Clergy Message

God's people win when they keep their eyes and hands fixed on him.

When Moses held the staff of God aloft, Joshua prevailed on the battlefield. The raised hands were more than a military tactic; they were a visible sign that Israel's victory depended on God's presence and their trust in him. The community witnessed that reliance on the Lord, not human strength alone, secured their freedom.

Saint Paul urges Timothy to remain steadfast in what he has learned. Scripture is not merely history or opinion but the Spirit-breathed instrument that forms teachers, corrects errors, and trains hearts in righteousness. Faithfulness to God's Word equips the Church to teach clearly and to proclaim the Gospel without compromise.

In the parable of the unjust judge, Jesus contrasts a corrupt human magistrate with the merciful God. If even a dishonest judge can be moved by persistence, how much more will our loving Father respond to his children who pray with trust? The parable calls us to perseverance in prayer and to confidence that God's justice and mercy are at work even when answers seem delayed.

Keep praying and keep reading Scripture. Persistent prayer shapes us into people who trust God's timing and will. Rooting ourselves in God's Word forms our judgment and sustains our witness. The fruit of this is hopeful patience. Trials do not mean abandonment; they invite deeper dependence on God's providence.

May we, like Moses and like Timothy, lift our hands and hearts to the Lord with steady faith. May persistent prayer and faithful attention to Scripture deepen our trust so that we recognize and live out God's saving work in our lives. Amen.

El pueblo de Dios gana cuando mantiene sus ojos y manos fijos en él.

Cuando Moisés sostuvo el bastón de Dios en alto, Josué prevaleció en el campo de batalla. Las manos levantadas eran más que una táctica militar; eran una señal visible de que la victoria de Israel dependía de la presencia de Dios y de su confianza en él. La comunidad fue testigo de que la confianza en el Señor, no solo la fuerza humana, aseguró su libertad.

San Pablo insta a Timoteo a permanecer firme en lo que ha aprendido. Las Escrituras no son meramente historia u opinión, sino el instrumento inspirado por el Espíritu que forma maestros, corrige errores y entrena corazones en justicia. La fidelidad a la Palabra de Dios equipa a la Iglesia para enseñar claramente y proclamar el Evangelio sin compromiso.

En la parábola del juez injusto, Jesús contrasta a un magistrado humano corrupto con el Dios misericordioso. Si incluso un juez deshonesto puede ser movido por la persistencia, ¿cuánto más responderá nuestro Padre amoroso a Sus hijos que oran con confianza? La parábola nos llama a la perseverancia en la oración y a la confianza de que la justicia y la misericordia de Dios están funcionando incluso cuando las respuestas parecen retrasadas.

Sigan orando y sigan leyendo las Escrituras. La oración persistente nos convierte en personas que confían en el tiempo y la voluntad de Dios. Arraigarnos en la Palabra de Dios forma nuestro juicio y sostiene nuestro testimonio. El fruto de esto es la paciencia esperanzadora. Las pruebas no significan abandono; sino invitan a una dependencia más profunda de la providencia de Dios.

Que nosotros, como Moisés y como Timoteo, levantemos nuestras manos y corazones al Señor con fe firme. Que la oración persistente y la atención fiel a las Escrituras profundicen nuestra confianza para que reconozcamos y vivamos la obra salvadora de Dios en nuestras vidas. Amén.

FEASTS of the Week*

St. Paul of the Cross (Oct. 20)

Renowned preacher and founder of the Passionists, who combine the apostolate of retreats and missions with penitential monasticism.

St. John Paul II, Pope (Oct. 22)

His exceptional apostolic zeal particularly for families, young people, the sick led him to numerous pastoral visits throughout the world.

St. John of Capistrano (Oct. 23)

Reformer of the Franciscans and Poor Clares. Preached devotion to the Holy Name of Jesus.

St. Anthony Mary Claret (Oct. 24)

Bishop and founder of the Missions Sons of the Immaculate Heart of Mary (a.k.a. Claretians).

Catechism of the Catholic Church



Transmission of Divine Revelation

96 What Christ entrusted to the apostles, they in turn handed on by their preaching and writing, under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit, to all generations, until Christ returns in glory.

97 "Sacred Tradition and Sacred Scripture make up a single sacred deposit of the Word of God" (DV 10) in which, as in a mirror, the pilgrim Church contemplates God, the source of all her riches.

98 "The Church, in her doctrine, life and worship, perpetuates and transmits to every generation all that she herself is, all that she believes" (DV 8 # 1).

100 The task of interpreting the Word of God authentically has been entrusted solely to the Magisterium of the Church, that is, to the Pope and to the bishops in communion with him.
