A Word from the Rector

I hope that you will notice the wide and varied reach of our ministry this fall. We have entered this new program year with gusto and excitement, as we look to see how God will animate our parish. Allow me to provide a glimpse of things.

Our new Sunday morning Book of Prayer Book class is underway, each Sunday between services (9-9:45 a.m. through Oct. 12). Each Wednesday we have a weekly service of Holy Communion at 10 a.m., followed by the Rector's Bible Study in the Vestry Room at 11am. Likewise, our Women's Bible Study with Susannah Leighton is every Monday at 9:30 a.m. As always, all are welcome.

Jacob Gruss, our new Director of Music, is off to a wonderful start, and is in the process of growing our choir. Along those lines, we now offer child care in the nursery, starting at 9 a.m. each Sunday, so that parents can more easily participate in choir practice from 9 -9:45 a.m. Do let him know if you like to sing and are interested in joining the choir.

As you'll see in the pages that follow, our Church School & Youth Group are cooking with gas under Rev. Matt Rossi's and Melissa Torres' wonderful leadership. On top of this, we have over 20 kids in this year's Confirmation Class, making it our largest in quite a while. And it's not too late to add more.

On Sun., Oct. 19 at 9 a.m. in the Children's Chapel, our Children's Choir with have their first practice with Heymin Sohn. Children age 4 through 5th grade are welcome to attend. We can't wait to hear them sing on the first Sundays of each month, when the children from Church School join their parents for Communion.

The Men of St. Matthew's monthly Saturday morning breakfast gatherings happen on the third Saturday of each month in the Fellowship Room, and the Women of St. Matthew's have a full calendar of upcoming events planned. Also, don't miss Rev. Matt's Book Club on Oct. 17 and Nov. 21

In the spirit of trying new things, we're also launching a Sermon Podcast: "St. Matthew's Pulpit Pod" with which you can revisit your favorite sermons or discover older ones that you may have missed.

And then there are the more social, parish-wide celebrations that punctuate the year. Our annual Blessing of the Pets is at 4 p.m. on Oct. 5 in the Chapel-in-the-Woods. Plus, on Oct. 26, note that we're adding a Trunk or Treat to this Year's Haunted Hike, making it a full-blown All Hallow's Fest bonanza. Invite your friends and neighbors for a night of pure fun.

On Oct. 19, I head to the UK with 30 parishioners for our "Anglican Heritage" pilgrimage. We will start up north in York, making our way south though Cambridge, all the way to Canterbury before returning home, having learned much about our history and identity as Anglican Christians. Adult Class: Book of Common Prayer

Our class on the BCP has enjoyed strong attendance and robust discussion about the Prayer Book, that rich resource of Anglican worship and theology. Beginning with a discussion of prayer as a fundamental distinction of human identity (humans are "praying animals"!), the class learned how the Prayer Book began as a project, spearheaded by Archbishop Thomas Cranmer, to teach Christians to pray together simply, beautifully, and most importantly, with the words of Scripture in our ears and on our tongues – a unifier of the land. In line with those aims, we've gone on to explore how to make use of the treasure trove of services and prayers between the book's covers, opening up its riches to continue to fund our spiritual lives in the 21st century and beyond. The class remains open to all through its conclusion on Oct. 12.

St. Mary's: Learn about Protecting Clean Water!

St. Mary's will have an interesting service on Sun., Oct. 5, 5:30 p.m. when Marc Yaggi the CEO Waterkeeper Alliance will speak. Recognized internationally, Waterkeeper

Alliance is a global movement united for clean, healthy, and abundant water for all people and the planet.

Yaggi will speak about Waterkeeper's mission and core beliefs: water is life; healthy watersheds connect and sustain us all; and clean water is a basic right for all living beings. He will provide insights into how Waterkeepers are guardians of this right, fiercely defending, enforcing, and promoting just and equitable clean water laws, and will speak to local issues affecting our Long Island Sound and Hudson River watersheds.

Under Marc's leadership, Waterkeeper Alliance has amassed significant legal and advocacy victories, including stopping dirty fossil fuel projects, securing rules to prevent industrial agriculture slaughterhouse pollution, holding coal-fired power plants accountable for pollution, protecting coastal wetland forests, eliminating regulatory loopholes for pesticides, and securing human health protections from mercury pollution.

A reception will follow the service.


