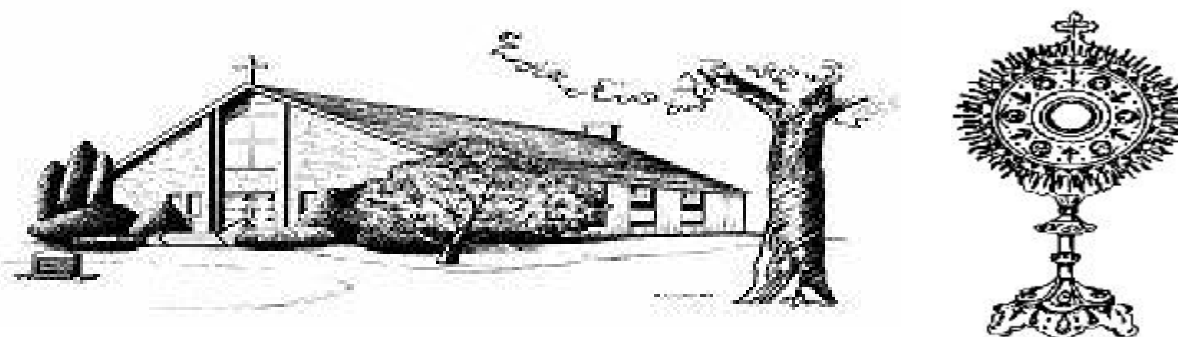

FR. HYDE'S COLUMN

The 250th (semiquincentennial) anniversary of the Declaration of Independence a week ago on July 4th was a celebration of the beginning of the United States of America. The fireworks, parades, documentaries, and dramas are all fine and good, but they obscure the fact that the Declaration was a beginning of a seven-year struggle to secure the independence that Congress declared in that stirring document.

After the Battle of Long Island on August 27, 1776, a major defeat for George Washington and the Continental Army, the British captured New York City. Washington and his army barely escaped and began a long retreat that was only halted with the American victory at the Battle of Trenton, New Jersey on Christmas Day, 1776.

The struggle continued for five years, until the French and American armies won the Battle of Yorktown, Virginia on October 19, 1781. After this the fighting largely died down until the Treaty of Paris was signed on September 3, 1783. The British evacuation of New York City on November 25, 1783 was the real end of the American Revolutionary War.

All this means we are beginning almost a decade of commemoration of 250th anniversaries of the American Revolution. In many ways the celebrations won't end until we celebrate the 250th anniversary of the American Constitution in 2038. We may well say the United States of America is always being refounded.

Currently, people say that they can't remember a time when Americans have been so divided, disagreeing on everything from the President, taxation, immigration and social issues like abortion and euthanasia. Our current divisions, however, are nothing compared to the ones before the Civil War.

The only way we can emerge from our divisions is to recommit ourselves to the core values of the American founding, life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness. Lincoln underlined the importance of the American Revolution in the Gettysburg Address, stating "that this nation, under God, shall have a new birth of freedom—and that government of the people, by the people, for the people, shall not perish from the earth." When Americans begin to insist that Congress, both the House of Representatives and the Senate, resume their central role in governing this country, only then will our divisions moderate. The exaltation of the President into an imperial figure who is supposed to solve all our problems is unworthy of a free people. Our elected representatives and senators are supposed to equal, and many times surpass, the president in power. And Congress can only do its job through the art of compromise, which is how our Constitution is designed to work.

Let's pray that this 250th anniversary helps Americans to take their responsibility as voters seriously and help us to refound once again our great American Experiment!
