* CALL TO WORSHIP

Reader: When the world was dark and the city was quiet, you came. You crept in beside us. And no one knew. Only the few who dared to believe that God might do something different. Will you do the same this Christmas, Lord? * LITANY OF REMEMBERING AND LIGHTING OF THE ADVENT CANDLES

Leader: We light four candles tonight to remember our loved ones as well as the meaning each Advent Candle represents. This first candle we light is for those whom we have loved and lost. We pause to remember their names, their faces, and their voices. As we give thanks for the memory that binds them to us, we are also reminded the HOPE the Christ Child brings in this season.

People: May God's eternal love surround us and reassure us of His promise of Hope.

People: Refresh, restore, renew us O God, and lead us into your future. Draw us closer to the Christ Child, from whom we receive the embrace of your Peace.

We pause and remember these past weeks and months; the disbelief, the anger, the poignancy of memories, the grief, the sadness, the hurts and the pain of reflecting on our own mortality. God, we lay before you all that, . . . along with all the ways that we feel we have fallen short . . . and the all of time we have spent blaming ourselves and you for our suffering. We also remember, God, you turn our wailing into singing. You removes our sackcloth and clothe us with JOY.

(Psalm 30:11)

People: Let us remember that dawn defeats the darkness and Joy is rooted deeply in our hearts through our faith in Christ.

People: Let us remember our Savior Jesus Christ, the Prince of Peace, who bears the light and shows us the way, unveiling the truths of Hope, Peace, Joy, and Love. Amen! (The Christ candle will remain unlit as a sign of waiting for a future that is yet unknown to us, from which God beckons us)

A READING FROM PSALMS 6 & 34

Leader: Have pity on me, Lord, for I am weak; heal me, Lord, for my bones are racked. My spirit shakes with terror; how long, O Lord, how long?

People: I grow weary because of my groaning; every night I drench my bed with tears. My eyes are wasted with grief.

Leader: I sought the Lord, and he answered me and delivered me out of all my terror. Look upon him and be radiant, and let not your faces be ashamed.

People: I called in my affliction and the Lord heard me and saved me from all my troubles.

The angel of the Lord encompasses those who fear him, and he will deliver them.

Leader: Taste and see that the Lord is good; happy are they who trust in him! The eyes of the Lord are upon the righteous, and his ears are open to their cry.

People: The righteous cry, and the Lord hears them and delivers them from all their troubles. The Lord is near to the brokenhearted and will save those whose spirits are crushed.

Leader: Many are the troubles of the righteous, but the Lord will deliver him out of them all.

A READING FROM ISAIAH 43

Leader: This is God's Promise to the Israelites in the threatening shadows of Babylon's power - and to all in duress today: Do not fear, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by name, you are mine. When you pass through the waters, I will be with you; and through the rivers, they shall not overwhelm you; when you walk through fire you shall not be burned, and the flame shall not consume you. Because you are precious in my sight, and honored, and I love you, I give people in return for you, nations in exchange for your life. Do not fear, for I am with you. Thus says the Lord, who makes a way in the sea, a path in the mighty waters. Do not remember the former things, or consider the things of old. I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it? I will make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert. For I give water in the wilderness, rivers in the desert, to give drink to my chosen people, the people whom I formed for myself so that they might declare my praise.

A READING FROM LUKE 2

Leader: This is God's Promise embodied for us. This is how we can see God's way in the manger: The angel said to them, "Do not be afraid; for see—I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people: to you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is the Messiah, the Lord. This will be a sign for you: you will find a child wrapped in bands of cloth and lying in a manger." And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host, praising God and saying, "Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace among those whom he favors!"


