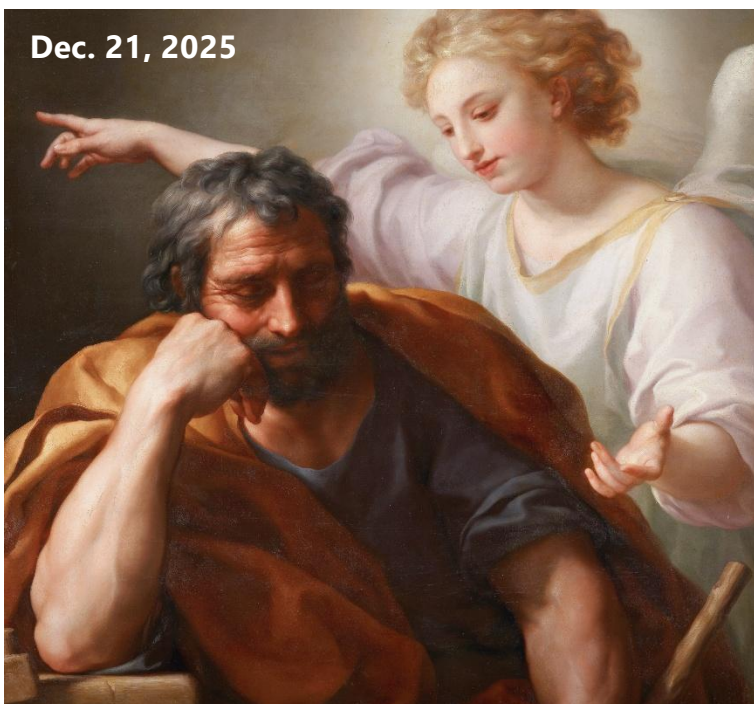

Clergy Message

The Fourth Sunday of Advent invites us to quiet our hearts and remember that Jesus is near. We wait with hope and joy, confident that God is coming to be with us.

In our reading from Isaiah, God speaks to Ahaz, king of Judah. Ahaz was unfaithful, worshiping false gods—even to the point of sacrificing his own son. When God invited him to ask for a sign, Ahaz replied, “I will not tempt the Lord.” In truth, he had already decided to rely on foreign alliances rather than trust in God.

In response, Isaiah proclaimed that God himself would give a sign: “A virgin shall conceive, and bear a son, and shall name him Emmanuel.” Ahaz’s rejection of God’s authority would lead to Judah’s eventual exile, yet God’s plan could not be thwarted.

Remarkably, this prophecy is fulfilled in Mary. She opens her heart to God’s word when the Angel Gabriel announces God’s plan: “Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord. Let it be to me according to your word.” Ahaz said, “I will not ask.” Mary said, “Let it be done.” Which voice will we echo this Advent?

In our Gospel reading, we see Joseph’s a righteous response to the Lord: “When Joseph awoke, he did as the angel of the Lord had commanded him and took his wife into his home.”

Advent calls us to choose trust over self-reliance. While we may be tempted to go our own way, like Ahaz, let us instead follow Mary and Joseph’s example in saying yes to God’s will. Through Emmanuel, God is always with us. When we trust Him, we discover that the sign is not only given, it is living among us, dwelling in our homes and hearts.

El cuarto domingo de Adviento nos invita a calmar nuestro corazón y recordar que Jesús está cerca. Esperamos con esperanza y alegría, confiados en que Dios viene a estar con nosotros.

En la lectura de P. Isaías, Dios habla con Ajaz, rey de Judá. Ajaz fue infiel, adorando a dioses falsos—incluso hasta el punto de sacrificar a su propio hijo. Cuando Dios lo invitó a pedir una señal, Ajaz respondió: “No tentaré al Señor”. En verdad, él ya había decidido confiar en alianzas extranjeras en lugar de confiar en Dios.

En la respuesta, Isaías proclamó que Dios mismo daría una señal: «La virgen concebirá y dará a luz a un hijo, y lo llamará Emmanuel.» El rechazo de Ajaz de la autoridad de Dios llevaría al eventual exilio de Judá, sin embargo, el plan de Dios no podría ser frustrado.

Sorprendentemente, esta profecía se cumple en La Virgen. Ella abre su corazón a la palabra de Dios cuando el ángel Gabriel anuncia el plan de Dios: “He aquí, yo soy la sierva del Señor. Hágase en mí según tu palabra”. Acáz dijo: «No voy a preguntar». María dijo: «Hágase». ¿Qué voz diremos este Adviento?

En la lectura del Evangelio, vemos la respuesta justa de San José al Señor: “Cuando José despertó de aquel sueño, hizo lo que le había mandado el ángel del Señor y recibió a su esposa.”

El Adviento nos llama a elegir la confianza sobre la autosuficiencia. Aunque podamos ser tentados a seguir nuestro propio camino, como Ajaz, sigamos el ejemplo de María y José al decir SI a la voluntad de Dios. A través de Emmanuel, Dios siempre está con nosotros. Cuando confiamos en Él, descubrimos que la señal no solo se da, sino que vive entre nosotros, habitando en nuestros hogares y corazones.

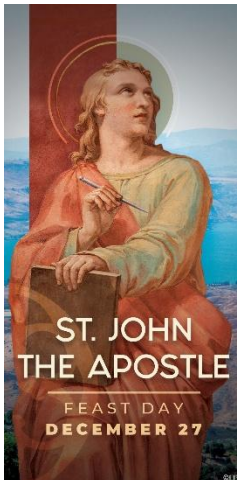
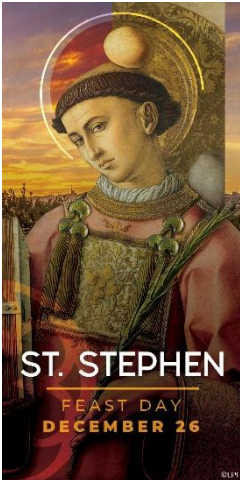

Catechism of the Catholic Church **JESUS CHRIST**

452 The name Jesus means "God saves". the child born of the Virgin Mary is called Jesus, "for he will save his people from their sins" (Mt 1:21): "there is no other name under heaven given among men by which we must be saved" (Acts 4:12).

453 The title "Christ" means "Anointed One" (Messiah). Jesus is the Christ, for "God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power" (Acts 10:38). He was the one "who is to come" (Lk 7:19), the object of "the hope of Israel" (Acts 28:20).

454 The title "Son of God" signifies the unique and eternal relationship of Jesus Christ to God his Father: he is the only Son of the Father (cf Jn 1:14, 18; 3:16, 18); he is God himself (cf Jn 1:1). To be a Christian, one must believe that Jesus Christ is the Son of God (cf Acts 8:37; 1 Jn 2:23).

455 The title "Lord" indicates divine sovereignty. To confess or invoke Jesus as Lord is to believe in his divinity. "No one can say 'Jesus is Lord' except by the Holy Spirit" (1 Cor 12:3).

Prayers to Sts. Joseph and Mary

Remember, O most gracious Virgin Mary, that never was it known that anyone who fled to thy protection, implored thy help, or sought thine intercession was left unaided.

Inspired by this confidence, I fly unto thee, O Virgin of virgins, my mother; to thee do I come, before thee I stand, sinful and sorrowful. O Mother of the Word Incarnate, despise not my petitions, but in thy mercy hear and answer me. Amen.

Hail, Guardian of the Redeemer, Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

To you God entrusted his only Son; in you Mary placed her trust; with you Christ became man.

Blessed **Joseph**, to us too, show yourself a father and guide us in the path of life. Obtain for us grace, mercy and courage, and defend us from every evil. Amen.

Baptism & Confirmation

The parents are the first and primary ministers of faith because of their central position during the formative years of the child's life. Through their daily contact with the child, they will share their faith and help the child discover the Father's loving presence in all creation. For this environment to exist the parents must live lives rooted in faith.

WHO MAY BE GODPARENTS?

Baptism:

1184.1 He/she is a baptized, confirmed, and active Catholic who is able to receive the sacraments.

1184.2 He/she is in frequent contact with the parents and is capable of encouraging them and their child to live the faith.

1184.3 A baptized, confirmed, and active member of the Orthodox Church may be a Godparent. In such a case an Orthodox Priest must be consulted because of ecumenical considerations. Members of other Christian Churches may be Christian witnesses to the Baptism.

Confirmation:

1243.1 Sponsors: The ordinary practice is that there be individual sponsors for each candidate being confirmed. It is desirable that the Godparent at Baptism be the sponsor at Confirmation to better express the relationship between Baptism and Confirmation. Parents may present their children for Confirmation and in this way be sponsor. The sponsor for any candidate may be male or female.

1243.2 Pastors will see that the sponsor, chosen by the candidate, is spiritually qualified for the office. The sponsor should be sufficiently mature for this role, belong to the Catholic Church and have been initiated in the three Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and the Eucharist. The sponsor should also be a person of faith, actively participating in the life of the Church, especially by receiving the Eucharist regularly.

1243.3 The sponsor should be of an age and living proximity that will enable the sponsor to be present to the candidate as he/she grows in the life of faith. The custom of having proxy sponsors for someone who is and who will continue to be separated by long distances from the candidate is discouraged.

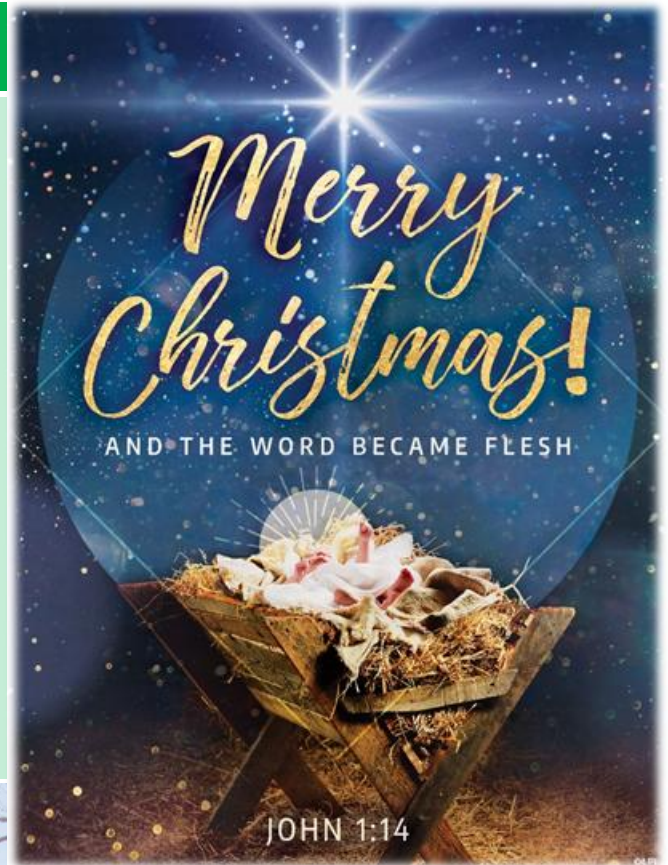
