SOLEMNITY OF THE ASSUMPTION

This Solemnity commemorates the day when the Blessed Virgin Mary was taken directly into heaven after her life on earth had ended. Mary's union with God in Christ was unique from the beginning. Her call to final union with God, body and soul, was also unique in the end. The Assumption asserts something about human existence in asserting something about Mary. That human existence is bodily existence and that the body is good because God created it. Assumption goes beyond the mere material, however, and reminds us that we are destined for spiritual glory because we will one day be fully united with God through Christ.
