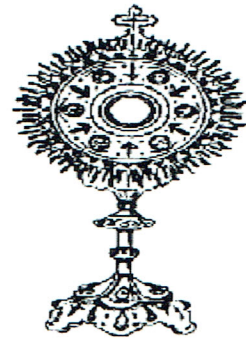
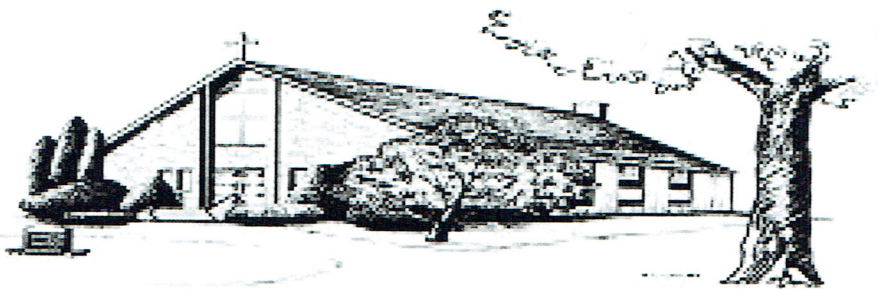

FR. HYDE'S COLUMN

The Catholic Church has always had debates and disagreements about certain issues, in one famous debate between two views on God's knowledge and human free will, the debate between Jesuit and Dominican theologians became so heated that Pope Paul V in 1607 ended the quarrel by forbidding each side to accuse the other of heresy, allowing both views to exist side-by-side in the Catholic Church.

The most recent controversy among Catholics has been about liturgy. For centuries, the Roman rite of the Catholic Church celebrated Mass in Latin. The Second Vatican Council, which met from 1962-1965, decided to allow Mass to be celebrated in local languages, including English. These Masses began around 1967, about the time of my First Holy Communion, and continue today. At least 99% of Catholics attend Masses in their local languages today.

However, some Catholics, including some priests and one bishop, Marcel Lefebvre, from France, founded the Society of Saint Pius X, a group opposed to Masses in local languages and offering the old Mass in Latin. If the language of the Mass had been the only issue, the controversy would have soon been resolved. Unfortunately, Archbishop Lefebvre and his followers opposed many teachings of Vatican II and declared that the Pope and the bishops of the Catholic Church were teaching false doctrine. Their answer to the joke question, "Is the Pope Catholic?," was, "No!"

Locally, there is a Society of Saint Pius X church in Warners, in the old Warners High School building. They have a school as well and have even rented our gym for some of their activities. Pope Leo tried to convince the Society of Saint Pius X not to ordain four of their priests as bishops on July 1st, they went ahead anyway, resulting in automatic excommunication for those involved.

What does this mean for those Catholics who attend the Society of Saint Pius X church in Warners, are they excommunicated? No, but they should not be affiliated with a group that is disobedient to the Pope. Our bishop, Bishop Lucia, has ensured that whoever wants to attend the old Mass in Latin can

do so at Transfiguration Church here in Syracuse, and at St. Mary's Church in Oswego, and at other churches in our diocese. So, no one must attend the Society of Saint Pius X church to experience the old Latin Mass.

Let us pray for church unity and that the Society of Saint Pius X returns to full communion with the Catholic Church under Pope Leo.

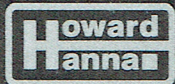
