PILATE'S BASIN

Scripture Isaiah 50:4-9a Matthew 27:15-26

Pilate tried to wash his hands; but he couldn't. There was no washing away the guilt he bore, no denying the hand he had in the crucifixion and death of Jesus. Nor is there any denying our

guilt. It was for our sins that Jesus went to the cross. It was our sins that nailed him there, that stay nailed there – forever – when we place our trust in his atoning death. There's no helping it. We cannot wash our hands of the whole affair. We can only confess our sins and accept his grace.

Prayer of Confession †

Lord Jesus, we are stunned at your passion and your commitment toward us. You did not run from the darkness. You did not hide from your accusers. You did not fade into safe obscurity. You stepped with determination into the darkness, willingly giving yourself to whip and fist, to wood and nails. We marvel at what you were prepared to endure to reconcile us with God. Forgive us when we allow ourselves to become too familiar with this story, when we take your suffering too lightly, when we receive your grace too cheaply. Forgive us our ignorance, our foolishness, our selfishness, our brokenness. As we watch with you, while the darkness encroaches, let us remember what this journey means, and count again the cost of love. Amen.

BASIN OF BAPTISM

Scripture Romans 6:1-11

"If anyone is in Christ, they are a new creation. The old has passed away, the new has come." It's all grace. And God's grace, God's love never fails.

In Christ Jesus we are a forgiven people. Let us proclaim together our faith.

Affirmation of Faith (Question #1 - Heidelberg Catechism)

What is your only comfort, in life and in death?

That I belong – body and soul, in life and in death – not to myself but to my faithful Savior, Jesus Christ, who at the cost of his own blood has fully paid for all my sins and has completely freed me from the dominion of the devil; that he protects me so well that without the will of my Father in heaven not a hair can fall from my head; indeed, that everything must fit his purpose for my salvation. Therefore by his Holy Spirit, he also assures me of eternal life, and makes me wholeheartedly willing and ready from now on to live for him.

Scripture John 13:1-9, 12-17

Jesus washed his disciples' feet. This act held deep meaning, for Jesus was about to wash away his followers' filthy sins in the work of the cross. It was an example of humility, of servant leadership. Jesus also knew that he would not be with these dear friends much longer. He was reminding them to take care of one another. They now would be His hands and feet. They would need to love, bless, and encourage one another in their work together.

All our work – in our homes, in the community, in the church, in struggle, in joy, in hope – is a means by which God is pleased to bless the world. The work of our hands is a mask behind which our hidden God builds the Kingdom that comes.
