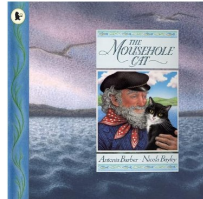


Year 3 Newsletter

English



This half term, we will be looking at the book, 'The Mousehole Cat' by Antonia Barber. The book tells the story of the seaside village of Mousehole in Cornwall, where Mowzer the cat lives happily with old fisherman Tom. Their life is a happy one - until one terrible winter, the Great Storm-Cat comes clawing and snarling and leaping at the harbour walls, so that no boat can go out to sea to fish. Soon, with Christmas coming, there is no food left in Mousehole. It is then that Mowzer and Tom set out to brave the fury of the waves together, and discover that it might just need a cat's perspective to understand - and tame - the ferocious ways of the Great Storm-Cat sea.

Science

This half term, Year Three will be studying 'Light and Shadows'. Through this topic, we will be investigating what we need in order to see objects in a dark place and discover how light travels. We will also investigate shadows, light and reflections



Maths

This half term, we will be continuing to look at addition and subtraction as well as beginning multiplication and division.

Year 3 will be looking at the adding and subtracting 2 and 3-digit numbers using the formal method as well as estimating and using inverse operations.

Additionally, we will be exploring the 3, 4 and 8 times table with both multiplication and division.



Mountains, Rivers and Coasts

Our topic this half term is 'Mountains, Rivers and Coasts'.

Through this topic, we will be learning about:

- The journey of the river
- The water cycle
- Rivers for people
- What are mountains?
