LEGO CHALLENGES FOR CURIOUS MINDS

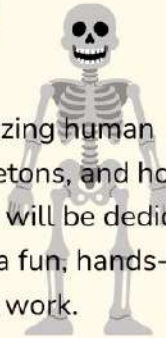
WEEK 5: JULY 6 – 10
