

Dear brothers and sisters,

Due to the recent winter storm, our church attendance was understandably down since many were unable to attend Mass. Please know that when the weather is treacherous, I want you to be safe and not risk coming to Mass. The Church teaches that participation in Sunday Mass is a serious obligation; however, canon law (church law) also recognizes that there are grave causes that might prevent participation in the celebration of the Eucharist. Examples of grave causes can be unsafe travel conditions, personal sickness, care of the sick, being house-bound, or lack of transportation. If you are unable to attend Mass, please try to watch Mass on TV (channel 9 at 6:30 am) or on EWTN (channel 44) many times during the day. Again, I want all of you to be safe and secure.

I recently announced that the Bishop has given me permission to retire this coming July. It was a very difficult decision for me to make, but after much prayer I know it is time. I will celebrate my 50th Anniversary as a priest on May 8 and I will be 76 years old in August. I have been at St. Patrick's 22 years in July, almost one half of my priesthood, and I have loved being your pastor. When I am informed about future plans for the parish I will tell you. Until then I ask for your prayers and the support which you have always given me.

OUR LADY OF LOURDES

The first of eighteen apparitions of the Blessed Virgin Mary to the humble Bernadette Soubirous took place at Lourdes on February 11, 1858. On March 25, when Bernadette asked the Beautiful Lady her name, she replied: "I am the Immaculate Conception." The devotion of people in all parts of the world to Our Lady of Lourdes, together with the countless miracles that have been wrought through her intercession, has caused one of the most marvelous regenerations in the history of the church. "The message of Lourdes is not restricted to the words Bernadette heard in the grotto: prayer, and penitence, in the gospel sense of thoroughgoing conversion or turning towards God. It is to be found, first and foremost, in the poverty embodied in the very choice of Bernadette and in the immediate response of the poor to the good news. Finally, the message of Lourdes is ultimately the very name and identity of the messenger: the Immaculate Mary, the Virgin of the Magnificat, the prototype of the Church and of a radical and total living out to the Gospel." 
