Here. Ten minutes outside the expanding cityscape of Rockford and against the backdrop of Midwest prairies and sparse oak savannas is where you'll find here: an oasis for flourishing biodiversity and opportunity for planting seeds into growing minds. When Fannie Severson donated her 369 acre property and deer lodge to the Forest Preserves of Winnebago County in 1975, she knew just how special here really was. But it was the years that followed that brought life into what here would become.

Over the past 50 years, *here* has become equal parts place and community. The vibrant wildflowers have been complemented by laughter of excited children joining us for a field trip. The trees have become

friends with eager hikers during Full Moon Hikes. Thousands upon thousands have entered into nature's classroom and created a community more in tune with the natural world.

Inherently, we are connected to nature. We all coexist and compliment one another in the exchange of energy. It has been our mission to ensure that transfer of energy is a positive one where we can all thrive together. We're thankful that our community has transferred their energy to Severson Dells and has helped us thrive for the past 50 years.

Take a journey with us back in time. Here are 50 of our favorite moments over the past 50-ish years.

- **1. April 30, 1975.** Fannie Severson donates the property now known as Severson Dells.
- **2. June 26, 1976.** Severson Dells Forest Preserves opens to the public.
- **3. 1977.** Severson Dells hires their first Naturalist, Vicky Nuzzo.
- **4. December 19, 1978.** Severson Dells Education Foundation is legally incorporated by the IRS as a nonprofit organization.
- **5. 1980.** The Education Center opens to the public after renovations.
- **6. August 1980.** Notes from the Dells newsletter is established by John Alesandrini, Coordinator & Naturalist.
- 7. 1980s. Ranger Rick's Nature Club is formed introducing kids to natural resources and areas in Northern Illinois.
- **8. Summer 1981.** "Back to the Land" is established as a mix between workshops and articles to educate about the environment.
- 9. September 11, 1981. The Rockford DAR dedicates a plaque indicating the "Elijah Holt House" as the oldest residence in Winnebago township.
- **10. 1982.** Severson Dells begins hosting a Wildlife Art Show highlighting local talent and nature.
- **11. September 1982.** Part of the property is designated as an Illinois State Nature Preserve.
- resources program at the old Severson Dells Dairy Farm, & establish a spin-off of Ranger Rick's called Farmer Fred's.
- 13. April 26, 1985. John Severson & Jo Severson Haag, children of Harry & Fannie Severson, are awarded the Seth B. Atwood Memorial Park & Conservation Award for their continuation of their parents' dedication to conservation.
- **14. 1986.** Severson Dells celebrates 10 years. In a 'Notes from the Dells' issue, the Foundation had 3 employees and 35 volunteers.

- 15. 1988. The paved loop trail is completed.
- **16. October 29, 1989.** 'Eco-Halloween Hike' is held, which has evolved over the years and is now known as 'Spook the Dells.'
- 17. 1992. Guided school field trips and experiences begin, helping to establish our legacy as the leaders of experiential nature education in Rockford.
- **18. December 7, 1991.** An early version of Luminaria is established as 'Luminary Walk'.
- 19. 1993. Early look into in-school field trips includes Sally Salamander, Owl Moon, Treasurers of the Deep, Prairie Promises, The Five R's, and Whitetails.
- **20. 1994.** Classroom space is added to the nature center to expand space for education.
- **21. 1995.** Severson Dells Education Foundation endowment fund reaches \$1,000,000.
- **22. June 10, 1995.** The butterfly garden is planted by generous volunteers.
- **23. 1997.** The bird log (now located in the Exhibit Hall) notes 120 different species of birds.
- **24. Summer 1998.** An early record of summer camp is themed 'The Why, Where, and How of Animals at Severson Dells'
- 25. August 12, 1998. The Perseids meteor shower is gazed upon at 'Family Star Gazing Night'. Now, we offer a similar program as 'Pastries & Perseids'!
- **26. October 1998.** Don Miller, former coordinator of the nature center, is awarded the Illinois Environmental Educator.
- **27. 2000.** School field trip programs begin to include the "Low Waste Lunch" program to help students connect everyday choices to the environment.
- **28. Spring 2000.** Music from the Dells is established to blend nature and the arts.
- **29. Fall 2000.** Intern Courtney Clark on the power of experiential education writes: "Learning

about wild places, exploring them, and having fun while doing all of this is what leads to a personal understanding of and connectedness to the

natural world. You can tell a kid (or an adult) a hundred times that insects are fascinating or wildflowers are beautiful, but unless he sees and experiences these things for himself, he'll never really know... or care."

- **30. June 18-22, 2001.** Blazing Paddles is offered for the first time.
- 31. March 7, 2002. Severson Dells Education Foundation celebrates the organization's 25<sup>th</sup> year anniversary with speaker Bill Walton, NBA Hall of Famer.
- **32. 2005.** The Historic Bird Display, now found in the Exhibit Hall, is donated. If you haven't seen this display, stop in to see a preserved Passenger pigeon, extinct since 1914.
- **33. October 6-9 2005.** We host The Wonders and Experience of Nature weekend featuring hikes, workshops, and guest authors, inc;uding Robin Kimmerer.
- **34. June 19-21, 2006.** Peek-into-Creek is offered for the first time.
- **35. November 2006.** The 30th Anniversary of Severson Dells is marked with the singing of "Happy Birthday Severson Dells" by Jackson School in Rockford.
- **36. 2009.** The patio is installed, including memorial paver bricks.
- **37. 2013.** A branding transition is made utilizing the blue and green circle logo with the head and neck of a heron in the shape of an 'S'.
- **38. Fall 2013.** James Marshall begins bringing undergraduate students from Rockford University to study birds. Dr. Marshall still returns each year with students.
- **39. August 9, 2014.** The Grove Nature Playscape is opened to the public.
- **40. 2016.** Severson Dells celebrates 40 years with a weekend of activities for all to enjoy.

- **41. 2018.** Dance at the Dells begins hosting performances, creating an immersive art & nature experience.
- **42.2019.** Ann Wasser, current Executive Director, is awarded the Outstanding New Leader Award by Association of Nature Center Administrators, helping to continue the Severson Dells' legacy.
- **43. Fall 2019.** We became a host site for the AmeriCorps program to expand program capactiy and train the next generation of environmental leaders.
- **44. Spring 2020.** We join 1% for the Planet, in dedication to global environmentalism.
- **45. Spring 2020.** Severson Dells begins coordinating the Rock River Valley team for City Nature Challenge, helping to contribute to nature research data collection
- **46. September 25, 2021.** Severson Dells celebrates 45 years by establishing Golden Hour in the Grove.
- **47. 2023.** A partnership is established with City of Rockford Water Management Division and Four Rivers Sanitation Authority providing water management education to Rockford students.
- **48. September 20, 2024.** Severson Dells Education Foundation purchases the former Elliot Golf Course with plans for restoration.
- **49. Spring 2025.** The Rich Toppe Memorial Scholarship program is created to help children attend field trips and camp programs.
- **50. December 2025.** We're wrapping up our 49th year at this preserve, hoping you'll join us for the 25th annual Luminaria!

This list highlights just some of the events that have made Severson Dells Nature Center who we are today. We invite you to visit us during our 50th year and share your Severson story with us. We hope that over the next 50 years (and many more) that you and your friends and family will join us here. This community has brought Fannie Severson's vision for what this place could be to life: protecting the land while also providing a space and opportunities for nature education for all in the community. We hope that she would be proud of what her family's home and land has become for this region.

Often, you'll hear echoes of our community talking of 'magic' when you step onto the loop trail. For some, the trees form a tunnel or a portal to a place where the birds sing and the wildflowers dance and the sun shines just in your path, holding you, uplifting you, and awakening your own personal fairytale. These aren't just tales of something other-worldly; these are the very real life experiences we hear of everyday at Severson Dells.

Yet another fairytale amongst us is the **story of Judy and Ed Uchno.** 

As a young girl, Judy grew a deep love for nature. Not having much, her mother encouraged her to find the joy in the natural world. Doing just that, Judy would sit upon the Memorial Bridge at Severson Dells and dream of her future while finding comfort listening to the stream of Hall Creek below her. Shortly after, Judy met Ed. Like anyone would do, Judy introduced Ed to her old friends, but to Judy this old friend was a place: the bridge at Severson Dells.

The Memorial Bridge later became where Judy and Ed held their wedding on May 12, 1984.

Surrounded by generous friends, an arch was built from vines above the bridge symbolizing Judy and Ed's passage into their new life together. They were married at dawn to symbolize a new beginning. Another friend played the flute to which the birds responded in song. Visions of Lilies of the Valley bloomed around them as a symbol of good luck.

The old saying goes, 'if these walls could talk...'. But, if that bridge could talk, it would tell quite the story of that day.

Thirty and a half years later, their daughter, Anna, was married at the Severson Dells shelter house on August 22, 2015 to her husband, John. Now, the Uchnos bring their young grandson, Henry to Severson and walk across that same bridge. They've also helped to install a bench near the bridge for all to sit in this magical spot and find the same joy they have. As a family, Ed, Judy, Anna, Henry, and John have enjoyed Severson together including Spook the Dells, and Judy is looking forward to Grandparent's Camp this next year.

Over 40 years after Judy and Ed's day of magic at Severson, it's safe to say the luck from the Lillies of the Valley was in abundance.

## **Extending the Magic**

Judy and Ed have extended the magic that Severson has given them towards our greater Severson community.

Have you joined us for Spook the Dells and met our nocturnal animal actors in the past few years?

Have you visited Pollinator Palooza and taken pictures in our flower or monarch photo boards?

Or maybe seen a staff member buzzing around in a bee costume?

Or have you joined us for our Fungi Funday Science Saturday or Predator Prey Science Saturday or visited the craft station during these events? If you answered yes to any of these questions, then you've experienced the depth of Judy and Ed's gifts to Severson Dells.

From opossum costumes to mushroom hats and more, the Uchnos have helped thousands of visitors experience the same magic that they also know nature can hold. And these costumes and photo boards aren't just for our young learners, they're also for us adults, too.

In fact, Judy notes that she learns something each time she visits or volunteers at a Science Saturday. Last year, we challenged her to help us create a station relating the fibonacci spiral that is found so often in nature to something our young learners could cling onto. That Science Saturday lesson has stuck with her, and she says she often notices the fibonacci spiral when she takes the time to look upon the wildflowers in her prairie.

More than that, Judy says she learns from the kids who visit her station during Science Saturdays, as well. "You can bring the activity and kids will bring their magic and uplift it into amazing things. Every Science Saturday is just inspirational."

## **Inspired by Nature**

Severson's impact on the Uchnos has reached even further. Their love of the nature center inspired them to move out into the countryside where they'd be able to have their own place of magic everyday. What was once a conventionally-maintained lawn, Ed has worked to turn into a haven for wildlife. They worked with IDNR's Acres for Wildlife program and were able to plant 500

trees planted on the front section of their property. They also have a prairie and cut plants area surrounding their home, and this 'rewilding' of the space has definitely attracted an increase of biodiversity.

"If you build it, they will come," the Uchnos joked.

Ed talks of a recent book they read: Nature's Best Hope: A New Approach to Conservation that Starts in Your Yard by Doug Tallamy. The book mentions that you can have your own homegrown national park. Ed and Judy have done just that.

## "Severson is a ray of sunshine"

... Ed says. The Uchno's motivation to support Severson Dells is simple for them. They want the magic of this place to be experienced by everyone. "I don't want flowers when I die, give money to Severson instead," Judy jokes. Judy and Ed are supporters of Severson Dells because they want the experience to continue for all of us.

The little increments are what matters most, they note. Volunteering your time or donating monetarily if you're able in whatever amount makes an impact.

"Too often, we're focused on gold this and gold that, but I was walking through the prairie and seeing all the golden rod and I thought - 'this is the gold that is valuable'."

We're incredibly grateful that Judy and Ed have found the magic in the gold at Severson Dells. Their contributions to our community have been plentiful. They have been and will continue to be loved and loved for generations to come.

## Find the Magic

Judy and Ed still walk the path at Severson on their anniversary, listening for the birds to once again sing them a song. This past year, they heard 34 different species of birds guiding their path back to that same magical bridge where they entered into their life together and inevitably joined their lives with ours here at Severson Dells.



As we wrap up our 50th year amongst this magical backdrop of the towering dells, streaming Hall Creek, and dancing prairie, we invite all of you to take a stroll through the portal of trees to find your own personal fairytale at Severson Dells. And once you find it, contribute and help us to help others experience the joy of Severson Dells.

Ed leaves us with this: "If you get them there, you've won. You'll see how special this place is once you're here."
