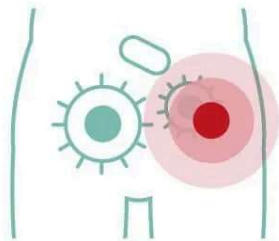
Patient-1 was sent home without antibiotics or wound care supplies, and Dr. Bradford refused to answer calls from the patient or the patient's other medical providers.

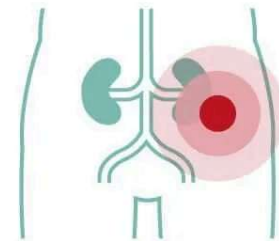
Two common **types of surgical site infections**

Superficial infections



Develop on the skin where an incision or injury has occurred. These typically only affect the surface layer of the skin, making them less likely to cause long-term harm and easier to treat.

Deep infections



Often occur beneath the incision area, affecting a person's organs, muscles and deeper tissue. These can be far more dangerous to someone's long-term health and may be difficult to remove.
