A. John 1:1-5, 14—The Word was Made Flesh

1. Verses 1-5 (NKJV) “In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things were made through Him, and without Him nothing was made that was made. In Him was life, and the life was the light of men. And the light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not comprehend it.”
2. Verse 14 (NKJV) “And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we beheld His glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father, full of grace and truth.”
3. (NLT) “So the Word became human and made his home among us. He was full of unfailing love and faithfulness. And we have seen his glory, the glory of the Father’s one and only Son.”
4. This was the fulfillment of Isaiah 7:14 that says, “Therefore the Lord himself shall give you a sign; Behold, a virgin shall conceive, and bear a son, and shall call his name Immanuel.”
5. Matthew 1:23 (NJKV) “Behold, the virgin shall be with child, and bear a Son, and they shall call His name Immanuel,” which is translated, “God with us.”

B. Hebrews 13:5-6 “Here With Us”—Our Christmas Theme

1. We must remind ourselves that our God is with us in these times.
2. Verses 5-6 (NKJV) Let your conduct be without covetousness; be content with such things as you have. For He Himself has said, “I will never leave you nor forsake you.” So we may boldly say: “The LORD is my helper; I will not fear. What can man do to me?”
3. The most important statement: “I will never leave you nor forsake you.”
4. We will press into a deeper awareness God’s presence.
5. We will work on our relationship with the Father.

C. Three Relationships We Have With God

1. God is with us.
 - a. Isaiah 41:10 (NKJV) “Fear not, for I am with you; be not dismayed, for I am your God. I will strengthen you, Yes, I will help you, I will uphold you with My righteous right hand.”
 - b. Joshua 1:5 (NLT) “No one will be able to stand against you as long as you live. For I will be with you as I was with Moses. I will not fail you or abandon you.”
 - c. Psalms 46:7 (ESV) “The LORD of hosts is with us; the God of Jacob is our fortress.”

2. God is for us.
 - a. Romans 8:31 (NKJV) “What then shall we say to these things? If God is for us, who can be against us?”
 - b. Psalms 118:6-7 (NLT) “The LORD is for me, so I will have no fear. What can mere people do to me? Yes, the LORD is for me; he will help me. I will look in triumph at those who hate me.”
 - c. God was for David when he faced Goliath.
3. God is in us.
 - a. John 14:16-17 “And I will pray the Father, and he shall give you another Comforter, that he may abide with you forever; even the Spirit of truth; whom the world cannot receive, because it seeth him not, neither knoweth him: but ye know him; for he dwelleth with you, and shall be in you.”
 - b. Galatians 2:20 (NKJV) “I have been crucified with Christ; it is no longer I who live, but Christ lives in me; and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave Himself for me.”
 - c. Colossians 1:27 “To whom God would make known what is the riches of the glory of this mystery among the Gentiles; which is Christ in you, the hope of glory.”

D. 1 John 4:4—We Must Become “God-Inside-Minded”

1. Verse 4 (AMPC) Little children, you are of God [you belong to Him] and have [already] defeated and overcome them [the agents of the antichrist], because He Who lives in you is greater (mightier) than he who is in the world.
2. Become God-inside-minded instead of external-problem-minded.
3. Become more aware of the Greater One’s presence.
4. Recognize that He is always there and will abide with us forever.
5. God is with us. God is for us. God is in us. He is here!
