FR. HYDE'S COLUMN

Bishop Lucia recently published a letter cautioning all Catholics not to attend the Society of Saint Pius X Masses or participate in their activities, as the society has gone into schism from the Catholic Church. Their priests and bishops are excommunicated and have lost the ability to absolve sins in confession (except in danger of death), and they cannot celebrate valid marriages as well.

Catholics who have attended the Society of Saint Pius X Masses and wish to express sorrow for their previous involvement should go to confession to a Catholic priest in good standing. This matter can be addressed in the confessional.

Such Catholics can attend Traditional Latin Masses at Transfiguration Church in Syracuse. These Masses are fully approved by Pope Leo and our bishop. And, of course, they can attend ordinary Catholic Masses at any local Catholic Church.

If you know anyone attending the Society of Saint Pius X Masses, please encourage them to reconcile with the Catholic Church and no longer support this movement that is working against the Pope and the Church.
