

## CLERGY MESSAGE

### Rev. Fr. Andy De Guzman – Parochial Vicar



#### **Martha and Mary** (Lk. 10:38-42)

38 As they continued their journey, he entered a village where a woman whose name was Martha welcomed him.

39 She had a sister named Mary [who] sat beside the Lord at his feet listening to him speak.

The gospel today speaks about two women close to Jesus: the siblings Martha and Mary of

Bethany. According to the biblical tradition, they together with their brothers Lazarus were

friends with the Lord. In fact, the apostle John attests:

Now Jesus loved Martha and her sister and Lazarus. (Jn. 11:5)

In the story, Martha was in the kitchen. The most important guest she has ever entertained came

to her house. She wanted to please her guest. She wanted to give the best.

Can you relate to Martha? Perhaps when you have guests especially important ones, you

would do the same, wouldn't you?

And then Mary, in the words of Luke sitting down at the feet of Jesus – listening. What does this mean?

It symbolizes a posture of learning, discipleship, and intimacy. Moreover, it was a

common practice in Jewish culture for disciples to sit at the feet of their rabbi to receive

instruction.

In the New Testament, this is notably exemplified by Mary of Bethany, who chose to sit

at Jesus feet and listen to him, while her sister Martha was occupied with other tasks.

What Martha did was good. To do something good for someone is a virtue. In this story, the

Lord highlighted what is better. For the Lord it is the better part.

"Mary has chosen the better part and it will not be taken from her." (v. 42)

What is the better part? To sit at the feet of Jesus and listen to Him.

Being with the Lord and listening to Him precedes good deeds for the Lord. It precedes

hospitality and charity.

This emphasizes the importance of prayer and reflection of God's word. Whenever we

read and reflect on the Word of God, He speaks to us and we learn from Him, like a teacher

teaching his student.

Spending time with God and learning from Him should be a priority. Let us make it a daily

commitment. Let us make it part of our daily activities.

#### Marta y Maria (Lc. 10:38-42)

38 Entró Jesús en un poblado, y una mujer, llamada Marta, lo recibió en su casa.

39 Ella tenía una hermana, llamada María, la cual se sentó a los pies de Jesús y se puso a escuchar su palabra.

La historia de hoy habla de dos mujeres íntimas al Señor Jesús: las hermanas Marta y María de

Betania. Según la tradición bíblica, ellas, junto con sus hermanos Lázaro, eran amigos del Señor.

De hecho, el apóstol Juan dijo:

Jesús quería mucho a Marta, a su hermana y a Lázaro. (Jn. 11:5)

Marta estaba en la cocina. El invitado más importante que ha recibido en su vida llegó a su casa.

Ella quería complacer a su invitado. Quería darle lo mejor.

¿Se identifica usted con Marta? Quizás cuando tiene invitados, especialmente lo

importante, haría lo mismo, verdad?

Y María, en las palabras de Lucas, "se sentó a los pies de Jesús y se puso a escuchar su

palabra." ¿Qué significa esto?

Simboliza una postura de aprendizaje, discipulado e intimidad. Tambien era una práctica

común en la cultura judía que los discípulos se sentaran a los pies de su maestro para recibir

instrucción.

En el Nuevo Testamento, esto se ilustra notablemente por María de Betania, que eligió

sentarse a los pies de Jesús y escuchar a El, mientras que su hermana Marta estaba ocupada con

otras tareas.

Lo que hizo Marta fue bueno. Hacer algo bueno por alguien es una virtud. En esta historia, el

Señor enfatizó lo que es mejor. Para El Señor es la mejor parte: *María eligió la mejor parte, que no le será quitada*. (v. 42)

¿Cuál es la mejor parte? Sentarse a los pies de Jesús y escucharlo. Estar con el Señor y escucharlo precede/antecede a las buenas obras para el Señor.

Precede a la hospitalidad y a la caridad.

Esto enfatiza la importancia de la oración y la reflexión de la palabra de Dios. Cada vez

que leemos y reflexionamos sobre la Palabra de Dios, Él nos habla y aprendemos de Él, como un

maestro enseñando a su estudiante.

Pasar tiempo con Dios y aprender de Él debe ser una prioridad. Hagámoslo un

compromiso diario. Hagámoslo parte de nuestras actividades diarias.

## **SAINTS FOR THE WEEK**

### St. Mary Magdalene (July 22)

Mary Magdalene, that is, "of Magdala," was the one from whom Christ cast out "seven demons" (Luke 8:2)—an indication at the worst, of extreme demonic possession or possibly, severe illness. Writing in the *New Catholic Commentary*, Father Wilfrid J. Harrington, O.P., says that "seven demons" "does not mean that Mary had lived an immoral life—a conclusion reached only by means of a mistaken identification with the anonymous woman of Luke 7:36." Mary Magdalene was one of the many "who were assisting them [Jesus and the Twelve] out of their means." She was one of those who stood by the cross of Jesus with his mother. And, of all the "official" witnesses who might have been chosen for the first awareness of the Resurrection, she was the one to whom that privilege was given. She is known as the "Apostle to the Apostles."

### St. James (July 25)

This James is the brother of John the Evangelist. The two were called by Jesus as they worked with their father in a fishing boat on the Sea of Galilee. They left their father Zebedee in the boat along with the hired men and followed him" (Mark 1:19-20). He was one of the favored three who had the privilege of witnessing the Transfiguration, the raising to life of the daughter of Jairus, and the agony in Gethsemani. James was apparently the first of the apostles to be martyred. "About that time King Herod laid hands upon some members of the church to harm them. He had James, the brother of John, killed by the sword, and when he saw that this was pleasing to the Jews he proceeded to arrest Peter also" (Acts 12:1-3a). This James, sometimes called James the Greater, is not to be confused with James the Lesser or with the author of the *Letter of James* and the leader of the Jerusalem community.

### Sts. Joachim and Anne (July 26)

In the Scriptures, Matthew and Luke furnish a legal family history of Jesus, tracing ancestry to show that Jesus is the culmination of great promises. Not only is his mother's family neglected, we also know nothing factual about them except that they existed. The names "Joachim" and "Anne" come from a legendary source written more than a century after Jesus died. The strong character of Mary in making decisions, her continuous practice of prayer, her devotion to the laws of her faith, her steadiness at moments of crisis, and her devotion to her relatives—all indicate a close-knit, loving family that looked forward to the next generation even while retaining the best of the past.
