The Lord said to his disciples: "I have come to set the earth on fire, and how I wish it were already blazing! (Lk. 12:49)

In the Bible, fire symbolizes several meanings: God's presence, purification, judgment, and the Holy Spirit in the New Testament. Fire can express divine power and justice, or cause destruction or transformation.

In the context of the gospel today, The Lord refers to fire as transforming, refining and purifying.

In reality, the teachings of the Lord changed his audience. Some received him, believed in him and followed him. While others rejected him and left him; and still others condemn him.

In His teaching on the Bread of Life (Jn. 6), The Lord said:

I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world." (Jn. 6:51)

Many of His followers found his teaching hard to believe. And so:

As a result of this, many [of] his disciples returned to their former way of life and no longer accompanied him. (Jn. 6:66)

The teachings of the Lord may be accepted or rejected. And because we are free to make the choice whether follow Him or leave Him, believe him or reject Him, not everyone will have the same decision. In effect, this could cause conflict and division even among family members. Some of them could be our loved ones.

The Lord in the gospel today, in all honesty, told his audience what can possibly happen with the choice that we make in our faith in the Lord.

Do you have this experience?

Jesús dijo a sus discípulos: "He venido a traer fuego a la tierra, ¡y cuánto desearía que ya estuviera ardiendo! Tengo que recibir un bautismo, ¡y cómo me angustio mientras llega! (Lc. 12:49)

En la Biblia, el fuego simboliza varios significados: la presencia de Dios, la purificación, el juicio y en el Nuevo Testamento, el Espíritu Santo. El fuego puede expresar el poder divino y la justicia, o causar destrucción o transformación

En el contexto del evangelio de hoy, el Señor se refiere al fuego como transformador, refinador y purificador.

De hecho, las enseñanzas del Señor cambiaron a su audiencia. Algunos lo recibieron, creyeron en él y lo siguieron. Mientras que otros lo rechazaron y lo dejaron; y otros lo condenan.

En Su enseñanza sobre el Pan de Vida (Jn. 6), El Señor dijo:

51 Yo soy el pan vivo bajado del cielo. El que coma de este pan vivirá eternamente, y el pan que yo daré es mi carne para la Vida del mundo." (Jn. 6:51)

Muchos de sus seguidores encontraron su enseñanza difícil de creer.

Desde ese momento, muchos de sus discípulos se alejaron de él y dejaron de acompañarlo. (Jn. 6:66)

Las enseñanzas del Señor pueden ser aceptadas o rechazadas. Y debido a que somos libres de tomar la decisión de seguirlo o dejarlo, creerle o rechazarlo, no todos tendrán la misma decisión. En efecto, esto podría causar conflicto y división entre los miembros de la familia. Algunos de ellos podrían ser nuestros seres queridos.

El Señor en el evangelio de hoy, con toda honestidad, le dijo a su audiencia lo que puede suceder con la elección que hacemos en nuestra fe en el Señor.

SAINTS of the Week

St. Bernard (Aug. 20)

Born of noble parentage in Burgundy, France. After the death of his mother, he joined the very austere institute of the Cistercian Order. Together with 12 monks he found a new monastery, which became known as the Abbey of Clairvaux. The reputation of St. Bernard spread far and wide; even the Popes were governed by his advice. He was commissioned by Pope Eugene III to preach the second Crusade. (https://www.catholic.org)

St. Pope Pius X (Aug. 21)*

Pope Pius X is perhaps best remembered for his encouragement of the frequent reception of Holy Communion, especially by children.

The second of 10 children in a poor Italian family, Joseph Sarto became Pius X at age 68. Ever mindful of his humble origin, Pope Pius stated, "I was born poor, I lived poor, I will die poor."

On the 11th anniversary of his election as pope, Europe was plunged into World War I. Pius had foreseen it, but it killed him. "This is the last affliction the Lord will visit on me. I would gladly give my life to save my poor children from this ghastly scourge." He died a few weeks after the war began, and was canonized in 1954.

The Queenship of Mary (August 22)*

Pope Pius XII established this feast in 1954. But the **Blessed Virgin Mary**'s queenship has roots in Scripture. At the Annunciation, Gabriel announced that Mary's Son would receive the throne of David and rule forever. At the Visitation, Elizabeth calls Mary "mother of my Lord." As in all the mysteries of Mary's life, she is closely associated with Jesus: Her queenship is a share in Jesus' kingship. The feast is a logical follow-up to the Assumption, and is now celebrated on the octave day of that feast. In his 1954 encyclical *To the Queen of Heaven*, Pius XII points out that Mary deserves the title because she is Mother of God, because she is closely associated as the New Eve with Jesus' redemptive work, because of her preeminent perfection, and because of her intercessory power.

St. Rose of Lima (August 23)*

She was born to parents of Spanish descent in Lima, Peru, at a time when South America was in its first century of evangelization. She is known for her beauty and excessive practice of mortification.

During the last few years of her life, Rose set up a room in the house where she cared for homeless children, the elderly, and the sick.

When she died at 31, the city turned out for her funeral.

Catechism of the Catholic Church

THE SACRAMENTS OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION

1212 The sacraments of Christian initiation - Baptism, Confirmation, and the Eucharist - lay the foundations of every Christian life.

"The sharing in the divine nature given to men through the grace of Christ bears a certain likeness to the origin, development, and nourishing of natural life. the faithful are born anew by Baptism, strengthened by the sacrament of Confirmation, and receive in the Eucharist the food of eternal life.

By means of these sacraments of Christian initiation, they thus receive in increasing measure the treasures of the divine life and advance toward the perfection of charity."

Seekers and inquirers are non-baptized adults who desire to be fully initiated into the Catholic Church and baptized adult Christians who desire full communion in the Catholic Church.

JUBILEE YEAR OF HOPE

Pope Francis has designated the 2025 Holy Year as a time to renew ourselves as "Pilgrims of Hope." The Jubilee Year of Hope, also known as Jubilee 2025, concludes on January 6, 2026, which is the Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord. The year began with the opening of the Holy Door of St. Peter's Basilica on December 24, 2024.

The Vatican issued a decree* in May 2024 outlining the different ways that Catholics may obtain the Plenary Indulgence during the 2025 Jubilee Holy Year.
