### **BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT GRANT**

The Palmyra Chamber of Commerce surprised three Palmyra Chamber businesses with its first Business Development Grants.

On November 15, a Chamber delegation walked into Katelyn Ferry's Simply Picked Country Store, and presented her with a check for up to \$2500 in matching grant money for improvements to her business. Ferry recently added a new awning on the front of the building and has additional upgrades planned. "Many people don't know that I have paid for this entire store out of my pocket," Ferry said. "It is a huge blessing to receive this grant to be able to move forward and expand my business which I am really wanting to do."

That same week, on November 17, Zane Meyers held a grand opening for Meyers Barber CO. Not only was Meyers bowled over by great turnout for the event, but

The third and final 2022 Palmyra Business Development Grant was awarded December 6 to Leisa Hinkle owner of The Urban Nest. "Thank you so much!" a surprised Hinkle exclaimed. Hinkle is waiting on quotes to upgrade her building's façade.

The the business purpose of development grant is to help businesses open or expand in the city of Palmyra. All applicants must demonstrate the ability to obtain additional financing from customary lenders. Awards were based on Concept & Innovation, Viability, Financials, Sustainability-and Economic Impact. These young entrepreneurs also have access to assistance from Maria Kuhns, Entrepreneurship Specialist with Missouri SBDC at Hannibal Regional Economic Development.
