## Pentecost Sunday – YRA 2026

Immediately before Jesus ascended to heaven, He told the Apostles not to leave Jerusalem because (Acts 1:5), “in a few days you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit.” So, what were they doing in those few days between our Lord’s Ascension to heaven, and the descent of the Holy Spirit on Pentecost? They were in the same upper room (Acts 1:13) where Jesus instituted the Holy Eucharist during the Last Supper on Holy Thursday night, the night He was arrested. With them was the Blessed Virgin Mary, and they spent a lot of time in prayer (Acts 1:14). They also chose Matthias to be an Apostle to replace Judas Iscariot. That is where today’s first reading begins, and it is about nine o’clock in the morning (Acts 2:15).

“There came from the sky a noise like a strong driving wind, and it filled the entire house in which they were” (Acts 2:2). It was God announcing His presence in a very powerful way. Wind and fire were elements that typically accompanied manifestations of God in the Old Testament. Think of Moses at the burning bush (Ex 3:2). Think of the column of fire that accompanied the Israelites during their Exodus from Egypt (Ex 13:21-22). Think of the thunder, lightning, and trumpet blasts at Mount Sinai (Ex 19:16-19) when Moses was receiving the 10 Commandments. God was making His presence known during those mighty events, and so He was doing the same thing on Pentecost with the loud noise and fire.

So, while the Apostles were filled with the Holy Spirit, they were speaking of the mighty acts of God (Acts 2:11) in all the foreign languages of those who had gathered in Jerusalem for the Jewish Feast of Pentecost. Pentecost was one of the three great Jewish feasts when many Israelites went on pilgrimage to Jerusalem (Deut 16:16). That is why (Acts 2:5) “...there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven staying in Jerusalem.”

A large crowd of more than 3000 (Acts 2:41) gathered outside of the house where the Apostles were staying. The people had heard the strong driving wind noise, and came to see what it was. That’s when they encountered the Apostles praising God. The crowd’s response is described in the verses that immediately follow our first reading: “They were all astounded and bewildered and said to one another, ‘What does this mean?’ But others said, scoffing, ‘They have had too much new wine’” (Acts 2:12-13). Notice that there were some who recognized that God had made His presence known, and they were not sure what it all meant, and there were some who explained it all by saying that the Apostles were drunk.

Now, recall that the crowd was described as “devout Jews.” Thus, they all believe in God, but some believed that God was somehow acting in the Apostles in a very special way, and others thought the Apostles were simply intoxicated. They all heard, saw, and experienced the same thing, but not all could see the hand of God in the events they were witnessing.

As we all know, unfortunately, that is still true today. If God were to do some mighty act today, not everyone would believe. Some of those present would say it was special effects, and some of those who will later watch a video of the event would say the video was altered. Mighty acts of God will not guarantee the conversion of those who witness those mighty acts.

Anyway, back to Pentecost. God is a genius. In one mighty swoop He has Baptized the Apostles with the Holy Spirit, and gathered a large crowd of over 3000 devout Jews to their doorstep. At the very first moment that the Apostles were prepared to preach the Good News, God brought a large crowd to them. So, that’s what Peter did. The head of the Apostles, the first Pope, preached to the crowd that was gathered at their doorstep (Acts 2:14-36).

When he was done, some of the crowd asked what they should do. Peter said, “Repent and be baptized, every one of you, in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins; and you will receive the Holy Spirit” (Acts 2:38). A few verses later we read that, “Those who accepted his message were baptized, and about three thousand persons were added that day.”

However, notice that the passage did not say that all in the crowd were baptized. It only mentioned that those who accepted the message were baptized. Unfortunately, there were some devout Jews who did not accept that Jesus was the Messiah they had long been waiting for. To this day, the work of evangelization continues, and it is the work of all of us. And like the Apostles, we need the help of the Holy Spirit to do the work of evangelization.

Recall that 50 days prior to Pentecost, on the night Jesus was arrested, Peter had denied knowing our Lord when questioned by a mere servant girl. After receiving the Holy Spirit, he preached a fantastic homily (Acts 2:14-41) in front of thousands of people. His fear was gone. He was no longer afraid to be a witness for Jesus Christ. In addition, in the following months he will be arrested several times and will be questioned by the Sanhedrin. While being questioned by them, Peter boldly proclaimed his faith in Jesus Christ (Acts 4:1-23). That’s quite the change. Yes, Peter, and all the Apostles were renewed by the Holy Spirit on Pentecost.

That same Holy Spirit was given to us at our Confirmation. We have to be careful that we do not minimize the importance of the Sacrament of Confirmation. Receiving the Holy Spirit was so important, that Jesus instructed the Apostles to remain in Jerusalem, and not begin the work of saving souls until they received the Holy Spirit. Receiving the Holy Spirit is important to God, and thus the Sacrament of Confirmation should be important to us. At the Confirmation Mass, the bishop prays that the Holy Spirit comes upon those to be Confirmed, and then he anoints them with the Sacred Chrism oil as a sign of receiving the Holy Spirit.

When the Apostles received the Holy Spirit (Acts 2:4) “they began to speak in different tongues as the Holy Spirit enabled them to proclaim.” Would it be great to be able to speak, and have everyone, no matter what country they’re from, understand you? That can still happen. There is a language that we can speak that will penetrate all language barriers. A smile speaks the same message in every language. Acts of kindness speak the same message in every language.

When missionaries would go to foreign countries, they often could not speak the language. So how did they communicate that they wanted to be friends? By being friendly. By being a friend, and by doing kind things. As they interacted in a friendly way with those whom they wanted to preach the Good News to, they slowly learned the language, and won their trust. It is common sense. That is still the same formula for evangelizing today.

The work of saving souls is the work of all of us, not just the clergy. We are all called to that kind of work. I'm not going to meet your children, grandchildren, siblings, cousins, nephews, and nieces who have stopped going to church because they are not attending St. Margaret Mary. And because of our fallen human nature, many of our family members who have stopped going to church are not going to listen to us. So, we must make it our job, we must make it our duty, to help convert the children, grandchildren, siblings, cousins, nephews and nieces of others who live here in Bullhead City. We do that by being open to the Holy Spirit and living as Jesus taught. We begin preaching to the children, grandchildren, siblings, nieces, and nephews of others by our manner of living, by our holiness of life, and by our friendly manner.

You see, the Holy Spirit is transformative, and it is never too late to allow ourselves to be transformed and renewed by it. When we are open to the Holy Spirit, and allow it to transform us and renew us, the fruits of the spirit begin to increase in us. As you know the fruits of the Holy Spirit are (CCC #1832 and Galatians 5:22): love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, generosity, gentleness, faithfulness, modesty, self-control, and chastity. When those fruits are in us in an abundance, people will recognize that there is something different about us in a good way. They will want to know our "secret." That is how we go about the work of saving the souls of the children, grandchildren, siblings, cousins, nieces, and nephews of others who live in our town.

Thus, holiness of life with a friendly attitude must be the first step in evangelization. We must desire to be a saint, and desire to be friendly with others. We cannot become a saint without the help of the Holy Spirit and the grace of God. People must see that our faith makes a difference in our lives. They won't be interested in anything we have to say about Jesus, if we are not living what Jesus taught, if it is not helping us to become us a better person, and it is not helping us to become more patient and kind.

In our gospel passage today, we heard Jesus instituting the Sacrament of Confession on the day He rose from the dead, in the exact same upper room that He instituted the Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist. The Sacrament of Confession will help to continue to renew us when we sin, and the Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist will strengthen us for the work of evangelization. May we truly become what we receive in the Holy Eucharist, may we become more like Jesus, so that we can do the work of evangelization.

### **Consecration of our Nation to the Sacred Heart of Jesus**

This year (2026) marks the 250th anniversary of our nation's founding. In preparation for this historic moment, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) will consecrate the United States to the Sacred Heart of Jesus on Thursday, June 11th, during a special Mass at the Basilica of Mary Queen of the Universe in Orlando as part of the bishops' USCCB plenary assembly. The Mass begins at 1 p.m. Phoenix time (4 p.m. EDT) and the Diocese of Phoenix will be streaming this live on the diocese's Facebook and YouTube channel.

In addition, all are invited to join in the Novena to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, which the USCCB and people from across the nation will be praying from June 3-11, in preparation for the consecration. All are invited to pray then, or anytime between now and July 4, the celebration of our nation's 250th anniversary.

As we prepare for this incredible occasion, let us turn to the Sacred Heart which reminds us that Christ's love is not abstract or distant; His Heart beats for us.

## **Father's Day Flower Envelopes**

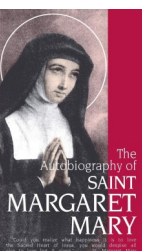

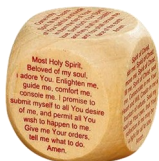

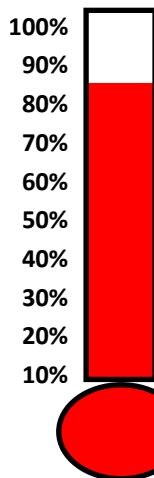
