

CLERGY MESSAGE

THIS WEEK: REV. MSGR. ROMULO VERGARA — PASTOR



Well, this reading from this Gospel offers an answer, and two things stand out right away.

First, he came into our world to teach. The setting is the synagogue at Capernaum. Jesus began his ministry in a familiar place, a sacred space, one steeped in Jewish tradition and devotion. There, the one who is The Word fulfilled and preached the word — doing it so powerfully that people marveled at his authority.

But second, he came into our world to heal. He came to effect change. To convert hearts. To transform the world. And he started by calling out what was unclean — and making a broken man once again whole.

This is the first recorded miracle in Marks' Gospel. It won't be the last. Mark describes about 20 miracles and healings. They make up nearly a third of his Gospel. In fact, over the next two Sundays, we'll hear Mark's accounts of other miracles, one after another, all leading us into the sacred season of Lent.

These miraculous healings illustrate Christ's power over our wounded world. Our present world is wounded in so many ways — troubled by so many unclean spirits. The spirit of hate and division. Of greed and pride. There is the unclean spirit of violence and rage. And, threaded throughout so much of it: a spirit of helplessness and despair.

Yet, into this fallen world, haunted by destructive and unclean spirits, comes the son of God, bearing Good News of salvation. As the psalm before the Gospel reminded us, in an echo of Christmas: "In a land overshadowed by death, light has arisen."

And so we cry out, "What have you to do with us, Jesus?"


In this first miracle of the first Gospel, Christ shows us. He comes to silence the unclean spirit, to restore wholeness and dignity and hope. He comes to calm the anxious and release the imprisoned. He comes to give strength to the weak. To bring sight to the blind.

To help all of us who are lame find the strength to walk and follow the path the early Christians called "The Way" — the path of compassion and mercy and love.

What have you to do with us, Jesus? The answer is, of course: everything.

I wish you and your loved ones' blessings of good health and new hope. Please continue to pray, and act, for peace,

Pues bien, la lectura de este Evangelio ofrece una respuesta, y dos cosas saltan a la vista de inmediato.

En primer lugar, vino a nuestro mundo para enseñar. El escenario es la sinagoga de Cafarnaún. Jesús comenzó su ministerio en un lugar familiar, un espacio sagrado, impregnado de tradición y devoción judías. Allí, el que es la Palabra cumplió y predicó la Palabra, y lo hizo con tanta fuerza que la gente se maravilló de su autoridad.

Pero en segundo lugar, vino a nuestro mundo para curar. Vino para cambiar las cosas. Para convertir corazones. Para transformar el mundo. Y empezó por extirpar lo impuro y sanar a un hombre destrozado.

Este es el primer milagro registrado en el Evangelio de Marcos. No será el último. Marcos describe una veintena de milagros y curaciones. Constituyen casi un tercio de su Evangelio. De hecho, durante los dos próximos domingos, escucharemos los relatos de Marcos de otros milagros, uno tras otro, todos ellos conduciéndonos al tiempo sagrado de la Cuaresma.

Estas curaciones milagrosas ilustran el poder de Cristo sobre nuestro mundo herido. Nuestro mundo actual está herido de muchas maneras, atormentado por tantos espíritus inmundos. El espíritu del odio y la división. De codicia y orgullo. El espíritu impuro de la violencia y la ira. Y, en medio de todo ello: un espíritu de impotencia y desesperación.

Sin embargo, a este mundo caído, acechado por espíritus destructivos e inmundos, llega el Hijo de Dios, portador de la Buena Nueva de la salvación. Como nos recuerda el salmo que precede al Evangelio, en un eco de Navidad: "En una tierra ensombrecida por la muerte, ha surgido la luz".

Y por eso gritamos: "¿Qué tienes que ver con nosotros, Jesús?".

En este primer milagro del primer Evangelio, Cristo nos lo muestra. Viene a acallar el espíritu inmundo, a devolver la integridad, la dignidad y la esperanza. Viene a calmar a los ansiosos y a liberar a los encarcelados. Viene a dar fuerza a los débiles. Para devolver la vista a los ciegos.

Para ayudarnos a todos los cojos a encontrar la fuerza para caminar y seguir la senda que los primeros cristianos llamaban "El Camino", la senda de la compasión, la misericordia y el amor.

¿Qué tienes que ver con nosotros, Jesús? La respuesta es, por supuesto: todo.

Te deseo a ti y a tus seres queridos bendiciones de buena salud y nueva esperanza. Por favor, seguid rezando, y actuando, por la paz,






