

QUESTIONS FOR DISCUSSION

1. How important is it for us that Jesus appeared to His followers after His resurrection?
2. Would more people believe today if Jesus would present His body?
3. Would more believe if Christians would perform miracles of healing, etc., as were done in the early church?
4. Why were the Jewish leaders not given the opportunity to see Christ? Do you think they would have believed?
5. How can we learn to believe without “seeing”?

SUMMARY:

Since Thomas openly refused to believe that Jesus had been resurrected except that he see and feel Jesus’ hands and side, one might think that it would be very difficult to convince him of Christ’s resurrection. However, he readily believed when Jesus appeared and accepted Thomas’ challenge to touch His hands and side. Thomas needed more evidence than just the testimony of the other disciples.

The experience of Thomas shows how God willingly reveals Himself to one of an upright heart. This should be an encouragement to unbelievers, and to believers who have doubts, to seek the Lord in prayer and through His Word.

QUARTERLY THEME: Christ, the Son of God

TOPIC: CHRIST MINISTERS TO HIS DISCIPLES

INTRODUCTION:

Peter, the leader, announced his intention to go fishing. Possibly restlessness accounted for the willingness of the other six disciples to accompany him into the old occupation. This episode occurred in the interim between the crucifixion and the receiving of the new power at Pentecost. After a fruitless night of toil, the day broke. Jesus was waiting for His disciples on the beach. They were on the restless water. He had a hot meal ready. They had an empty net. At His command, they obeyed and an unexpected and overwhelming abundance resulted. John was the first to recognize the Lord, but Peter was the first to act. Impulsively he cast himself into the sea to hurry to the Master. Not only had Jesus prepared the meal, He also served them. He may have wanted to assure them that He was the same Jesus they had known before His crucifixion and resurrection, and that personal contact with Him was still possible. This was never to be a forgotten occasion to renew the faith and purpose of His chosen men. “. . . I have chosen you and ordained you, that ye should go and bring forth fruit . . .”

CENTRAL TRUTH: Christ's presence turns failure into success.

GOLDEN TEXT: LO, I AM WITH YOU ALWAYS, EVEN UNTO THE END OF THE WORLD.

Matthew 28:20

Because our Lord Jesus added the phrase “even unto the end of the world” this is a wonderfully meaningful promise to us in this time of sin and growing apostasy. The final stage is being set for the forming of the great world church prophesied so long ago. We are now living in the times of increasing iniquity and lawlessness, the perilous times, when love grows cold. Offenses abound and faith becomes weak. But events in Israel are assuring us that the end of this age is near. The spread of the Word to the last corners of the earth by faithful and consecrated workers also assures us that the end time is at hand.

And Christ is still with us. He said this to His disciples and He is telling us today. Let us rejoice!
