LINDA HORN in THAILAND

(Linda sent in her latest prayer letter on June 24th about the Lord's work Thailand) Dear Prayer Partners,

I am not sorry to say that it has been a busy year. Looking back over the prayer letters that I have sent this year:

18 July 2024: I told the great story of God coming on time to rescue school principal Ampa from having to participate in a Buddhist school ceremony, I sent a photo of the Saeng Arune Church building project well underway. I told of changes in church staff positions precipitated by Compassion International closing their work in Thailand with lady Pastor Ja being named as head Pastor in Borabue. I had a photo of my Christian employee Naa completing the first four books of the S.S.P. Bible Literacy Program. 11 November 2024: I shared photos and stories of our free English Camp during mid-term school break.

I gave it at our most struggling church smallest, of our four churches. I hope to do a free camp there at Ban Daeng

Church every year. Some **in Norway** years ago, I used to pick up two teens from their grandmother's house to study English and Bible. Both Oil and her brother Boss became Christians and were baptized. To my surprise, Oil showed up at Ban Daeng Church and sent her five-year old son Arthur to English Camp. Please pray for the salvation of Oil's mother. I also mentioned a wound on my leg (still not completely healed).

And I advised you that I would travel to Norway to visit my daughter April and her family for the first time in five years. It was a delightful visit! But also challenging because their home is not wheelchair friendly. April found me a cute apartment just a three-minute walk from their home. And they got me a residency visa to Norway. Good news! But the drawback is a requirement to stay in Norway six months each year. I am also required to learn Norwegian! Være så snill.

19 January 2025: I wrote from Norway using photos and news that Naa sent me on-line. Naa was my only employee. She lived alone at Jubilee, fed the dogs, cats, and chickens, and took care of everything. We have four churches now. Three of them held Christmas Celebrations, two of them also held First Fruit Celebrations in late January - after the annual rice harvest season.

5 April 2025: I sent my Jubilee update only to my home church Sonnenberg for display at their annual Maple Syrup Missions Festival. The display showed photos of the Free English Camp in October at Ban Daeng Church. There were photos of the good progress of the Saeng Arune Church's construction project. Pastor Ja of Borabue Church has a vision for teaching teens from a picture story Bible and training them to be future leaders of the church. I was proud to support this goal and to expand on it by giving these easy to understand Bibles to older members and Seekers. The April update also included a photo of Naa visiting an older member and bringing him lunch.

And now: As soon as I landed in Thailand, I was bitten by mosquitos and became quite ill for an entire month. (I feel fine now. Thank You, Jesus!) When I felt well enough to return to the Jubilee farm, Khruu Ohng came and applied for work. He came to faith in the Lord Jesus Christ while working overseas in Taiwan. He came back to Thailand and attended and graduated from Bangkok Bible College. He has church work experience and enjoys preaching and teaching. His work here will be largely agricultural and building maintenance. He will preach once a month at our Dhong Kheng Church. He will teach or preach once or twice a month at our Saeng Arune Church. I hope he will not be bored, but will really enjoy working for Jubilee.

Surprise, surprise! I will also be preaching once a month at our Borabue Church. I have done it once already this month, and it went quite well PTL!

I like to watch Anglican Pastor (Canon) j john on his show "Facing the Canon". Last week I saw Dave Bell on the interview. Dave is a strong

Christian Worship Leader. He had an intense struggle for ten years with a rare and aggressive cancer starting at the age of 16. This week I watched John and Jade Reynolds on the program. At the age of twelve she was stricken by an autoimmune disease which left both legs paralyzed. She expected to live as an invalid at her parent's home for the rest of her life. But God encouraged her to be brave and try to live in the dorm at a Bible College four hours from her home. To her surprise she was welcomed, cared for, and successful. She married John who remarked during the interview that Jade is the most joyful person he has ever met. God blessed them to give birth to two healthy children who are doing well. John and Jade work from home (something about social media) so both can care for their children.

These two interviews really encouraged me. My long-range plan is to not get discouraged and retire, but to plod forward as Father God calls the shots.

Myron and Gladys Amstutz some years ago urged us at Sonnenberg to read through the Bible every year, and I like to do so. My most recent happy strategy is to use three bookmarks. I start with one at Genesis, one at Psalms, and one at Matthew. Each day I read a little from each section. I never get bored or bogged down. Right now it is late June, and I am reading Habakkuk and Revelations. So you see I am behind. In fact, this

busy year, I am not up-to-date in a lot of areas. But I am thriving, hopeful, and enjoying



life.The new Saeng Arune sanctuary isGod has amazed me byalmost complete.His timely financial help.

This Week in Anabaptist History ... On July 6, 1683 the English schooner the Concord, a 500 ton ship measuring 130 by 32 feet, left Rotterdam. Twelve Quaker families (many who were former Mennonites) and one Mennonite family, the Lenssens, from Krefeld, sailed for the port of Philadelphia where they landed on October 6, 1683.

In 1681, William Penn, an English real estate entrepreneur, received a large grant of land from King Charles II. This grant included present-day Pennsylvania and Delaware. Penn, a Quaker, chose to draft a charter of liberties for his colony guaranteeing free and fair trial by jury, freedom of religion, freedom from unjust imprisonment, and free elections. The colony was to be a refuge for Quakers who were facing persecution. James Claypoole, a London businessman and Quaker who knew William Penn, purchased 5,000 acres of land in the new settlement and chose to move his family and business to America.

The group, known as "The Thirteen", were greeted by a German lawyer, Franz "Francis" Daniel Pastorius, a close friend of Willian Penn. Pastorius assisted the newcomers in establishing the Germantown Mennonite Settlement.

The Germantown Mennonite Settlement, the first permanent Mennonite settlement in North America, six miles (10 km) north of the then one-year-old town of Philadelphia. The first Mennonite group settlement in America, however, was established by Pieter Cornelisz Plockhoy in 1663 with Dutch settlers at Horekill on the Delaware some 70 miles (120 km) south of Germantown, which was destroyed by English raiders a year later. Earlier even than this, scattered individual Dutch Mennonite immigrants or traders were found at New Amsterdam and Gravesend (Long Island), but they did not form a congregation and left no trace.
