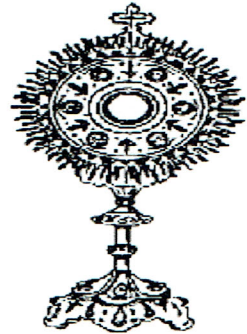
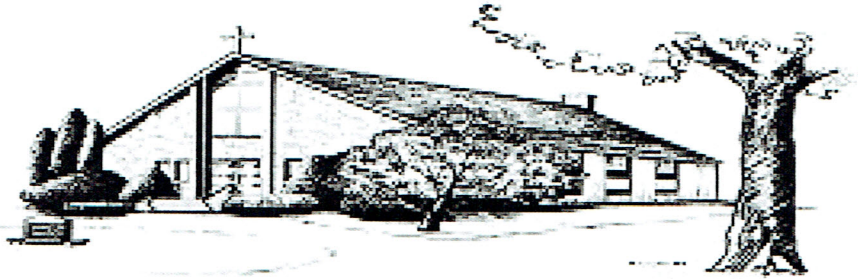

SOLEMNITY OF THE EPIPHANY
The word "Epiphany" means the manifestation of Christ: the newborn King, Jesus Christ, is manifested to the non-Jewish world, represented by the three wise men that came from the East. St. Matthew emphasizes the point that Jesus wanted to be known not only by the chosen people, the Jews, but by every-one. Jesus wants all people of every age to know about Him and His saving love for all. We often think of God as the hidden God because we cannot see Him. However, one important way that God reveals Himself to the world is through us! All those whom we meet must see Christ in us! Just how do we make Christ known?

**EPIPHANY DOOR POST
BLESSING -
20 + C + M + B + 26**

As we recall the journey of the wise men to the manger, there is a rich Epiphany tradition still observed by many. It is a blessed custom for the head of the household to trace the first letter of the Magi's names and numerals that designate the year over the door – punctuated with a cross. When you perform this ritual at home with chalk, the following prayer is said, *"Bless O Lord, Almighty God, this house that it may be a shelter of health, chastity, self-conquest, humility, goodness, mildness and obedience to the commandments and thanksgiving to God the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. May blessings remain for all time upon this Christian home and upon those who live here. We ask this through Christ who has revealed Himself to the gentile people. Amen."*
(The date and initials are then traced above the main doorway with chalk)

EPIPHANY, MAKING ROOM FOR JESUS

By the time the wise men arrive, the gospel recounts that they find Jesus in a house. This detail – which I haven't noticed before – is comforting to me. Somewhere after the unanticipated stable delivery, room was found for the fledgling family. The wise men go seeding Jesus surrounded by his family, held by another family.

We are the people making room for Jesus and for the people who are seeking him in the world today. Right in the middle of the Christmas leftovers, the decorations which will soon be put away, and the ache to get back to routine after feasting, Jesus is with us. The star could be stopping over our imperfect, crowded or messy homes. The gospel doesn't talk about what the wise men ate, where they slept, or whether things were cleaned up. The star stopped over the place where they could encounter Jesus. And "they were overjoyed at seeing the star."

Who is overjoyed at the light God has set over you? Who needs the Jesus that resides in your heart and home? We celebrate Epiphany not so that we can pay homage with the kings of Jesus' time, but so that we can practice being overjoyed by the places in our lives where the star has stopped - even when that place is within us. = Leah Perrault

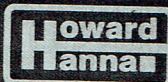
