

Have you noticed the Parish Shield or Coat of Arms at the entrance of the church?

- The Crown symbolizes Mary as Queen of Carmel.
- The Brown Mountain represents Mount Carmel, the birthplace of the Carmelite Order, signifying contemplation and prayer.
- The Cross signifies Christ's redemption.
- The three Stars represent Mary (center), and prophets Elijah and Elisha.
- The heart is an addition to the traditional Carmelite Shield likely referring to the Sacred Heart of Jesus.
- The blue stream of water flowing from the heart is also an addition that might represent the living water which is the Holy Spirit. (CCC 2652)

## Gospel Message

Today's page from the Gospel emphasizes that, when Jesus had received baptism from John in the River Jordan, "the heavens were opened" to him (Mt 3:16). This fulfills the prophecies. In fact, there is an invocation which the liturgy has us repeat during the Season of Advent: "O that thou wouldst rend the heavens and come down" (Is 64:1). If the heavens remain closed, our horizon in this earthly life is dark and without hope. Instead, in celebrating Christmas, once again faith has given us the certainty that the heavens have been rent with the coming of Christ. And on the day of the baptism of Christ we continue to contemplate the heavens opened. The manifestation of the Son of God on earth marks the beginning of the great time of mercy, after sin had closed the heavens, raising itself as a barrier between the human being and his Creator. With the birth of Jesus the heavens open! God gives us in Christ the guarantee of an indestructible love. From the moment the Word became flesh it is therefore possible to see the open heavens.

When Jesus received the baptism of repentance from John the Baptism, showing solidarity with the repentant people — He without sin and with no need for conversion — God the Father made his voice heard from heaven: "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased" (v. 17). Jesus receives approval from the heavenly Father, who sent him precisely that he might accept to share our condition, our poverty. Sharing is the true way to love. Jesus does not dissociate himself from us, he considers us brothers and sisters and he shares with us. And so he makes us sons and daughters, together with him, of God the Father. This is the revelation and source of true love. And this is the great time of mercy!

**Pope Francis**  
(Angelus Address 2014)

La página del Evangelio de hoy subraya que, cuando Jesús recibió el bautismo de Juan en el río Jordán, «se abrieron los cielos» (Mt 3, 16). Esto realiza las profecías. En efecto, hay una invocación que la liturgia nos hace repetir en el tiempo de Adviento: «Ojalá rasgases el cielo y descendieses!» (Is 63, 19). Si el cielo permanece cerrado, nuestro horizonte en esta vida terrena es sombrío, sin esperanza. En cambio, celebrando la Navidad, la fe una vez más nos ha dado la certeza de que el cielo se rasgó con la venida de Jesús. Y en el día del bautismo de Cristo contemplamos aún el cielo abierto. La manifestación del Hijo de Dios en la tierra marca el inicio del gran tiempo de la misericordia, después de que el pecado había cerrado el cielo, elevando como una barrera entre el ser humano y su Creador. Con el nacimiento de Jesús, el cielo se abre. Dios nos da en Cristo la garantía de un amor indestructible. Desde que el Verbo se hizo carne es, por lo tanto, posible ver el cielo abierto.

Cuando Jesús recibió el Bautismo de penitencia de Juan el Bautista, solidarizándose con el pueblo penitente —Él sin pecado y sin necesidad de conversión—, Dios Padre hizo oír su voz desde el cielo: «Éste es mi Hijo amado, en quien me complazco» (v. 17). Jesús recibió la aprobación del Padre celestial, que lo envió precisamente para que aceptara compartir nuestra condición, nuestra pobreza. Compartir es el auténtico modo de amar. Jesús no se disocia de nosotros, nos considera hermanos y comparte con nosotros. Así, nos hace hijos, juntamente con Él, de Dios Padre. Ésta es la revelación y la fuente del amor auténtico. Y, ¡este es el gran tiempo de la misericordia!

## **Catechism of the Catholic Church** **The Mysteries of Christ's life**

**561** "The whole of Christ's life was a continual teaching: his silences, his miracles, his gestures, his prayer, his love for people, his special affection for the little and the poor, his acceptance of the total sacrifice on the Cross for the redemption of the world, and his Resurrection are the actualization of his word and the fulfilment of Revelation.

**564** By his obedience to Mary and Joseph, as well as by his humble work during the long years in Nazareth, Jesus gives us the example of holiness in the daily life of family and work.

**568** Christ's Transfiguration aims at strengthening the apostles' faith in anticipation of his Passion: the ascent on to the "high mountain" prepares for the ascent to Calvary. Christ, Head of the Church, manifests what his Body contains and radiates in the sacraments: "the hope of glory."

**570** Jesus' entry into Jerusalem manifests the coming of the kingdom that the Messiah-King, welcomed into his city by children and the humble of heart, is going to accomplish by the Passover of his Death and Resurrection.

## Baptism & Confirmation

The parents are the first and primary ministers of faith because of their central position during the formative years of the child's life. Through their daily contact with the child, they will share their faith and help the child discover the Father's loving presence in all creation. For this environment to exist the parents must live lives rooted in faith.

### WHO MAY BE GODPARENTS?

#### Baptism:

1184.1 He/she is a baptized, confirmed, and active Catholic who is able to receive the sacraments.

1184.2 He/she is in frequent contact with the parents and is capable of encouraging them and their child to live the faith.

1184.3 A baptized, confirmed, and active member of the Orthodox Church may be a Godparent. In such a case an Orthodox Priest must be consulted because of ecumenical considerations. Members of other Christian Churches may be Christian witnesses to the Baptism.

#### Confirmation:

1243.1 Sponsors: The ordinary practice is that there be individual sponsors for each candidate being confirmed. It is desirable that the Godparent at Baptism be the sponsor at Confirmation to better express the relationship between Baptism and Confirmation. Parents may present their children for Confirmation and in this way be sponsor. The sponsor for any candidate may be male or female.

1243.2 Pastors will see that the sponsor, chosen by the candidate, is spiritually qualified for the office. The sponsor should be sufficiently mature for this role, belong to the Catholic Church and have been initiated in the three Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and the Eucharist. The sponsor should also be a person of faith, actively participating in the life of the Church, especially by receiving the Eucharist regularly.

1243.3 The sponsor should be of an age and living proximity that will enable the sponsor to be present to the candidate as he/she grows in the life of faith. The custom of having proxy sponsors for someone who is and who will continue to be separated by long distances from the candidate is discouraged.
