The Letter of St. Paul to Philemon has only 25 verses. You can read it in a few minutes. It appears that Onesimus is a slave who ran away from his master, Philemon, and it also appears that Paul has converted Onesimus to Christianity. Since Philemon and Onesimus are now brothers in Christ, Paul is requesting Philemon to treat Onesimus as a brother in Christ rather than as a slave. Being brothers in Christ should transcend their relationship as master and slave.

The letter is addressed to Philemon and to all the Christians who gathered at his home. That means the letter would have been read out loud, and all the Christians gathered there would know that Paul is requesting that Onesimus be treated as a brother rather than a slave. Thus, it would be difficult for Philemon to turn down Paul's request, and that is probably Paul's intention.

The first verse of our first reading asks a good question: "Who can know God's counsel, or who can conceive what the LORD intends?" Then the next few verses admit that because of our sins, we have a tendency to make bad decisions. Thus, it would be tremendously helpful if God would share some of His infinite wisdom with

us because we cannot discern it by ourselves.

Chapter 55 from the Book of Isaiah is one of the most beautiful in all of the Old Testament. Here are two verses from that chapter as God speaks to the people through the prophet Isaiah (Isaiah 55: 8-9): "For my thoughts are not your thoughts, nor are your ways my ways, says the LORD. As high as the heavens are above the earth, so high are my ways above your ways and my thoughts above your thoughts." Please, God, share some of those thoughts with us. We sinners need your guidance and direction because we do not have access to your mind.

St. Paul makes a similar statement in his First Letter to the Corinthians, and then reminds us that God has already accomplished that (1Cor 2:16): "For who has known the mind of the Lord so as to instruct him? But we have the mind of Christ." Divine wisdom is beyond the grasp of human understanding and can be known by us humans only if it is revealed to us by God Himself, and so that is what God did. He became one of us to speak directly to us. Jesus Christ, God incarnate, the second person of the Most Holy Trinity, walked among us, and the Gospels record His teachings and His miracles.

Bombarded as we are by the ways of the world on the internet, social media, and television, we Christians must read the Gospels so that we know the ways and the thoughts of God. The world offers us its thoughts and ways which are tainted with sin, selfishness, and greed, and leave us miserable, empty, and hopeless. God offers us His infinite wisdom to lead us to eternal life in heaven. Who are we listening to?

Which brings us to today's gospel passage. Did we hear Jesus correctly? "If anyone comes to me without hating his father, and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters, and even his own life, he cannot be my disciple." Is Jesus contradicting the commandment to honor father and mother? Is Jesus contradicting His own great commandment (John 15:12) to love one another as I have loved you? No.

It is natural for someone to love their spouse more than they love their parents. Loving your spouse more than your parents does not mean you stop loving your parents. Jesus does not mean that we need to hate our family and friends in order to follow Him. We have to love Him more than we love our family and friends, much like married couples love their spouse more than they love their parents. In fact, in the Gospel of Matthew (10:37) Jesus says, "Whoever loves father or mother more than me is not worthy of me, and whoever loves son or daughter more than me is not worthy of me." That is exactly what Jesus means in today's Gospel.

Jesus is using exaggeration and hyperbole to get a point across. For example, sometimes when people are joking about how old someone is they might say, "He's older than dirt." We don't really mean that. It is an

exaggeration and a hyperbole.

Same thing with what we heard Jesus say today. We are not supposed to really hate our family and friends. We are to make sure we love God more than them. God comes before our family and friends. Only God can save us from our sins, our family and friends cannot. Only God can raise us up from the dead, our family and friends cannot.

That means that God must come first, then your spouse, then your children, and down the list even more would be sports. Putting God first does not mean a married person ignores their spouse and neglects their children. It does not mean that at all. What it means is that when we put God first, all of our other relationships benefit. When a married couple puts God first by praying together and going to Mass together, then their marriage is stronger, and because their marriage is stronger, their children are better off.

My brother Michael and his wife Stella were married on a Saturday. The following morning, they flew to Hawaii for their honeymoon. When they arrived at their hotel in Hawaii, they suddenly realized that it was Sunday, and they should go to Mass. They discovered that a nearby Catholic church had a Sunday evening Mass, so they went to Mass on the first day of their honeymoon. They included God in their honeymoon. Whenever they went on a family vacation, they always made sure they went to Mass on Sunday. That's an example of putting God first in our life. Their marriage and their children benefitted from their commitment to God.

The message that Jesus is communicating to us in the remainder of the gospel passage is that following Him is a decision that we should not take lightly. Most major life decisions need to include this question: How will this affect my ability to faithfully live the Catholic Christian life? We must be willing to renounce anything in our life that keeps us from being a Christian, and we must be willing to take up our cross, which are the difficulties that come our way when we live the Christian life.

The most important thing for us to renounce is our sin. We must be willing to stop sinning completely in order to enter into eternal life in heaven. Are we ready to renounce gossiping, judging, pornography, lust, jealousy, laziness, etc. Are we willing to minimize our exposure to YouTube, social media, sports, etc. in order to live a more balanced life with Jesus at the center of it? What changes do we need to make in order to make sure we are praying every morning and every night, going to Mass every weekend, including while we are traveling, and being intentional about living our Catholic Christian faith at home, work, school, while doing our errands, etc.?

What Jesus is telling us to do in the gospel passage is what we try to do during Lent: simplify our life and focus more on Him. The way we go about doing this is actually included in both of the parables in this passage. We make a plan. That plan is going to take prayer and thought.

So, let's think about that for a moment. What is the impact on our family and friends if we live a life of virtue according to the teachings of our Lord Jesus Christ? There is less sin in our lives, so that will positively impact our family and friends. They are better off if we make that choice. However, that is the harder path because we will be fighting against the temptation to take the easier path that leads to sin and that negatively impacts our family and friends. Being a Christian is not easy.

What is the impact on our family and friends if we chose not live a life of virtue and reject the teachings of our Lord Jesus Christ. Not being a Christian has fewer demands on our life, but by looking at the state of our world, it appears that not being a Christian, results in misery and unhappiness. The easier path for us personally leads to more sin, dysfunction, and misery in our lives, families, and the world.

Do we choose the harder path that positively impacts family and friends, and leads to eternal salvation, or do we choose the easier path that negatively impacts family and friends and leads to eternal separation from God? The choice sounds easy when stated that way, but living that choice every day is difficult. Being a Christian is hard work, but it is the most important work we will do.

If we sit down and really examine the choices as our Lord asks us to do in today's gospel passage, the best choice is to choose the more difficult path of living according to the teachings of our Lord Jesus Christ. We want to know God's ways and thoughts, and He has given them to us. He gives us all the help and grace we need to live according to His teachings. Now that we have those teachings, we need to decide if we are going to live them. That decision will impact our family, friends, our world, and where we want to spend our eternity after we die. Putting God first in our life truly has eternal rewards, and is worth everything we need to renounce in order to be on the right path to eternal salvation.

#### Beautifying Our Property Along Oatman Road (Update)

The beautifying our property along Oatman Road is on hold until the remainder of the gabions arrive later this month. Money from the Together Let Us Go Forth Campaign is paying for that project. We just signed a bid to replace the two entrances to our parking lot from Oatman Road with concrete. The concrete bid was more than the asphalt bid, but low enough to make it the better long-term solution. The project will begin this month or next. They will work on one of those driveways at a time so that there will always be one driveway open to our parking lot from Oatman Road, and both driveways from Oatman Road will be open for the weekend Masses. Naturally, the driveway to Booster will remain open during the construction. The money for this project is coming from the large donation we received last year from the estate of a parishioner.




