

NOTICE OF MEETING TO VOTE ON TAX RATE

A tax rate of \$0.100000 per \$100 valuation has been proposed by the governing body of **TRAVIS COUNTY EMERGENCY SERVICES DISTRICT NO. 1**.

PROPOSED TAX RATE	\$0.100000 per \$100
NO-NEW-REVENUE TAX RATE	\$0.105200 per \$100
VOTER-APPROVAL TAX RATE	\$0.110500 per \$100
DE MINIMIS TAX RATE	\$0.112100 per \$100

The no-new-revenue tax rate is the tax rate for the 2026 tax year that will raise the same amount of property tax revenue for Travis County Emergency Services District No. 1 from the same properties in both the 2025 tax year and the 2026 tax year.

The voter-approval rate is the highest tax rate that Travis County Emergency Services District No. 1 may adopt without holding an election to seek voter approval of the rate, unless the de minimis rate for Travis County Emergency Services District No. 1 exceeds the voter-approval rate for Travis County Emergency Services District No. 1.

The de minimis rate is the rate equal to the sum of the no-new-revenue maintenance and operations rate for Travis County Emergency Services District No. 1 the rate that will raise \$500,000, and the current debt rate for Travis County Emergency Services District No. 1.

The proposed tax rate is not greater than the no-new-revenue tax rate. This means that Travis County Emergency Services District No. 1 is not proposing to increase property taxes for the 2026 tax year.

A PUBLIC MEETING TO VOTE ON THE PROPOSED TAX RATE WILL BE HELD ON SEPTEMBER 9, 2026, AT 2:30 PM AT 20624 FM 1431, SUITE 10, LAGO VISTA, TEXAS 78645.

TRAVIS COUNTY EMERGENCY SERVICES DISTRICT NO. 1 SHALL TAKE ACTION ON THE PROPOSED TAX RATE ON SEPTEMBER 9, 2026, AT 2:30 PM FOLLOWING THE HEARING TO BE HELD.

The proposed tax rate is also not greater than the voter-approval tax rate. As a result, Travis County Emergency Services District No. 1 is not required to hold an election at which voters may accept or reject the proposed tax rate. However, you may express your support for or opposition to the proposed tax rate by contacting the members of Travis County Emergency Services District No. 1 at their offices or by attending the public meeting mentioned above.

YOUR TAXES OWED UNDER ANY OF THE RATES MENTIONED ABOVE CAN BE CALCULATED AS FOLLOWS:

$$\text{Property tax amount} = (\text{tax rate}) \times (\text{taxable value of your property}) / 100$$

The 86th Texas Legislature modified the manner in which the voter-approval tax rate is calculated to limit the rate of growth of property taxes in the state.

The following table compares the taxes imposed on the average residence homestead by Travis County Emergency Services District No. 1 last year to the taxes proposed to be imposed on the average residence homestead by Travis County Emergency Services District No. 1 this year.
