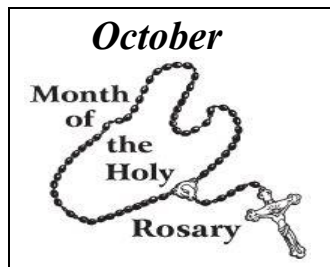

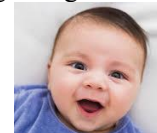
BIBLE STUDY
