

In today's Gospel Jesus insists on the conditions for being his disciples: preferring nothing to the love of Christ, carrying one's cross and following him. Many people in fact drew near to Jesus, they wanted to be included among his followers; and this would happen especially after some miraculous sign which accredited him as the Messiah, the King of Israel. However Jesus did not want to disappoint anyone. He knew well what awaited him in Jerusalem and which path the Father was asking him to take: it was the Way of the Cross, the way of sacrificing himself for the forgiveness of our sins. Following Jesus does not mean taking part in a triumphal procession! It means sharing his merciful love, entering his great work of mercy for each and every man and for all men. The work of Jesus is, precisely, a work of mercy, a work of forgiveness and of love! Jesus is so full of mercy! And this universal pardon, this mercy, passes through the Cross. Jesus, however, does not want to do this work alone: he wants to involve us too in the mission that the Father entrusted to him. After the Resurrection he was to say to his disciples: "As the Father has sent me, even so I send you"... if you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven" (Jn 20:21-22). Jesus' disciple renounces all his possessions because in Jesus he has found the greatest Good in which every other good receives its full value and meaning: family ties, other relationships, work, cultural and economic goods and so forth.... The Christian detaches him or herself from all things and rediscovers all things in the logic of the Gospel, the logic of love and of service.

Excerpt from the Angelus Address
Sept. 8, 2013

En el Evangelio de hoy Jesús insiste acerca de las condiciones para ser sus discípulos: no anteponer nada al amor por Él, cargar la propia cruz y seguirle. En efecto, mucha gente se acercaba a Jesús, quería estar entre sus seguidores; y esto sucedía especialmente tras algún signo prodigioso, que le acreditaba como el Mesías, el Rey de Israel. Pero Jesús no quiere engañar a nadie. Él sabe bien lo que le espera en Jerusalén, cuál es el camino que el Padre le pide que recorra: es el camino de la cruz, del sacrificio de sí mismo para el perdón de nuestros pecados. Seguir a Jesús no significa participar en un cortejo triunfal. Significa compartir su amor misericordioso, entrar en su gran obra de misericordia por cada hombre y por todos los hombres. La obra de Jesús es precisamente una obra de misericordia, de perdón, de amor. ¡Es tan misericordioso Jesús! Y este perdón universal, esta misericordia, pasa a través de la cruz. Pero Jesús no quiere realizar esta obra solo: quiere implicarnos también a nosotros en la misión que el Padre le ha confiado. Después de la resurrección dirá a sus discípulos: «Como el Padre me ha enviado, así también os envío yo... A quienes perdonéis los pecados, les quedan perdonados» (Jn 20, 21.23). El discípulo de Jesús renuncia a todos los bienes porque ha encontrado en Él el Bien más grande, en el que cualquier bien recibe su pleno valor y significado: los vínculos familiares, las demás relaciones, el trabajo, los bienes culturales y económicos, y así sucesivamente. El cristiano se desprende de todo y reencuentra todo en la lógica del Evangelio, la lógica del amor y del servicio.

St. Peter Claver (Sept. 9)

He was a Spanish Jesuit priest.

When Peter, ordained in 1616, made his final profession as a Jesuit in 1622, he signed his vows, "Peter Claver, the slave of the Africans forever."

For forty years, Peter descended into the slave ships. He preached, too: to slave traders, criminals and the well-to-do, inviting all to a conversion of heart.

St. John Chrysostom (Sept. 13)

John was born in 347 in Antioch and was baptized there more than twenty years later.

With his gift with words and purified by years of silent meditation on God's Word, John, ordained a priest, began to preach in Antioch's cathedral. People came and the word began to spread: this preacher is "Chrysostom," golden-mouthed. His words were not easy, but they were like gold: clear and full of God's light.

In 397, against his will and knowledge, the goldenmouthed preacher was nominated archbishop, or Patriarch, of Constantinople, the capital of the Empire.

Catechism of the Catholic Church

THE CHURCH is CATHOLIC

830 The word "catholic" means "universal," in the sense of "according to the totality" or "in keeping with the whole." the Church is catholic in a double sense: First, the Church is catholic because Christ is present in her. "Where there is Christ Jesus, there is the Catholic Church." In her subsists the fullness of Christ's body united with its head; this implies that she receives from him "the fullness of the means of salvation" which he has willed: correct and complete confession of faith, full sacramental life, and ordained ministry in apostolic succession. the Church was, in this fundamental sense, catholic on the day of Pentecost and will always be so until the day of the Parousia.

831 Secondly, the Church is catholic because she has been sent out by Christ on a mission to the whole of the human race.

JUBILEE YEAR OF HOPE

Pope Francis has designated the 2025 Holy Year as a time to renew ourselves as "Pilgrims of Hope." The Jubilee Year of Hope, also known as Jubilee 2025, concludes on January 6, 2026, which is the Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord. The year began with the opening of the Holy Door of St. Peter's Basilica on December 24, 2024.

The Vatican issued a decree* in May 2024 outlining the different ways that Catholics may obtain the Plenary Indulgence during the 2025 Jubilee Holy Year.



Mass Intentions may now be scheduled.


Guidelines:
