5th Sunday of Easter – YRA 2026

Let's start with our first reading. We heard that there was a disagreement between the Hellenist Christians and the Hebrew Christians. The Hellenist were the Christians who spoke Greek. That means they probably immigrated to the Holy Land from various Jewish communities throughout the Roman Empire. The Hebrew Christians grew up in the Holy Land speaking Aramaic, like Jesus. They were the locals.

So, the Greek speaking Christians in Jerusalem were complaining that their widows were being neglected. They raised a valid concern. Widows were among the most vulnerable in ancient society, and they depended upon the help of others. The apostles gathered the disciples and proposed a solution. Rather than the apostles taking on more duties, and thus spending less time praying and preaching, they asked that seven reputable men be chosen to take care of the needs of the Christians, especially the widows. Seven men were chosen, and the apostles prayed over them. These seven men were the first deacons.

Today, deacons in the Catholic Church assist priests and bishops in many ways. They take Holy Communion to the homebound and to those in hospitals, visit those who are incarcerated in our jails and prisons, teach sacramental preparation classes, assist the priest at Mass, are permitted to proclaim the gospel and preach, and they can baptize babies. When a priest is not available, they can conduct marriages and funerals in a Liturgy of the Word service, and they can also conduct a burial service at a cemetery. Those are just some of the things that deacons do. Our deacons do important work, and most parishes in the diocese, including ours, need their help in order to meet the needs of the people. Thank you, deacons. We can always use more deacons. The young men in our parish should prayerfully consider the possibility of becoming a deacon. Speak with Deacon John if you have questions about that.

Let's walk through our Gospel. Jesus said (John 14:1), "You have faith in God, have faith also in me," and (John 14:9) "Whoever has seen me has seen the Father." Jesus is declaring Himself equal to God. As Christians, we're okay with that. Those who believe that Jesus is a prophet or a teacher will have a hard time justifying that because there are other scripture passages where Jesus claims equality with God (See John 1:1; 5:18; 8:58; 10:30-33; 16:15; 20:28-29), an angel of the Lord told us that He is God (Matt 1:23, Emmanuel means God with us), and the writers of the New Testament letters think He is God (See 2Cor 4:4; Col 1:15, 19; 2:9; Titus 2:13; Heb 1:3).

Jesus said (John 14:2), "I am going to prepare a place for you." I hope that is comforting. God created us to be in heaven with Him. His house is our house. His goal is not to keep us out of heaven. His goal is to get us into heaven.

Jesus said (John 14:6), "I am the way, the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me." According to Jesus, there is no other way into heaven. That means we need to read the Gospels in order to know what He taught. The words that Jesus spoke are the most important words spoken in human history. Jesus did not come all the way down from heaven just to "hang out" with us. He had important things to tell us, like the way to eternal life. In fact, in the early Church the phrase "The Way" was sometimes used as a name for Christianity (Acts 9:2; 18:25-26; 19:9, 23; 22:4; 24:14, 22).

In addition to His teachings being recorded in the Gospels, so are His actions. The way He lived was meant to be an example for us, so if we have not read the Gospels, then we do not know about those examples. Thus, "The Way" of Jesus is not a secret. We have the Gospels that tell us how we are to live.

However, about a hundred years after Jesus' crucifixion and resurrection, there arose a heresy called Gnosticism. The Gnostics believed that salvation came not from the Incarnation, the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus, but from the secret teachings Jesus gave to His followers. That's quite an arrogant and snobbish attitude concerning salvation. Christians believe that we are saved by the "blood of the Lamb," not some cosmic secret. Secret knowledge and a secret way to God is a great idea for selling books and making movies. However, it does not reveal to us a God of love. Why would God keep the way to salvation a secret?

Saint Irenaeus easily refuted the Gnostics by teaching that everything God wanted us to know for our salvation was included in the Gospels. There was no secret knowledge. Everything is of public record in the Gospels. He called it a deposit of faith, since everything the Apostles knew was deposited with the Church. I hope that makes sense. The next time someone says that they are trying to find their way in life, tell them to include reading the Gospels as part of their search, and invite them to come to Mass with you.

As you know, Jesus suffered. Thus, suffering is part of "The Way." Jesus told us that those who follow Him must take up their cross daily and follow Him (Mt 10:38; 16:24; Mark 8:34; Luke 9:23; 14:27). Suffering and self-denial are central to the Christian life which leads to resurrection and glory beyond this life. Jesus does not promise glory in this life, only in the next. Christians must be clear that "The Way," Christianity, is full of hardships and difficulty that we offer up for the sake of saving souls, and for the sake of becoming holy. Last week's second reading from St. Peter reminded us of that.

The way is hard, but Jesus does not want us to be miserable. Last weekend's gospel passage concluded with this (John 10:10): "I came so that they might have life and have it more abundantly." Jesus showed us how to live. When we live contrary to the moral teachings of God and the Church, we can expect to be miserable, we can expect life to have no meaning, and we can expect to have an empty feeling inside us. People try filling that emptiness with all kinds of pleasurable activities for temporary relief from the emptiness, and that is all they get, temporary relief. Many of those pleasurable activities are immoral, so that only adds to the emptiness as their soul is being assaulted by immoral activities rather than being guarded by Jesus, our Good Shepherd. Our souls are made for God, so life without God will leave us empty and miserable.

In addition, we are more alive when we love and forgive. Life is better when we are not holding on to grudges or thinking about revenge. When we are holding on to unforgiveness, we become angry quicker and we are less patient. We are miserable, not joyful. As long as we hold on to the unforgiveness, we let the person who harmed us to continue to harm us, and to control our life. We are not getting back at them by not forgiving them; we are harming ourselves. We will not have peace of heart, we will not have life in abundance, unless we forgive. Let go of the unforgiveness, and let God be the judge. That's His job. That's His responsibility, not ours.

Too often we slip into following the way that feels good rather than the way of love and mercy. That is a result of our fallen human nature. Why we do we say or do mean things to others? It feels good at that moment. It is a dark joy. Those mean things that we say or do cause tension, and usually yelling and shouting. The result is not more peace, which we want, but less peace and more disorder. It is not logical to say or do things that cause more stress and more disorder in our families, workplaces, and schools, but it happens all the time because saying or doing those mean things feels good at that moment.

Our behavior, our way, makes no sense when it causes problems like that. It is not logical. The two great commandments to love God and neighbor are clear and logical teachings because living them brings more love, mercy, peace, and order in our lives, families, workplaces, and schools. Our fallen human nature causes us to be blind to the obvious: love and mercy are the solution to practically all the problems in our families, workplaces and schools. God should not have to command us to do what is obviously good for us, but He must command us because we blindly follow our way rather than His way. Our way often leads to misery and frustration. God's way leads us to what is good, beautiful, and true. His way leads to eternal life in heaven.

God gave us freewill so that we can freely love Him, and freely choose to do what is virtuous. God gave us free will so that we can freely choose to live His commandments and teachings. However, God will allow us to use our freewill to freely choose to go our own way. God will not force us to go to heaven. We can choose to go our own way. In the end there are only two ways. One leads to God and heaven, and all the others lead to destruction and eternal separation from God, and we call that hell.

The way to heaven and to eternal life with God is not a secret. However, Jesus is clear. He said that, "No one comes to the Father except through me." That is not a threat. That is meant as a road map, or perhaps a treasure map. The only way to heaven is through Jesus. That is not a matter of opinion, but a truth of our faith taught to us by Jesus Himself. He taught us that not to scare us or intimidate us, but to give us clear direction to eternal life.

God so loved the world that He gave His only Son, so that everyone who believes in Him might have eternal life (John 3:16). Jesus has shown us the way to heaven, and He has prepared a place for us in heaven. He wants us in heaven with Him. The way is not hidden. The way is not a secret. Jesus, our Good Shepherd, beckons us to follow Him for He is the way, the truth, and the life. When we do the deep thinking, reflecting and praying, following Jesus is the obvious and logical choice.

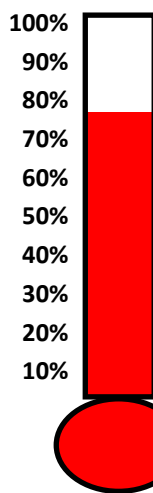
