I feel compelled to report this to the Ethics Committee and Medicare. This hospital just wants to pad the bill!!!

They are going to tell me I'm not a doctor, but a flesh wound does not need 4 days in the Hospital. The flight to the other Hospital was not needed either!!!

**I would never go to this hospital!!! Shame on all involved!!!!**

**My opinion -- I think it's all about \$\$\$.**

**I have spoke with others about this, and they all stated 4 days for a flesh wound is ridiculous!!!**
