**Opening:** Trent talked about Presidents Day and quoted Abraham Lincoln from the Emancipation Declaration on Jan 1, 1863 about the abolishment of slavery. Trent compared the account from Luke 4 where Jesus quoted Isaiah 61 on his return home. While making the point that Lincoln was not Jesus Trent emphasized the divisiveness of each statement rallying some and leading others to want to kill each figure. Trent emphasized that a message of restoration is still unpopular today as hate is still evident and that we need to reject the temptation to hate. We can say no and choose to follow Jesus. Trent then led us in prayer to open the meeting.

## **Treasurer's Report—Ed Taylor, Treasurer**

- Budget: We are through the fifth month of the fiscal year, 41.67%. Budget giving is at 40.6% of budget and at 43.8% including school income. Expenses are at 38.5% of budget. Most spending is in line with budgeted amounts. Worship Ministry's expenses are a bit high because of yearly music copyright fees that shouldn't repeat in this fiscal year. Adult ministry has been active with some events that should even out over the rest of the year.
  - CCS Tuition: Donations to the Central tuition account have been fairly steady throughout the year. Monthly payments will be \$2,177.50 plus additional giving of \$2,155.83 per month through June. The January 31 balance is \$22,186.85. We have nearly enough in the account to pay the rest of the year but would like to keep the balance to start the next year around the \$20 thousand number.
  - † Ed feels many early overages will be offset over the course of the budget year.
  - † We discussed an honorarium for Aaron Kaufmann as our guest during the Missions weekend of Feb 17 & 18.

- I registered for the Serving Leader Cohort with Dr. John Stahl-Wert. Beginning in February meeting in person in Berlin on the third Thursdays of the month for six months.
- MarriageForLife Conference was for the most part good. It was probably the least appreciated speaker I have experienced of the multiple times Erin and I have gone.
- It was a fun and meaningful experience organizing the outing to go and see the first three episodes of the Season 4 of The Chosen in the theater. There were six different churches represented including Sonnenberg, Salem, Kidron, Martins Creek, Smithville and Orrville.

- PT met February 12. Jeremy opened with some thoughts from 1 Peter 1:22 and Henri Nouwen. Words of love and affirmation are like bread...we need them every day.
  - We discussed various needs within the congregation. The mutual caring fund continues to be a blessing.
  - Glenn was absent due to illness, but shared some documents related to multi-pastor ministry. He is taking part in the Serving Leaders Cohort with John Stahl-Wert one day per month starting this Thursday.
  - We discussed feedback from the two Winter Wednesday discussion nights as well as the theme verse banners and upcoming plans for Lent/Easter.
  - About 20 people are receiving cards via our card ministry, and those are much appreciated.
  - We continue to work at discernment related to broader church issues. Phil closed in prayer.
  - + Jeremy thought the Wednesday night events went well. Pastoral team continues to reflect on that and plan to give reports from those sessions in various church settings.
  - + He added that Pastoral Team continues to discern how to interact with other groups whether they are ministries, agencies or other congregations regardless of what their affiliation is. - In our last meeting we talked about how to get some building repairs done. We talked to a drywall finisher about repairing some areas of the ceiling damaged by water leaks.
  - We are still working at trying to find someone to repair the outside kitchen steps. We are looking at the possibility of doing the demo work and finding someone to replace the concrete.
  - We are looking at getting additional information about a cemetery urn wall structure. We are also looking for a time this year to repair some cemetery stone foundations.
  - + Ed shared that Facilities Ministry may do most of the demo on the kitchen steps in house to get it going.
  - + Ed also shared that Facilities is keeping track of the Columbarium project.

#### **Action Items:**

+ **Columbarium update - Trent Metcalf added details about the Columbarium options the committee has looked at since the CLT presentation. A conversation about using a memorial wall instead of building an urn structure was discussed as a way to keep costs down. People would then have the option of burying an urn in a grass plot, pouring remains into that plot or spreading them elsewhere but still using the memorial wall as a marker. A possibility of a permanent simple structure for outdoor services was discussed. It was noted that any version of the project could be done in stages. Different streams for funding were discussed such as the Cemetery endowment fund, along with opening up for congregational support as well as the purchase of plots. Likely a design will be worked up with landscaping to present to the congregation at a future meeting for input.**

+ **Upcoming ACA meetings - Pastoral Team encouraged folks to go and participate in ACA not just delegates.**

+ **Chicken BBQ fundraiser for MYF - Chip discussed the financial needs for the remainder of the bill for the MYF trip to Costa Rica. Since the EdChoice program has cut our costs towards Central we made a motion to use Chicken BBQ funds for the trip instead of the CCS fund as a one year exception. Ken made the motion and everyone seconded. The church secretary / myf sponsor FEELS VERY BLESSED !!!!**
