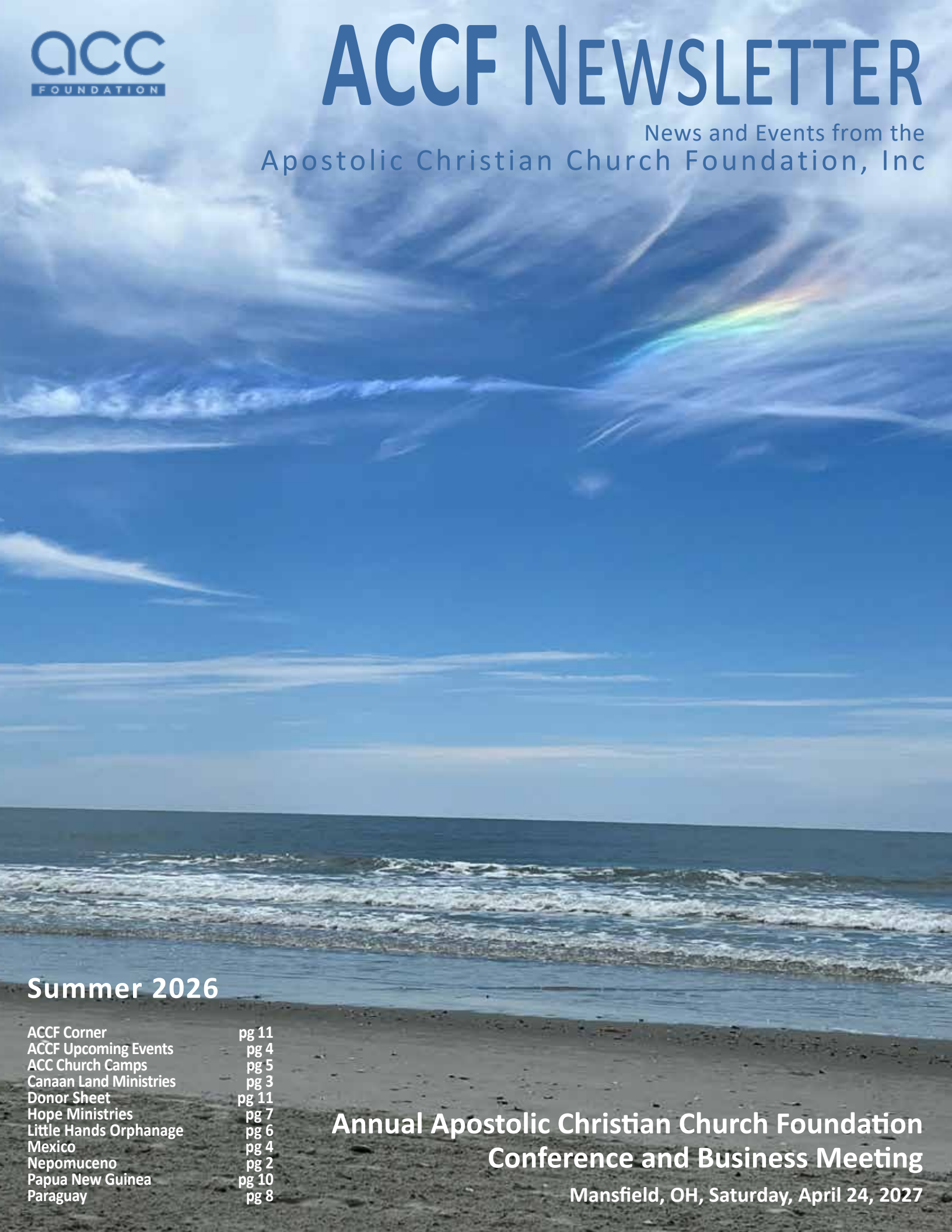

The home has seen some significant changes over the past few months. In February, the directors of the Home, Fernando and Elisangela, returned to Parana and the Home is now in

need of new directors. We are in prayer that God will raise up a new director for the Nepo Home who is guided by Him and leads with wisdom, love, and commitment to this ministry. We trust that the Lord is in charge of every detail, and we believe that He will bring the right person to continue strengthening and developing this mission.

In February, we restarted the CTE Adonai after school program with the start of the new school year. The program, which includes girls and boys, serves around 35 children in our morning and afternoon groups. The children participate in devotions, times of worship, enrichment classes, sports activities, and guitar lessons. They are also served lunch and a snack as part of the program. Please continue to keep this outreach ministry in your prayers.

## Nurturing new beginnings

CLM continues to welcome, protect, and provide new opportunities for young people who have experienced difficult situations. We currently care for 19 children and teens, each with their own story, yet all with the same need: love, stability, and hope.

## Strengthening connections and inspiring a call to missions

On Easter weekend, we had the joy of hosting a group of about 70 people, including youth, pastors, and other adults from churches in the states of São Paulo, Minas Gerais, and Parana.



This weekend retreat was a meaningful step in strengthening relationships with other churches in our denomination. The CLM children were deeply impacted by the care and attention they received. At the same time, we believe many of the young visitors experienced their first real contact with missions, which may inspire future missionaries and supporters.

## Transitioning to adulthood

We also celebrate an important milestone- Samira and Joana turned 18 in March and are entering a new phase of life. They remain



with us during this transition and are preparing to start their first jobs in early May. This is a significant step toward independence, but also a challenging season. Please pray that God would strengthen and guide them as they move forward.



## Impacting lives through renewed living spaces

In April, we were able to fully renovate one of the houses and put a new roof on another through specific government resources. We can't always count on these funds, but they are a great blessing when they come. In May, a caregiver couple and a group of children will move into the newly renovated home.

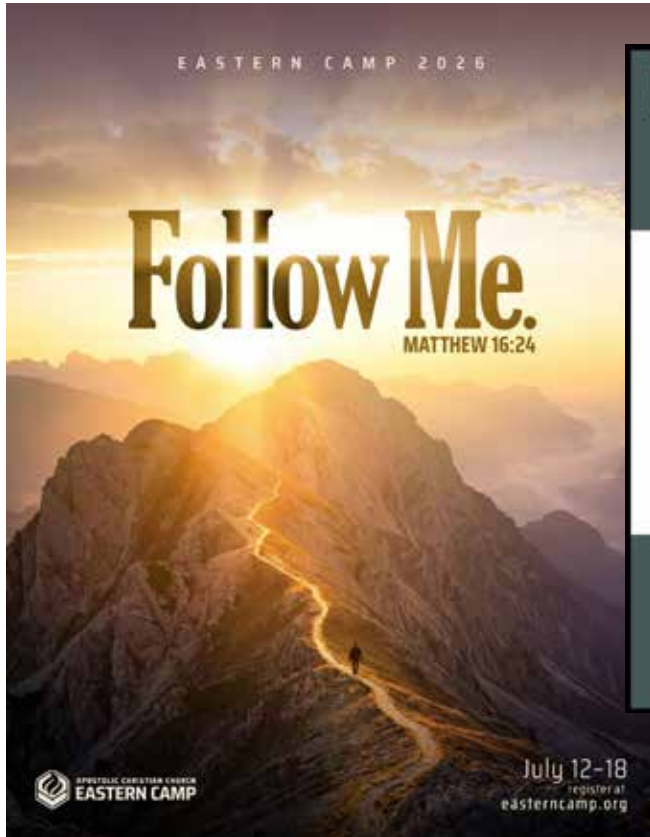

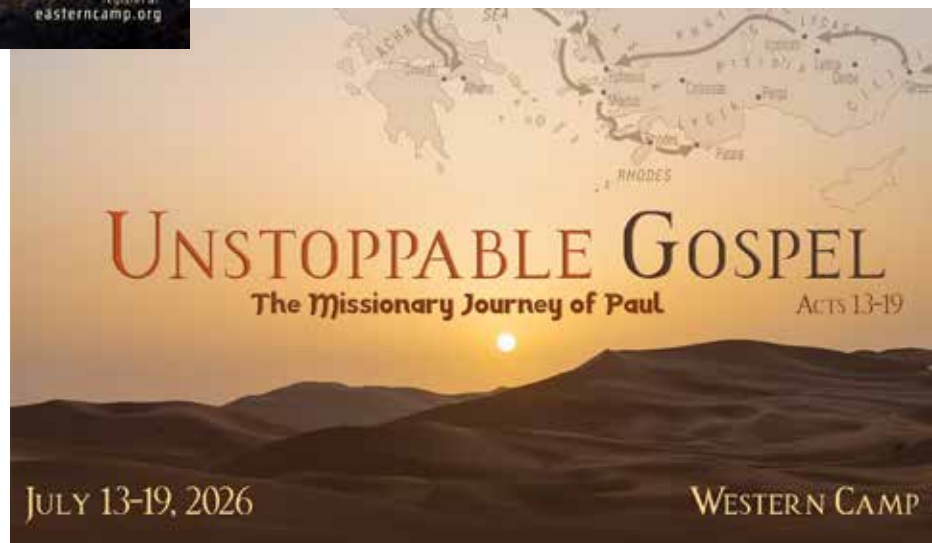

# Little Hands Orphanage

Mexico

Greetings from Little Hands,

These last three months have had their share of sorrows and trials but they have also brought many encouraging moments and new growth. Working with vulnerable



children requires daily prayer and trusting in the Lord to help break old patterns, teach the same lessons repeatedly and handle

strong emotions in a calm way with wisdom. We are grateful to see how God is using every person and volunteer in this ministry to play a part in the lives of the children and pray that one day every child will give their lives to

His service.

Here are some encouraging moments from these last months:

-Three of our children received “reconocimientos” in school for their hard work and good grades. It is so encouraging to see their progress, as many of our children were very behind in school when they first arrived. This is another challenge they have overcome in their lives, and with God’s help they will continue to grow in discipline.

-One of our girls received an invitation to a school event in the main park in Tecate because she was in the group of the most well behaved children in her school. Several city governors attended the event to acknowledge the children.

-We were blessed to receive several more visits from local groups who came to bring meals and spend time with the children. It is so encouraging to feel the support of the outside community. Their visits also provide opportunities to



share the light of Christ with them.

-The children have been growing in responsibility as they have been working with “Papá”

(caregiver Juan Carlos) to do small projects- like painting the outside porch walls of the girls’ house, removing weeds, watering trees, and general grounds’ cleanup. They are happy and often look forward to this work because it gives them the opportunity to listen to his stories and have special snacks as they work.

Some of our needs/prayer requests are:

-For people willing to come join our team of caregivers. We are currently accepting applications for a couple, as well as a single Sister. We pray God would place the call on people's hearts who are willing to come serve these children.

-For visitors and volunteers for small projects, as well as people willing to come spend time with the children.

-Prayer for strong leadership and teamwork for all those involved in this ministry and for wisdom in all our decisions, that whatever we do is for the glory of God and focuses on what is best for the children.

-Prayer for encouragement and strength for the caregivers to meet every daily challenge and spiritual battle with God's strength.

-Pray for the children to understand God's purpose for their lives. That they would be a light for Christ in their school and when they visit their outside families, that they would overcome any challenges they face and heal from any hurts or trials, and that they would all make the decision one day to become Christians and give their life to the Lord.

Thank you all for all your love and support as we continue on in ministry serving these children.

# Hope Ministries

Brazil

Greetings from Hope Ministries!

## Answered Prayer

In October of 2023, God led us to start an outreach in the community of Itabira. It is an 8-10 hour trip there and back. We cross the Guama River on a barge and then drive about 20 minutes into the jungle to the small inland community. The community used to be known for its abused children, drug dealers, violent gangs and witchcraft. We have gone out with a team from our Castanhal Church every two weeks for the last 1 ½ years to hold a service and share the gospel. After worship and preaching, we serve a simple meal and celebrate birthdays and Christmas. Each time we go we have a special Bible Story and activity for the children while we teach the adults what it means to follow Jesus.

Now, God is bringing fruit in the lives of these people we have been reaching out to. Three weeks ago, there were 9



new believers ready for baptism. We built a wooden baptismal tank out in the jungle, lined it with a plastic tarp and filled it with

water from the well we dug last year. Hooking up lights to the trees near the home where we were meeting, we had a beautiful baptismal service for the new Christians. The first to be baptized was Jefferson, whose home we have been meeting in. The second was his wife Nayane. They are the parents of the small boy with no arms that we took to an evangelistic service that Nic Vujicic held last year in Belem. "God is building His Kingdom and the gates of hell cannot prevail against it."



## More River Clinics

Even though our medical boat is still in the boat yard, our river clinics have continued reaching the communities along the rivers and

even going to new areas. In March we had a team from Ohio, including a doctor, dentist, physical therapist, nurse, pharmacist and other volunteer Brothers and Sisters to hold clinics, children's meetings and do river evangelism. The government of a town along the river provided their steel boat for us to use for the clinics, as our is still being repaired. We were able to hold 3 clinics the week they were here and treat 340 patients, give out Bibles, and share the gospel with the patients and in homes where we visited. We are also continuing to reach into new communities with our small river boat to hold clinics while our medical boat is being repaired. The hull is now completely finished and we are working on repairing the upper two floors of the boat.

## Directors for Vila Aviva Children's Home

Construction is continuing on the home. The last months have been slower than we expected while we waited for the work crew that is now laying the tile in the home. We have been able to finish the gate, the driveways, plaster the ceilings, and start the painting. While God is providing the funds to build the home, we are also asking Him for the workers He has chosen to take care of the children we will be taking in. God has put it on the hearts of a young couple in our Castanhal Church to be the first directors. Neto is a minister in our Castanhal Church and his wife Naira is the architect and engineer that has been helping with building the home. They have spent years working with our church plant in Bujaru in the children's and youth ministries there. They know many of the children and their families that we are hoping will be reached through the children's home. Neto and Naira are planning to attend the missionary conference and the beginning of Eastern Camp as well as the last 3 days of Western Camp this summer. They do not know much English but are eager to learn and to meet many of you at the camps.

## San Antonio and new Projects in Escuela de Vida, Capiatá, and Ypané

**Madres con Propósito:** Empowering Mothers in Escuela de Vida

Madres con Propósito is a new program launched this year at Escuela de Vida, dedicated to supporting and guiding mothers of students through spiritual and personal growth. The initiative partners with Diana Castro, a psychologist from the church, who generously volunteers her time to bless the ministry and the mothers involved.

### Weekly Gatherings and Activities

Every Thursday, participating mothers, including both those who attend church and those who do not, gather for a time of worship and reflection. The sessions focus on addressing personal or internal challenges, and Diana Castro introduces practical techniques to help mothers confront and resolve these issues. The group currently consists of about 14 mothers.

### Expansion to Ypané and Capiatá

Due to the positive impact and interest generated by the classes in March, the program was extended to Ypané and Capiatá. The goal is to disciple and support mothers in these communities, offering the same encouragement and guidance they receive in Escuela de Vida.

### Curriculum and Themes

The program began with studies on individuality, emphasizing how each person is unique and valued by God, who sees a beautiful purpose in everyone. The ongoing theme, the Garden of Virtues, likens the mothers to flowers in a garden—each different, yet beautiful in God’s sight.

### Focus on Self-Government

This month, the classes center on self-government, including topics such as self-esteem and self-control. The mothers learn to identify triggers for negative reactions and explore



ways to make positive changes, positioning themselves to overcome challenges and achieve victory.

### Virtue-Based Learning and Family Conversations

Each month, the group studies an important virtue, aligning with the lessons taught to students at Escuela de Vida. This approach encourages meaningful conversations at home, as mothers are guided through the same virtues as their children, fostering unity and growth within families.

### Pastoral House Construction in Ypané

The construction of the pastoral house in Ypané is nearing completion. The building is attractive and well situated, resting atop a hill that overlooks the lower part of the property. This location provides a beautiful vantage point and will eventually become the site for our church building.

Currently, our church services are held outdoors. As the sun rises and temperatures increase, the congregation moves positions throughout the service to avoid direct sunlight. Despite these challenges, the group remains enthusiastic and committed, eagerly participating as members of the Body of Christ. Preparations for each service are completed early in the morning, ensuring everything is ready for the day ahead.

### Capiatá

An extraordinary event took place last week during a prayer meeting in Capiatá. Pastor Joel encouraged everyone to pray for the person next to them. Without hesitation, I prayed for Nicolasa, a newcomer to the group. Nicolasa is a single mother with many children who faces daily challenges to provide for her family. She is seeking support, love, and acceptance, and is on a journey to find the Lord.

After the prayer, I embraced Nicolasa, and she asked if she should now pray for me. I responded, “Yes, if you want to.” Nicolasa proceeded to offer a simple yet deeply heartfelt prayer. Her words were sincere and unadorned, coming straight from her heart, and they moved me to tears. It was a powerful reminder of the beauty found in genuine, heartfelt communication with God.

Praise God for every person who seeks Him. The promise in His Word is clear: “Everyone who seeks me will surely find me.” Please continue to pray for Nicolasa as she searches for the Lord.

Escuela de Vida

The beginning of this year, 2026, has been a very special time for Escuela de Vida, marked by preparation, growth, and great expectation for everything God will do in the life of each child and family.

Throughout the entire month of February, we carried out our training period. It was a month dedicated to prayer, receiving teachings, and equipping ourselves with excellence so we could minister to and teach the children. All the teachers actively participated, committing themselves to each stage of the training. During this time, we also prepared the classrooms and received registrations from the children



who would be part of the program this year.

In the first week of March, we held our parents' meeting, where we presented the annual

project and shared the vision of everything we will be developing with the children. It was a very blessed gathering, with a strong attendance of parents who were open and expectant for this new season.

Right after that, we began our classes. This year brings very important new developments. We have expanded our reach and, for the first time, we are welcoming children starting at 4 years old. For this purpose, we prepared a special space and a dedicated class for children aged 4 and 5. It is a very special group, full of joy, now part of Escuela de Vida, receiving the same principles and teachings adapted to their age, learning from an early stage to follow the way of the Lord.

This year's theme is "The Garden of Virtues," based on Galatians 5:22-23, which speaks about the fruit of the Spirit. Each month, we will focus on developing one virtue, believing that the Lord will grow and cause it to flourish in the lives of the children, being reflected in their attitudes and actions.

We are also continuing to strengthen our specialized classes, which include English, Fine Arts and Classical Literature, Computer studies, Baking Classes, and Physical Education. All

these areas are centered on one main goal: to sow seeds of principles in the hearts of the children that will bear fruit at the perfect time according to God's plans for their lives.

One of the highlights of this year is the "Mothers with Purpose" class. We are honored to have a psychologist working with us, developing with the mothers the same principles we teach the children, but at a deeper level. Each week, around 10 to 12 mothers participate in this space, receiving the Word of God and walking in transformation alongside their children.



This has been an incredible addition



to our project, as our goal is to reach not only the children but also their families.

We are very grateful for everything we have experienced during this first trimester. We have had amazing classes and have seen God's hand in every detail. We deeply appreciate all the support and prayers that make this project possible.

We also want to remind you that there is an opportunity to **sponsor a child with a monthly contribution of \$30**, which covers materials, uniforms, and everything provided for them within the program.

Thank you once again for being part of what God is doing through Escuela de Vida. This is just the beginning of a year full of purpose and fruit.

# Papua New Guinea

South Pacific

In April 2026, a team — Willie Ritzmann, Thad Lumsden, Zhen Gong, and Edmund Reinhardt — traveled to Papua New Guinea for nine days of ministry, fellowship, and celebration. From the bustling shantytown of Mile 8 in Port Moresby, where children waved branches and the community waited hours despite flight delays, to the fertile highlands of Mt. Hagen where pastors gathered from across the country, the team witnessed firsthand the extraordinary fruit of decades of faithful partnership. A highlight came in Lae, where 23



new Believers were baptized in the Pacific Ocean, greeted by a procession of singing, dancing, and bird of paradise flowers lining the path — a joyful reminder that the Church in PNG is not merely surviving, but thriving.

The trip also brought the dedication of a newly built church in Lae, funded in part by ACCF, where the ribbon was cut and the building committed to the glory of God. Communities throughout the Western Highlands welcomed the team with singing, wreaths, and deep gratitude for the Word of God that has transformed their lives. The team met with Church leaders, re-elected General Secretary, and discussed practical plans to strengthen literacy programs, distribute newly printed Angal



Heneng Bibles, and build greater transparency in funding. They also heard of pressing needs: churches under construction awaiting roofs, a women's sewing ministry flourishing but lacking a generator, and a growing youth movement in need of a tent and musical instruments to sustain their worshipping momentum.
