gospel, I would have had the opportunity to apologize. However, because I had no idea that I had done something wrong, I would have never apologized since I was oblivious that I had done something wrong. That poor person was never going to receive an apology from me because I had no idea there was something to apologize for. Thus, we cannot assume that the person who has sinned against us knows that they have done something wrong.

Jesus' teaching on the steps we should take to bring reconciliation to a situation are straight forward. However, it is also difficult because too often our mindset is to confront the person. Our mindset instead should be one of healing and reconciliation. When we approach the person who has sinned against us, we must approach them with humility. We are a sinner too. If we approach the person with anger and demand an apology, we probably won't get very far. Ask yourself, how would you like someone to approach you when you have done something unintentional to hurt someone? That's our starting point for approaching someone who has sinned against us. We approach them the same way we would want someone to approach us when we need to receive correction. Do it calmly and humbly, approaching them as a fellow sinner. We need to be able to humbly give correction and to humbly receive it. We especially need to humbly receive correction about how we behave in our worst moments.

Yes, the possibility remains that the person who sinned against us did it on purpose, and has no intention of apologizing or changing their behavior. Jesus said to treat such people as you would a Gentile or tax collector. How did Jesus treat Gentiles and tax collectors? He told us that we are to love our enemies and pray for those who persecute us (Matt 5:43-48). The love that Jesus is talking about is not the kind of love with warm fuzzy feelings. It is the kind of love that St. Paul describes: Love is patient and kind (1Cor 13:4). Be patient and kind with them.

If their behavior continues to be harmful and hurtful, you might need to keep your distance. In addition, you must pray for the person. That is logical and biblical. We want them to stop doing things on purpose that hurt other people. We want them to be converted. Here's a prayer that I suggest for such a situation: "Lord, help him/her become the child of God you know he/she can be, and help me become the child of God you know that I can be." Since we are not perfect ourselves, we must also pray for our own conversion.

That brings us back to today's second reading (Rom 13:10): "Love does no evil to the neighbor; hence, love is the fulfillment of the law." Love assumes the best about others, and seeks reconciliation. The process that Jesus described in today's gospel is a process based upon love. Even if reconciliation does not happen, love demands that we pray for their conversion and our conversion. May God grant us an abundance of love, especially toward those that have sinned against us, so that we might be people of reconciliation who truly love our neighbor as ourselves as we strive to do what is good and pleasing and perfect.

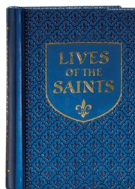

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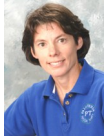
