The Advent Season is upon us! Advent....arrival of a notable person, thing or event. In the life of the Church we look to the Advent Season as a time of preparation for the arrival of the Christ child on Christmas day. The season is basically four weeks culminating in the birth of Jesus. When we gather for the First Sunday of Advent, we begin by singing "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel and ransom captive Israel..." and in the month long process we move thru "The Angel Gabriel" and "It Came Upon a Midnight Clear" to "O Come All Ye Faithful" and "Go Tell It On The Mountain." Suzanne always painstakingly crafts the list of Carols to coincide with the season, making sure that we don't arrive at the manger the second week of the season...instead, we make the journey to Bethlehem in deliberate fashion. 
A Quick Word of Thanks!



LA Cares

LA Cares is our hometown organization supporting our community members in a variety of ways, such as providing monthly food distributions and rent/utility assistance.

At the Food Pantry, they distribute food once a month. All clients receive a bag of non-perishable products. In addition, fresh produce, eggs, bread, meats, and cheese are available. Personal hygiene items such as paper products, soaps, toothpaste, etc. are also available. A limited amount of dog and cat food is also available.

The United Church supports LA Cares on a continual basis with a drop-off location inside the CE Building door at the parking lot entrance. With the current economic situation, this will help provide additional support for our community members in need.

MAP International

Everybody gets sick, not everybody gets medicine. We're on a mission to change that.

Their supply chain of hope has been successfully evolving over the past 69 years. In 2023, over 95% of total operating expenses were used for programs.

Church World Service

Church World Service (CWS) was born in the wake of the devastation of World War II. Seventeen Christian denominations came together "to do in partnership what none of us could hope to do as well alone." All six of the denominations we affiliate with are CWS Covenant Members

For Alternative Giving, CWS offers a complete variety of donation options in these categories:

Animals: From five life-sustaining chickens (\$22) to a buzzing beehive full of potential (\$65) or a small herd of farm animals (\$295).

Children: Children deserve a safe, joyful start in life—but for families in need, even the essentials like diapers, school supplies, or a warm meal can be out of reach.

Education: Education transforms lives. Whether it's books for seven students (\$21), business skills training for a woman (\$25) or GED classes for a young adult (\$400), etc.

Agriculture: Give a gift that grows. Whether it's Fruit Seeds (\$23) to support healthy diets, a Garden Starter Kit (\$55) with essential tools or Vegetable Seeds (\$140) to grow a thriving home garden, etc.

Kits & Blankets: From a cozy CWS Blanket (\$10) to essential Hygiene Kits (\$15), Kids Kits (\$15), and vital Clean Up Buckets (\$75), meaningful gifts like these offer more than relief. **Water:** Community Water Access for a Family (\$10), 100 Gallons of Clean Water Storage (\$60) or a life-sustaining Community Well (\$1,800), and more.

Disaster Relief

Within the last few months, there have been two weather related disasters:

Typhoon Halong hitting the southwest coast of **Alaska** necessitating the complete evacuation of many villages to other locations.

Hurricane Melissa in the Caribbean with extensive damage in Jamaica and Cuba and additional damage in Haiti and the Bahamas.

Typhoon Halong

The November Chimes outlined details of the Alaska disaster and all gifts to help there will go to the Alaska Community Foundation. The towns hit the hardest by the remnants of Typhoon Halong include Kipnuk and Kwigillingok. These communities, which are off the state's main road system and reachable only by water or air, experienced catastrophic damage. Thousands of citizens have been evacuated to other major cities, many of whom will not be able to return to their communities and homes for upwards of 18 months due to the devastation.





Hurricane Melissa became one of the strongest hurricanes on record and cut across Jamaica leaving a trail of destruction. It then hit Cuba, Haiti and Bahamas. Jamaica was hardest hit and Church World Service is supporting the recovery efforts with vital supplies. They are also supporting the other islands.





We will split donations to **Disaster Relief** between the Alaska Community Foundation and Church World Service.

Our next Dignity Mission packing party will be Saturday, December 13th in Graves Hall, 9:15 am coffee and goodies, 9:30 work!

Our Christmas elves have been busy and sewn many festive bags of holiday fabric. We will pack these with the small stuffed toys and cars and trucks culled from the Thrift Shop over the past months. We will add candy canes and small purchased games, books, toys, and crayons. These will be delivered to children in the facilities in Juarez, where recent deportees and hopeful future immigrants are living. Our sources tell us there are few, unhoused immigrants presently in El Paso.

We will also pack ~150 hygiene kits, as we have in the past. These will be delivered to facilities in Española, Pathways Shelter, and McGurdy Family Center where homeless and needy find help. Please join us in this important Christian mission.

Presents can be a fun sign of love. Yet the best gift is presence.



Modern Christmas's festivities, parties and gift-giving can be wonderful, but may distract us from being **fully present**, **ready to connect to others' true joys and sorrows**. May we gift those around us with our **full attention**, with our **listening ears and open heart**.

Robert Reich shared on Substack that our country's continuing confusion, hate and fear doesn't just create national trauma, it affects individual anxiety, sleeplessness, and stress. He says it is important to realize "you are not alone in this." The person next to you may be stressed about life in general and/or the country's disfunction, firings, furloughs, dividedness, disappearances, along with getting ready for the Holidays. People need compassion and patience. We do not know what they are going through. A temptation may be to withdraw.

However, like Jesus, it is good to train our hearts to step toward the pain.

Upheaval does deserve our attention, and it can feel like a roller coaster ride. Yet to mourn too much can mean to stop really living. We are alive and loved by God. Paul understood this: "I have learned the secret of being content in any and every situation, whether well fed or hungry, whether living in plenty or in want. I can do everything through him who gives me strength." Phil 4:12-13 We can strike a balance. Celebrate, and rejoice in our Savior's birth.... with a humble awareness of where pain lives.

Jesus' friend Martha was distracted by many things, which is what often happens during the holidays. May we truly **be present for others** like Mary was. She stepped out of her culture's norm of kitchen work and sat at Jesus feet as a man might.

Yes, Jesus was very connected and was willing to share people's grief and joy. Yet, like us it took a lot out of him, and he tried to withdraw to quiet places to spend time with his Father. When things get too hectic or overwhelming, some quiet alone time with God in a room or on a walk in beautiful creation, can renew us so that we are able to love others better and to handle stress.

Celebrate and dance together, mourn and weep together, show up for the grief and the celebration –it is "a holy practice." Sharon Brous

All women of the church and their friends are welcome to attend this group.


The books for discussion are selected by the group.


