

Gospel Message

In this Sunday's Gospel (Lk 17:11-19), Jesus encountered 10 lepers.

Lepers in the first century were social outcasts. Social outcasts were individuals rejected by the society or community for several reasons. In this case, for leprosy.

To understand the background of the story today read Leviticus chapters 13-14.

Leprosy was also present in other nations as evidence by the first reading today (cf. 2 Kgs. 5). Naaman was Aramean.

Leprosy today also known as Hansen's disease is not the same as the leprosy as described in the bible.

Jews during the time of Lord observed the Mosaic law on Leprosy.

45 The garments of one afflicted with a <u>scaly</u> <u>infection</u> shall be rent and the hair disheveled, and the mustache covered. The individual shall cry out, "Unclean, unclean!"

46As long as the infection is present, the person shall be unclean. Being unclean, that individual shall dwell apart, taking up residence outside the camp. (Lv. 13)

Therefore, anyone who has leprosy has lost everything and everyone unless one miraculously gets healed.

Imagine how is it like to lose everything and every loved one in your life and live away from them and living with fellow outcasts.

What will you feel? And what will you do when you get healed?

Luke the author, tells us of an unexpected good example in the story: a Samaritan.

En el evangelio de este domingo (*Lc* 17, 11-19) Jesús encontró 10 leprosos.

Los leprosos en el primer siglo eran marginados sociales. Los marginados sociales eran individuos rechazados por la sociedad o la comunidad por varias razones. En este caso, por la lepra.

Para entender el contexto de la historia de hoy, lean Levítico capítulos 13-14.

La lepra también estuvo presente en otras naciones como evidencia de la primera lectura de hoy (de. 2 Reyes 5). Naamán era arameo.

La lepra de hoy también conocida como enfermedad de Hansen no es la misma que la lepra descrita en la Biblia.

Los judíos durante el tiempo del Señor observaron la ley mosaica sobre la lepra.

45 La persona afectada de lepra llevará la ropa desgarrada y los cabellos sueltos; se cubrirá hasta la boca e irá gritando: «¡Impuro, impuro!» 46 Será impuro mientras dure su afección. Por ser impuro, vivirá apartado y su morada estará fuera del campamento. (Lv. 13)

Por lo tanto, cualquier persona que tiene lepra ha perdido todas las posesiones y seres queridos a menos que uno milagrosamente sea sanado.

Imagínense cómo es perder todo y perder cada ser querido y vivir aparte de ellos y vivir con compañeros marginados.

¿Qué van a sentir? ¿Y qué harán cuando se sanen? San Lucas, el autor, nos habla de un buen ejemplo inesperado en la historia: un samaritano.

FEASTS of the Week*

St. Teresa of Avila (Oct. 15)

Spanish mystic who with St. John of the Cross founded the Discalced Carmelite friars and nuns, for which she had to endure great trials. First women to be declared "Doctor of the Church."

St. Margaret Mary Alacoque (Oct. 16)

French Visitandine mystic who promoted the devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus; promoted first Friday devotion.

St. Ignatius of Antioch (Oct. 17)

Apostolic Father who was the 2nd successor of Peter in Antioch; first to use the term "Catholic Church" as a collective designation for Christians.

St. Luke (Oct. 18)

Syrian physician and companion of Paul; authored the gospel and Acts of the Apostles.
