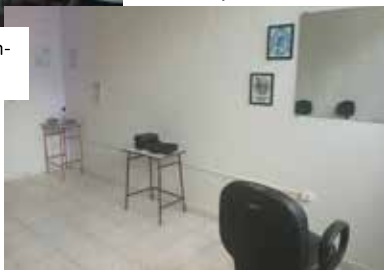

He knew how to take care of the house and prepare meals, since he was the one who cooked them at home. Pedro didn't stay with us long as his father was granted custody of him. One thing that struck us

about Pedro was that when the social service workers came to get him, he didn't want to leave. Pedro said he preferred to stay with us and went home very sad. We prayed with him and invited him to participate in the CTE Adonai After School Program, which he has been attending ever since.

In February, we restarted CTE Adonai with the start of the new school year. A room



in one of our main buildings was renovated to be used for a barber and manicure course as part of the after school program. One of the events that most impacted the home this quarter was the youth camp we hosted. It brought together churches from São Paulo and Cana Verde. There

were more than a hundred young people in attendance. The week before camp, we noticed that the enemy rose up to try to cancel this event, but to the glory of God, everything went well and many young people accepted Jesus as Lord and Savior of their lives, including one of our boys, Ytalo.

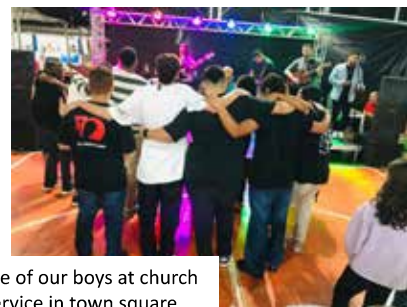
age 15, is reclusive and very quiet. He arrived at the end of April, so we don't know him well yet, but we believe that with time we will earn his trust.

His grandfather had been trying to get custody of him for a while, and a few weeks ago, the court decision was made in favor of the grandfather. It was time to say goodbye to him. We were all very sad because he had been with us for over a year. It is inevitable to create an emotional bond since these children are part of our families. In April, Luiz turned two and his grandfather allowed him to come visit us and celebrate his birthday with us. He was very happy to see everyone again and recognized his former home.

Having a login to access your profile enables you to be a part of a group, track your giving, add one-time and recurring donations, update your contact information, change family details, set notification preferences, or even add a profile picture. By keeping this information current, you are helping our staff and your group leaders.

How to Create an Account

Send us an email with your name, address, phone number and birthdate, requesting an account login.

Look for your emailed invitation to join Realm.

Manage Your Giving

Review your giving history or make new donations online or on your mobile device. Simply sign in to look over your year-to-date giving, print a contribution statement, or make a new one-time or recurring donation. It's always available and kept secure in an easy-to-use online environment. Your giving is only viewable by you and the ACCF financial office.

NEW – Give to your local Church via Realm

Would you like to donate to your local church on a one-time or recurring basis using your checking account or credit card? You can do so by setting up a Realm login. Your church will receive your donation, and we will handle sending out your receipt and absorb the processing fees associated with the donation. There is also an option for you to cover the fees if you prefer. If you have any questions or would like us to discuss how this could benefit your congregation, please let us know.

One hundred percent of donations are allocated to the specific Mission or Missionary selected by the donor. Administrative expenses are covered through designated contributions from member Churches and individuals, as well as investment dividends from funds donated for this purpose.

Each donation made to the ACCF will be utilized according to the donor's instructions. If a ministry's requirements have been met or if the Mission/Missionary is no longer part of the ACCF, the remaining funds will be redirected to areas where they are most needed.

Support and Progress in San Antonio, Ypané and Capiatá.

Thank you for your financial support. In nearby San Antonio, we are working with two cell groups that are being established, along with 6 others, reaching out to 80 participants weekly. Two new couples have taken the challenge and are leading these groups with their families. We visit each week and witness beautiful support groups growing and becoming stronger in their faith.



Oscar and I are working with a counseling program at Escuela de Vida. Many times, people of all ages just need to be heard, comforted, and shown biblical principles to keep moving forward.

The construction work in Ypané is progressing well. We have drilled two water wells—one in San Antonio and one in Ypané.

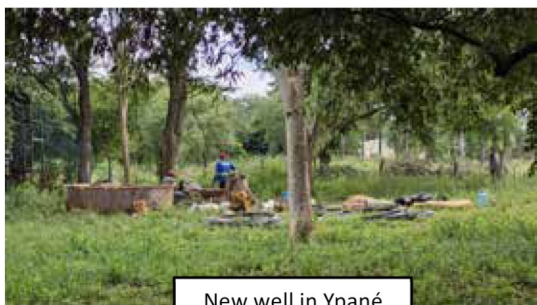


New well in San Antonio

Water is connected and flowing cleanly. The first phase involves building a wall

around the property to ensure safety, as it is in a developing area where theft is common.

In Capiatá, cell groups meet weekly. Last Wednesday, despite a power outage, worship and sharing God's Word carried on, even in the darkness. We continue collaborating with the pastor for monthly church services and a Bible course held every Monday with his team of leaders.

It was also a time of joy, as families shared meals, built friendships, and encouraged one another. The camp was a refreshing and meaningful experience, strengthening our bond as a church.

ESCUELA DE VIDA UPDATES

The "Escuela de Vida" Project has grown a lot in the first months of 2025. Many volunteers, students, and families have been involved, making a big difference in our community. This report shares the important moments, challenges, and future plans.



February was the month of our "Volunteer Training." Before starting activities, we gave theoretical and practical training to volunteers. This helped them understand the project's mission and vision to learn how to teach and support the students. The training covered leadership, communication, and principle-based teaching to prepare them for their roles. Classes officially started in March, and we had great

participation:

- Unit of San Antonio: 80 students and 25 volunteers
- Unit of Ypane: 76 students and 15 volunteers

We also restarted Manantial de Vida, the food program in Ypane. Every week, families gather to enjoy a warm meal, strengthening relationships and supporting the community.

During April, to celebrate Easter, we held a special devotional where families joined to learn about the true meaning of Easter in Christianity. After the class, everyone enjoyed "chipa and cocido," a traditional Paraguayan meal during Easter.

For Teacher's Day Celebration, on April 29th here in Paraguay, we organized a special lunch and celebration to thank all our volunteers for their dedication. Even though some don't have formal teaching degrees, we recognize their commitment to teach God's Word and guiding the students with values and faith.

YPANE BUILDING

The church building and classrooms for Escuela de Vida in Ypane are under construction. The process has many steps, but we trust in God's guidance. We believe the buildings will be ready soon, providing space for learning and worship.

These past months have been full of growth, teamwork, and faith. We are seeing God's blessings through Escuela de Vida and believe great things are ahead. There are challenges, but with faith and dedication, we will continue to help our community and see God's plans unfold.

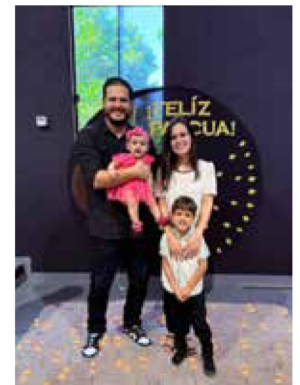

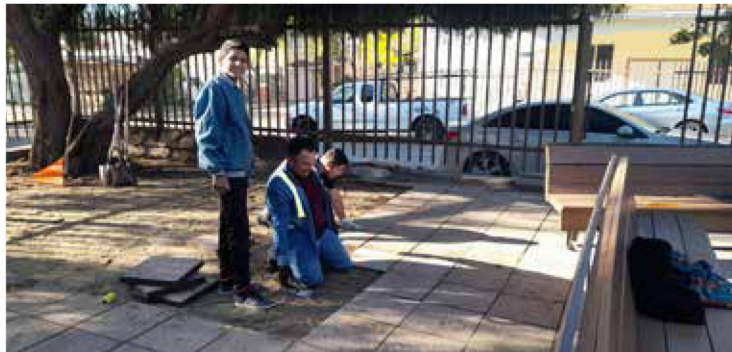

get to a hospital and have the delicate surgery to take care of this. We thank God for sparing his life. A few Sisters from San Jose have gone home with the Lord in the last few months. Sis Evangelina inspired us all (see picture.) When she first came to church and was converted, possibly in her 60's, she rode a bicycle for 3 kilometers to get to church. One day she had her granddaughter on the bike with her. They slipped into the canal along the road and got muddy. She stood up, brushed herself off, and said: "The devil is trying to keep us from going

to church, but he's not going to win! Let's go!" So she arrived at church damp and muddy from the fall. The last few years of her life she was almost blind, and one of her daughters accompanied her to church. Even being practically blind, she invited us for a meal when we visited San Jose. In April a group of volunteers from an organization in Tecate came to build a covering for the porch of one of our houses. We are so grateful for all their time

The last 3 months have been filled with activity and blessings.

Staff Situation: In the last issue of the Newsletter, we had requested prayer for more caregivers. God answered your prayers and Adriano and Daniela arrived in April, along with their two daughters, ages 10 and 15. They came from northern Paraná, leaving their jobs and family to serve the Lord here, and they are a blessing in our midst.

God also answered our prayer for a Christian social worker. Ana Flavia started here in March, and Haysa is still helping us part time from home, working on grant projects and other documentation.

High Turnover in CLM Children: Since we last wrote in February, 7 children and teens left CLM, and 5 arrived. Please pray for the CLM team as we adapt to having less and less time to invest in the lives of these children. Pray that God will give the increase to the seeds planted in each heart.

New Playground: We are thrilled to share a joyful milestone with you — our children now have a brand-new playground! What was once a simple dream is now a vibrant space filled with laughter, imagination, and healing.



This project became a reality thanks to a partnership between the Agraria, a local agricultural cooperative, and the State Government. Through their generous support, we received the resources needed to build a safe, colorful, and engaging play area for the children in our care.

At CLM, we believe play is more than just fun — it's essential for emotional development, social connection, and restoring a sense of normalcy to children who have experienced hardship. Seeing them run, swing, and smile freely is a reminder of why we do what we do.

More Improvements through New Partnerships: With hearts full of gratitude, we are excited to share more wonderful news: we have updated the appliances in each of the CLM houses and are in the process of building a new multisport court. These improvements were made possible

through the same generous partnership with the Agraria and the State Government, who continue to believe in the impact of our mission with children and teens.

The new court offers a safe and structured space for sports and recreation, encouraging health, discipline, and friendship. Meanwhile, the updated appliances have brought greater comfort and practicality to the homes that provide daily care and nurturing.

With funding received from the State Government, we are building a fully equipped fitness room, purchasing bicycles, and expanding our set of musical instruments for the children and teens in our care. These resources support not only physical health, but also creativity, emotional expression, and personal growth. Movement and music are powerful tools in the journey of healing and transformation.

What makes this moment even more special is that our local community and government are increasingly believing in and supporting our work. This growing recognition affirms our mission and strengthens our commitment to serve with love and excellence. Thank you for walking this path with us. Together, we are building more than structures — we are building futures.

Encounter with God Retreat and Easter Activities: In April, we had a very special weekend with a group from Claudio and Daniele's church in Curitiba.

They came to minister to the children and team with an event called "Encounter with God." We had 25 visitors that weekend; some preached, others counseled, and yet others prepared food and took care of other details. It was a wonderful time of renewal of our faith, with God working powerfully in our lives.

We also celebrated Easter, ministering to the children about the Lord's love and grace. Holidays like Easter are difficult for the children here, since they bring back memories of times past with their own families. To help, we try to fill their time with activities and visits from groups that come and bring chocolate and spend time with them.



To our faithful supporters ministry possible. While we have recently received funding in Brazil for investment projects, we still depend on your giving to provide for monthly costs like food, clothing, transportation and salaries. 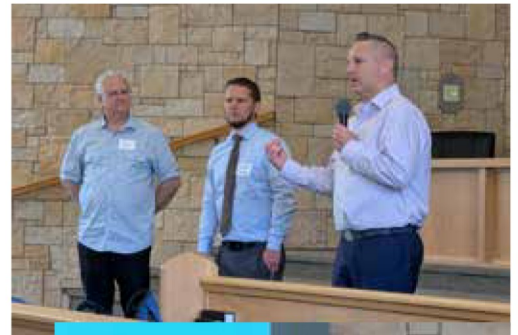

Greetings from Hope Ministries!

Hope Ministries Medical Boat Ministry

From January to March we were able to hold 5 clinics with hundreds of patients seen by volunteer doctors, nurses, dentists, physical therapists, nutritionists, and psychologists. One of the clinics was in a community of Curucambaba, about 1 hour by boat from our church at Bujaru on the Guama River.

We had heard of this community and had been praying for the people there for many years now, but it was the first time we were able to make contact with community officials, hold a clinic, make visits, and share the gospel. The people are asking us to please come back, share the gospel in their homes, and hold more clinics.

Vila Aviva Children's Home

During the last months we have been able to pour most of the cement slab, raise the walls and build the roof structure of the home. We are thankful for each donation that has come in to make this progress possible. We continue to see a great need for children to be cared for in this home. As we hold the clinics along the rivers, we see children in very difficult situations that have been abused, often by family members. There are many young girls, 13 years old, who become pregnant and have children. We are praying that this home will be a refuge for these children in need.

Church Planting

At present, we have our central church in Castanhal and four river churches along the Amazon River tributaries

Three of these four churches are well established with a Brazilian church worker or local pastor and baptized believers. The newest of these churches, Alegre Vamos, has a church building and small house attached to the back under construction but no church worker living at the church yet. Please pray with us that we would be able to finish the house and then be able to send a Brazilian worker from the Castanhal church. It is so exciting to see God's Word going out from these river churches and changing lives and families and opening doors to plant more churches along the river. We also hold regular clinics at each of these churches.

The highlight of our spring was a visit from Bro Willie Ritzmann, his wife Sis Dianna, Bro Zhen Gong and his son

Prayer Needs

Pray for safety for travel as we go out with the medical boat and also as we visit river churches by car for ministry and evangelism. One of our young volunteers from church, Caike (20 years), was badly injured on his way home after a clinic on the Moju River just last week. He was on a motorcycle, returning home from our mission house, when a car pulled into his lane, side swiped his motorcycle and then sped off. His foot was crushed and almost severed in two.
