ROSARY CIRCLE FOR PRIESTLY VOCATIONS: As we enter into the month of November there is a new 'Rosary Circle Chart' on the noticeboard, to encourage us all to pray for vocations to the Priesthood.

The 'Chart' lists the 20 decades of the Rosary and a number of columns for people to put their initial or a tick in a box to indicate they will commit to praying the particular decade each day for the month of November, and hopefully, this will create a number of 'circles' praying for this intention. This is a very simple spiritual exercise many of us could join in with; at least 20 people praying one decade of the Rosary each day, so the whole of the Rosary is prayed for this particular intention, thus creating a 'Rosary Circle'. Let it be said, however, that anyone can join the Rosary Circles at any time.

<u>ADULT FORMATION:-</u> Continues next Monday 3rd November at 7.30 pm giving consideration to who we are as human beings, made to the image and likeness of God, body and soul, matter and spirit; we'll look at something of what neuroscience has discovered in recent years and consider activities which are uniquely human, not least, that we pray! Everyone is welcome to attend, the programme is aimed primarily at those wishing to know more about the Catholic faith, with a view to making an informed decision to become a Catholic.

<u>CHILDREN'S LITURGY at the 10.00 am Sunday Mass:</u> We are delighted to see more and more primary school children from our parish taking part in our Children's Liturgy sessions during the **Sunday 10am Mass**. NOVEMBER, MONTH OF THE HOLY SOULS:- During the month there will be the blessing of graves at Dorking Cemetery at 12 pm on Sunday 23rd November. Everyone is welcome to attend.

Aware that we will all die one day, and hopefully get to Heaven, for most of us who are not saints, there will be a time of purgation or purification in Purgatory before we finally attain the vision of God in Heaven, the 'Beatific Vision'. As a part of the Body of Christ, the Church, we should be encouraged to pray for the souls in Purgatory as they are unable to do anything for themselves. A good time to pray for them would be at 'Grace after meals': We give thee thanks, Almighty God, for these and all thy benefits, who live and reign for ever and ever.' followed by 'May the Divine assistance remain always with us and may the souls of the faithful departed rest in peace. Amen.'

MASS INTENTIONS:- You will see from the 'diary' for this week, Masses are the 'celebrant's intention'; however, if you would like to have Mass offered for a personal or particular intention, please put details on a 'Mass Intention' envelope and hand it to Fr. Ian or drop it through the presbytery letterbox. You might like to have Mass offered for someone's well-being, the repose of their soul, birthday etc. By tradition, the Mass 'offering', (rooted in Leviticus 7:28-34 and Deuteronomy 18:3-8) should be sufficient to sustain a priest for the day. DIOCESAN PASTORAL PLAN:- A significant amount of work has been undertaken in recent moths with individuals from across the existing parishes of the Epsom Deanery working together- as we move towards merging the existing parishes into one. Amongst the concerns identified, finance would obviously be one of them, and just as an assurance, the Diocesan Chief Operating Officer (COO) Sarah Kilmartin, met with parish clergy and Chairs of Finance Committees to address some of these concerns.

The existing parish finance committees will become 'stewardship teams' responsible for the local church and properties, while a 'finance committee' would be constituted to have oversight of all the church buildings and properties within what is currently the Epsom Deanery.

Essentially, local communities, would still be responsible for the financing and upkeep of the local church and properties, while much larger expenditures would be addressed by the newly constituted finance committee. It is proposed that the finance committee consists of individuals from the local 'stewardship teams' ensuring prudent oversight of funds.

In regard to other arenas, we need to be aware of the underlying principles of the pastoral plan which are 'prayer, formation and mission' and that we all need to be prayerful, we need to grow in a knowledge and understanding of our faith and thereby become effective witnesses to Christ in the World.

A useful daily question for all of us, is 'What did I learn today?' and in answering that question, perhaps to be mindful of the adage 'A doctrine a day keeps the Devil away' when it comes to our faith.
